Hence, our school's finance is largely dependent on external financial and material support.

SCHOOL PRIORITIES

1. Pay child's school fees & scholastic materials for a term.

During our home visits, many parents expressed appreciation for education provided by the school but many also many expressed worries and stress due to their inability to provide at least for scholastic materials. In fact many students over the recent past were unable to return to school due to parent's inability to even afford transportation fee to send their child to school. Many children are moreover orphans.

Good Samaritan has become their home, the directors their mother and father who have to provide everything including scholastic materials. In kind and financial assistance is needed to cater for those who cannot afford a dozen of books, the tuition fees would cover the child's entire stay at the school, including water, electricity, report card, examination printingetc.

With just $\pounds 46/\$55$, you can pay a child's school fees in Nursery class, or $\pounds 80/\$98$ a Primary one, two, three or four class child; or $\pounds 98/\$120$ a Primary five, six or seven child and $\pounds 111/\$135$ vocational student's fees and scholastic materials for one (1) school term.

2. Pay a good teacher's salary for a month, term or year.

The school needs to have at least 15 good teachers, but the cost of their salary limits the number of teachers at the school. In addition to other benefits provided to all staff such as accommodation and meals, a minimum salary of 500,000 Shillings (approx. 138USD or £ 112) should be provided per month.

3. Donate to the cost of food

Good Samaritan has got a food budget of over Ugx. 18 million (\$5,000 USD) for 5 months (1 term and 1 holiday). This budget is big because it enables to school to provide at least 3 meals a day (Breakfast, Lunch and super) for the children. Donations for food whether in-kind or money helps to supplement what is grown from the garden every term.

4. Support the farming project

Feeding is one of the continuous challenges the school faces every term. Although parents are asked to contribute a few kilos of maize flour and beans, many cannot even raise enough to feed their families, save some to bring to school. Thus Good Samaritan is left with depending on the food production in its gardens and what is donated.

5. Buy a child a comfortable bedding and uniform

The number of students exceed the available mattresses in the dormitory. Many of them did not bring a mattress from their homes. Therefore, some of the young students who are physically smaller have to share them. The school also has limited amount of bed frames so most mattress are simply laid on the floor. Support us to provide a comfortable sleep for the children alongside education.

8. Sponsor a Sign language and Deaf awareness seminar

We sincerely hope to provide more sign language resources and seminars for community and family members in order to reduce the stigma for deafness and language barrier at home and in the community.

In the past, we had hosted sign language seminars, made a number of home visits to student's homes and printed sign language manuals. These initiatives were well received by parents and other family members. However, in order for the school to

continue its effort in bridging the communication gap, financial assistance is necessary!

9. <u>Support our development projects</u>

We intend to expand the school facilities for example;

- a) Build another classroom block so that children of different classes do not share the same room or black board.
- b) An entertainment and dining room is needed so that children do not eat from their dormitory or classroom which creates health issues.
- c) A modern kitchen to expand and accommodate the current makeshift kitchen where children line up outside for breakfast, lunch and super.
- d) A solar powered water pump to increase water supply in the school and the community.
- e) A school fencing/ wall to limit the number of outsiders entering the school and reduce the contact of children with strangers especially in this area of the pandemic. Likewise to protect against the security threats we have faced in the recent past.

Costs for construction of modern kitchen, dining and entertainment room and classroom block will be available soon!
