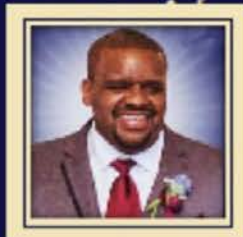

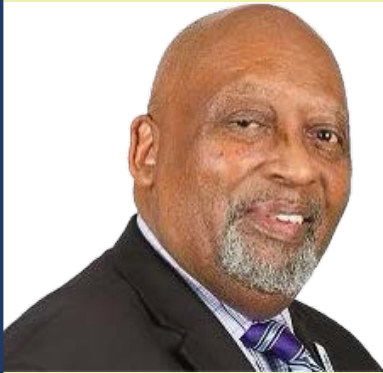

William M. Brown

The Amistad Lifetime Achievement Award

William M. Brown III, FAIA, NOMAC is a compassionate architect who advocates for and advances the architectural profession through dedicated leadership, mentorship, and community service. A registered Architect in the State of New Jersey, Bill is retired but remains actively engaged in the community. He has over 40 years of architectural experience in commercial and residential design and brings intuition, understanding, compassion, creativity, and problem-solving skills into his architectural designs.

Over the course of his career, Bill chaired and served on several committees, received several awards, and has held several offices within the American Institute of Architects of New Jersey (AIANJ) and the local chapter, AIA Newark and Suburban Architects. Bill served as the second African-American President in both organizations. His father, William M. Brown Jr. preceded him as the first African-American President in both organizations. In addition, Bill served as the first President of the National Organization of Minority Architects Chapter of New Jersey (NOMA-NJ, 2010-2014) and was inducted into the American Institute of Architects, College of Fellows (FAIA) in February 2021. He is currently serving as Scribe to NOMAC, the Counsel for the NOMA National Board of Directors.

Bill has a long history of community service - mentoring youth, sharing architectural expertise, and making a difference in various organizations and capacities. Bill currently serves as Second Vice President for the NAACP Oranges and Maplewood Unit, Chair of the Unit's ACT-SO Program (Afro-Academic, Cultural, Technological, Scientific Olympics), mentor/advisor for the ACT-SO architectural category, and as a member of the Unit's Environmental and Climate Justice Committee.

Bill earned a Bachelor of Architecture from Howard University in Washington, DC. He is a member of Fountain Baptist Church in Summit, NJ and is appreciative of and inspired by his faith and the love of family and friends. He enjoys engaging, encouraging, and mentoring youth for the profession of Architecture or their chosen professions. He leads by example and is inspired by the words "May the Work I've Done, Speak for Me."

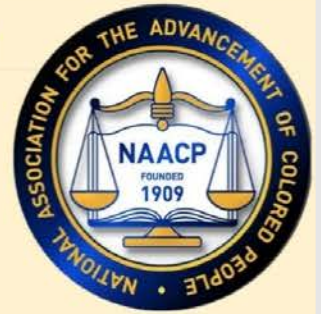

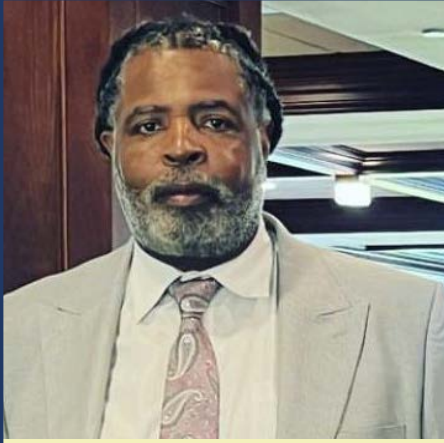

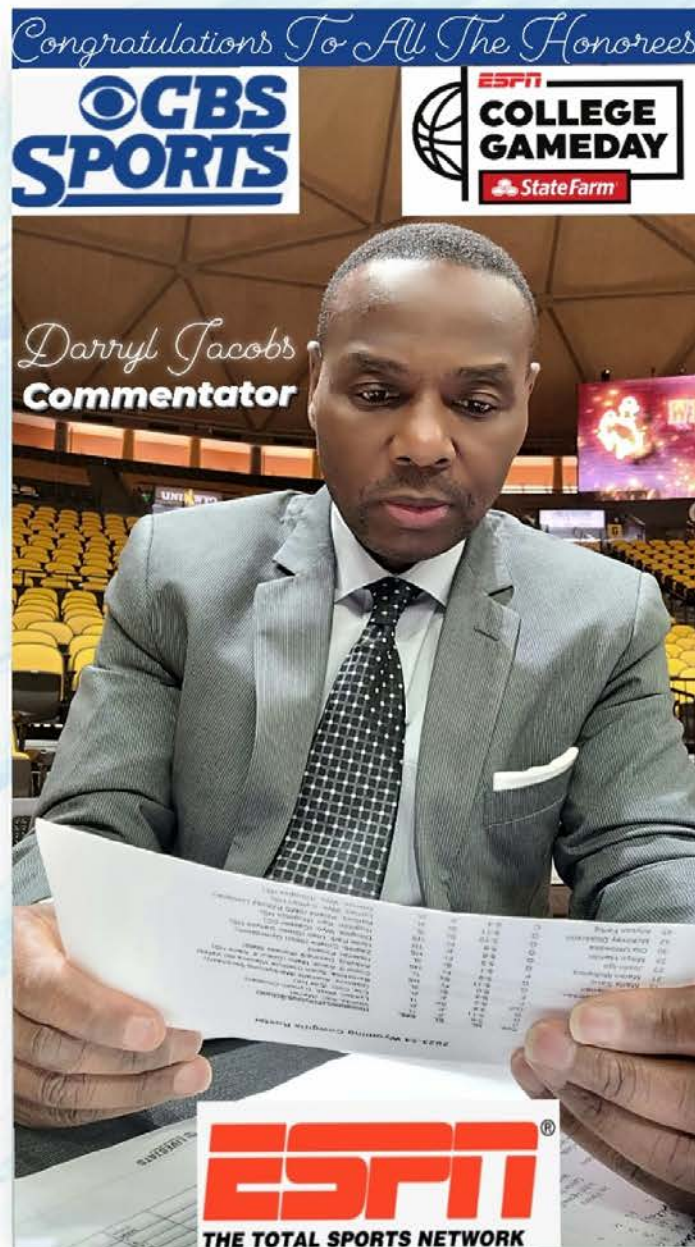
The Amistad Distinguished Educator Award

Brother Shawn formed his own basketball team for kids in his neighborhood ages 10-12 when he was only 16 years old. Once graduated from college, he started the Zoo Crew Basketball Program for kids. He started the program to give inner city youth an outlet. The program is still currently operating and has served thousands of youth through the program. The program had made extensions within its program in 1988 by adding the Zoo Crew Summer League. The league started with 8 teams and we have ballooned to a high of 92 teams one summer. We offer 9 divisions, and the league is very competitive. Some notable players to have played in our Summer League, Kyrie Irving, Karl Anthony Townes, Kyle Anderson, Darique Whitehead to name a few. Brother Shawn is no stranger in fighting while being the underdog, going into overtime to assist a youth, drawing a foul to protect the safe space of our young people. He shared those experiences in autobiography entitled "One Foot In, One Foot Out" in 2016.

Dr. Weldon McWilliams IV

The Carter G. Wilson Award

Weldon McWilliams IV is a product of the Wappingers Central School District, in Wappingers Falls, NY, graduating in 1997. Received his B.A. in Africana Studies from SUNY Stony Brook in 2002; an M.A. in African American Studies from the Department of African American Studies at Temple University in 2004; and a PhD from the same department in 2010.

Since 2012 Dr. McWilliams has been a part of the History, Government and Economics Department at Dutchess Community College in Poughkeepsie, NY where he currently serves as an Associate Professor of History.

Dr. McWilliams has been a part of several community organizations. He is a founding member of the Rockland (County) Clergy for Social Justice, founding member of Black Lives Matter Rockland/Orange County Chapter, and also a member of the Spring Valley, NY branch of the NAACP just to name a few.

After serving as an Associate Minister under his father, Pastor Weldon McWilliams Jr., for 6 years, in December of 2017, Dr. McWilliams was voted in as pastor-elect of the Christ Temple Baptist of Paterson, NJ. He was installed as pastor in May of 2018 where he still serves as the spiritual leader today. Membership has grown since McWilliams pastorate. He is not only committed to his church but also to the community in which it resides.

In December of 2018, Dr. McWilliams called for a mass meeting to be held at Christ Temple to address and create a Black Agenda in the city of Paterson. The meeting would lead to the creation of a grassroots organization, Platform Over Party. The mission is to address the numerous social ills within the Black community and address one issue at a time. Dr. McWilliams and Platform Over Party pushed and led the call for a Living Wage and a Guaranteed Income to come to Paterson residents who are hovering around or living below the poverty line. Dr. McWilliams was appointed by the mayor on the Guaranteed Income Task force. The work of Dr. McWilliams and Platform Over Party did not go unnoticed and as a result of the persistent work, the city of Paterson began taking applications for a Guaranteed Income Pilot that launched in July 2021.

Dr. McWilliams is also, currently the Chair of the Department of Black Studies at SUNY (State University of New York) New Paltz since June of 2021.

Dr. McWilliams is a proud father of three daughters and one son and has served on several panels and served as speaker to many events nationwide. His research interests include Black Liberation Theology and the African American religious experience, Black Manhood, and Political and Social Movements.

During his tenure as a teacher, David was a high school football coach as well. He spent time serving in the role of assistant coach at Clifton, Passaic Valley and Emerson Junior/Senior High Schools. Subsequently, he became the Head Coach at Emerson Junior/Senior High School and Dwight Morrow High School. Additionally, he was the throwers' coach for the track and field team at Dwight Morrow High School during the spring season in 2015.

Recently, under the leadership of Dr. Tyeshia Reels, Prospect Park has opened its doors to a Middle School, giving its seventh and eighth grade students the opportunity to have a true middle school experience. Shelton Jermaine Prescott, hailing proudly from Paterson, N.J., distinguished himself as an exemplary scholar and high school football talent within the Paterson Public Schools system. As a class of 1992 graduate from John F. Kennedy High School, he earned an academic/athletic scholarship to Syracuse University, achieving both academic and athletic excellence. Shelton graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Child and Family Studies, earning accolades such as the Bill Maxwell Award, Athletic Director's Academic Honor Roll and First Team All-Big East. Returning to John F. Kennedy High School as a Special Needs teacher, Shelton has dedicated close to 27 years to education and the service of children, while obtaining a Master of Arts degree in Special Education from NJCU.

His impact spans academic and community realms, mentoring and facilitating initiatives like the Boys Leadership Conference and the Youth Empowerment Seminar. Sundjata Sedou Frederick Douglass Educator Award

"Blood of a slave, heart of a king," lyrics by Nasir "Nas" Jones, encompasses the heart, soul, and essence of Sundjata Sekou, a "dope" third grade teacher in Irvington, New Jersey. His journey as an educator who educates with purpose, determination, and fire began with his mother in Jamaica and her story of resilience. She is his first inspiration.

Mr. Sekou's advocacy centers racial justice at the core of learning in and outside of the classroom.

He has authored and co-authored several articles, featuring a cover story published in the NJEA Review magazine, a publication that has roughly two hundred thousand readers, which included topics about race, racism, white supremacy, and the refusal of New Jersey schools to educate children on how Black societies like Ancient Egypt, Ancient Ghana, Mali, Songhai and other African nations contributed to civilizations in areas of writing, mathematics, science, religion, music and the arts.

He organized members to speak at board of education meetings encouraging district leaders to hire more Black and Brown teachers in Dover, support inclusive curriculums in Pleasantville, and advocated for Black and Brown students in Glassboro.

Mr. Sekou has facilitated workshops at local, county, state, and national education associations and has also presented at various conferences including the New Jersey Education Association (NJEA) Convention, NJEA Equity Alliance, Princeton University, and at the National Education Association on topics such as race, racism, equity, white fragility, and protecting Black children and Black adults in educational and union settings

His most popular workshop title is "Racial Literacy Circles: The Hip-Hop Edition." In this workshop, Mr. Sekou explores how Hip-Hop is used to talk about how to cultivate genius in Black and Brown students, critique the American justice system, study the effects of poverty on communities, and how to have "fulljoy" in education settings.

When asked "Who will stand up for Black women, men, and children in education and union spaces?," Sundjata boldly and uncompromisingly says "I WILL DO IT!"
