If you were wondering about last month's vote, we sent out 844 ballots with the cost of \$1950.00 for mailing. We only got back 257 ballots, so nothing that was voted upon passed! The Deed Restrictions, as amended in April 1999, remain the same! Sheds must remain adjacent to the house and no utility trailers are allowed except in your garage. Regarding the above ground pools, we still need to have 51 percent of all homeowners, that means in all of the Heather properties, to change anything in the community!

I must say myself and the Board are very disappointed that a great portion of the community did not bother to return the ballots so that the quorum/votes could be met! Thank you to all the 257 people who returned their ballots, to the people that worked on the committees counting the votes and to the people that worked on the proposed Deed Restriction changes.



DON'T FEED THE WILDLIFE!

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (Rule: 68A-4.001General Prohibitions) states that people should not feed wildlife as wildlife can be a public nuisance. "Intentionally offering or placing food or garbage out will attract black bears, foxes, raccoons as well as other wildlife."

The A&D Committee asks that Heather homeowners take a hard look at your landscaping and trim and cut the trees and shrubs, so they do not exceed six (6) feet in height and do not extend onto your neighbor's property.

The Bathroom facilities in the clubhouse are under construction and not available for use until repaired. This has been very unfortunate, especially for groups who have had the clubhouse reserved for special events. I have asked for some of their funds to be refunded. The two lift sewage transfer pumps are broken and very old. Both lift pumps for the sewage system are being replaced as well as any associated electrical controls and check valves. We have one bid in for the repair and another contractor is working on his estimate, and we hope to get that back soon.

The portable AC unit in the guard shack is also broken and we will be replacing that.

Keith and I have planted some flowers at the Heather main sign area. I will also be installing special irrigators for each flower plant because of the intense sun there. We also planted some purple Mandevilla at the guard shack.

As we were taking the flags down, the rope broke, so until the new rope is installed, we will have no flags at our entrance.

By the time you're reading this, we will also have new lights up on the guard shack.

Work orders with the county to trim trees have still not been completed and there is a dead tree on Saint Andrews across the lake from the clubhouse. It is marked with red ribbon. We're hoping to get it removed before any storms come so be cautious when walking in this area, especially in high winds. I took it upon myself to remove two of these branches due to hazards with tall RVs in our community. One outside the RV compound Road and one at the main gate that was hanging over the road.

On a less positive note, I unfortunately noticed lots of cars speeding through the neighborhood. These cars are not from The Heather; they drive down St Andrews turn on Allen and head into the woods behind The Heather. Please be very cautious walking with your pets and your children on these main roads.



CAUTION -ALLIGATORS



Here is some good information about protecting yourself from alligators.

It involves a combination of awareness, prevention, and knowing how to react if you encounter one. Key strategies include swimming only in designated areas during daylight hours, avoiding feeding alligators, keeping a safe distance if you see one, keeping pets on a leash near water, and understanding alligator behavior and habitat.

- Active Times: Alligators are most active between dusk and dawn. This is when they primarily hunt, so it's best to avoid swimming or being near the water during these times.
- Mating Season: Alligators exhibit heightened aggression during mating season, which typically occurs from mid-April through May. Be extra cautious during this period.
- Natural Fear of Humans: Alligators generally have a natural fear of humans and will usually retreat if approached. However, it's essential not to test this by getting too close.
- Basking Behavior: Alligators often bask in the sun on logs or banks. Be aware of your surroundings and avoid these areas.
- Predatory Behavior: Alligators are ambush predators, lying in wait for prey. They primarily target animals that are smaller than themselves.

Call the toll-free Florida Wildlife Commission, Nuisance Alligator Hotline at 866-392-4286 if you are concerned about an alligator situation.


If you plan on using fireworks to celebrate the Fourth of July holiday, we encourage you to be safe and responsible in using fireworks. The Florida law is as follows: "Florida State Statute FSS) 791.08 addresses the recreational use of fireworks during designated holidays. The days/dates defined as designation holidays are as follows:

- New Year's Day (January 1)
- Independence Day (July 4)
- New Year's Eve (December 31)

In addition, in Hernando County, "the use of fireworks for recreational purposes on any other <u>day/date</u>, <u>is prohibited by county ordinance</u>. Upon observation of the same, Hernando County deputies will take the appropriate action. This code violation is punishable by a \$50 fine (first offense) and will apply to both adults and juveniles." So please residents, TAKE NOTICE and only use fireworks on those days!

Enjoy the month of July and the July 4 holiday and please be safe!

The Greens

Reminder to all residents to keep your eyes and ears open for non-residents on property.

For those of you that may or may not have read this on one of the FB group pages. The last week of May, The Greens had a couple of incidences of trespassers on our private property. The HPOA was notified of both of these incidents, who then relayed the information to the security company.

Appears to be homeless people coming into The Greens property near end of Nakoma Way between U.S. 19 and the #2 Fairway of golf course: possibly walking in thru the golf course near clubhouse, coming behind the HPOA community building thru golf course (photo on FB at the pond near St Andrews & Nakoma Way) or from Nakoma Way further out beyond The Heather.

May 27th, early morning hours, had a vehicle parked in one of our Visitor spots up the hill at end of Nakoma Way. Inside was a couple, let's say, expressing their appreciation / affection for each other. I believe this was the second day an owner has noticed it. It may be a returning couple or one of the them returns with a new partner. The vehicle was a White GMC pick-up truck. The Sheriff was called about this. At the time we were reminded that The Greens had to annually renew our trespass agreement with the sheriff each year. Which we promptly did.

Going forward, in these types of situations, when sheriff is called out for a non-resident on property that individual(s) will be cited for trespass. A "non-resident" is anyone who does not own or reside within The Greens, with the exception of a guest of an owner, a vendor for owner's personal property or vendor for the association property approved by the board.

In regard to approved vendors for the association, individual owners are not to interfere with the services of association vendors approved by the board. If unsure about a vendor, contact QPM management company to find out.

Hopefully by now you have a sense that things have changed for the better as far as our property management. The Board is very pleased so far and we look forward to a long and healthy association. If you have not yet signed up for the PMI Portal, please take advantage of this free service. Here is the link: https://pmiac.cincwebaxis.com/

I'd like to explain the difference between Limited Common Elements and Common Elements. The association is responsible for Common Elements, but owners are responsible for Limited Common Elements. These are defined in our documents as well as by statute. Common elements belong to each owner proportionally. We all own 1/40th of the buildings, sprinklers, lawn, mailboxes, fencing, roofing etc. This is not a full list so ask if you are unsure who is responsible for any items.

Limited common elements are those parts that are exclusively used by that individual owner like doors, windows, air conditioning units, hot water heaters and screen rooms. Any cover placed on the screen rooms becomes a limited common element whereas the actual roof and skylights or light tubes are a part of the roofing system and are common elements. Exterior water service is also owned by each unit owner since no water lines are shared. Leaks from these are the unit owner's responsibility if the leak occurs on our side of the water hook up. Any leaks from the water meter to the main line is a county responsibility. If your water bill has increased significantly, you may need to have a plumber check for any leak.

Another area we have had questions about recently is pest control. Inside pest control is encouraged but is the individual owner's responsibility. As part of the lawn contract, fertilizer and pesticides for lawn growth and health are applied periodically during the year. These are for plants and not animal deterrents.

Enjoy the summer! The pool is open and ready for funand exercise.

We've heard it often enough as Florida residents that hurricane season is June 1 through November 30. But it's so important to be ready and have a plan to relieve some stress for any unforeseen events and ensure your safety. Here's some information to help you –

- Keep important documents in a fireproof safe or box and store a copy in a secure location away from your home or business.
- Proof of residence/ ownership
- Birth and marriage certificates
- Passports and Social Security cards
- · Bank and credit card info
- · Wills, deeds, and copies of recent tax returns
- Stocks and bonds
- Copy of driver's license
- Special medical information Insurance policies
- Property inventories or photos and videos of your home or business
- Business tax license
- Business supply/vendor lists



No-Churn Coconut Ice Cream

Ingredients:

1-pint heavy whipping cream, chilled (16 oz.)

1 can unsweetened coconut cream (13.6 oz.)

1 can sweetened condensed milk (14 oz.)

1 ½ tsp coconut extract

1/8 tsp. salt

Optional toppings: chopped chocolate, lime zest, toasted coconut, fresh mango

Directions:

- Freeze a large mixing bowl and beaters, for about 30 min. Pour chilled whipping cream into cold mixing bowl. Beat at a high speed with handled or stand mixer until stiff peaks form.
- Add unsweetened coconut cream, sweetened condensed milk, coconut extract and salt. Mix on low just until smoothly combined.
- Pour and smooth mixture into loaf pan, cover with cling film toughing the mixture. Freeze for 8 hours or overnight.
- Remove loaf pan from freezer about 15 minutes before serving for optimal scooping consistency. Delicious when served in chilled bowls on its own or with any desire toppings.




"People in the Happiest Relationships do 5 Things on Weekends"




