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What should I do after an auto accident. If you are the driver:

- Stop your vehicle, make sure that your auto is out of harms way.
- Verify the condition of the passengers in your vehicle, are there any injuries?
- If there are injuries or substantial property damage, call 911 or ask someone to call for you.
- Provide law enforcement with the information they may require. Ask the investigating officer where to obtain a copy of the police report. You will probably need it.
- Keep a pad and pencil in your glove compartment. Write down the items:
 - Names, addresses and phone numbers of all drivers and passengers involved in the accident
 - Car license numbers, make and model of each car involved
 - Operator's drivers license number and insurance identification number
 - Names and addresses of as many witnesses as possible
 - Names and badge numbers of police officers responding
- Record the details of the accident while they are fresh in your memory. Draw a diagram to recreate the scene. We recommend that you carry a small disposable camera and photograph the accident scene.
- At the moment of crisis call Farmers  service at **1-800-435-7764** for assistance when you need it most.

If you are the passenger:

- If you are injured, get prompt medical attention.
- Collect all your belongings from the damaged vehicle.
- Get the name, address and phone number of the driver and his/her insurance company information.
- Save all medical bills and receipts.
