### **PAINT POURING TECHNIQUE SELECTOR!**

Having trouble choosing which **advanced** technique to use? Grab a pair of dice and get painting! Simply roll the dice and let them choose your basic technique, personal challenge, number of colors, or even the colors themselves... Or be brave and allow someone else to roll the dice for you! Pick and choose whichever elements you'd like. As always, happy creating!

#### **BASIC TECHNIQUES**

- 2 = Flip and Drag
- 3 = Pendulum Pour
- 4 = Angel Wings
- 5 = Paint Bomb or Balloon Smash
- 6 = Swipe with Palette Knife or Offset Spatula
- 7 = Choice of 3 Techniques Combined
- 8 = Landscape
- 9 = Lazy Susan Centrifugal Force Pour
- 10 = Straw, Blow-Dryer, or Airbrush Wisps
- 11 = Any Technique on Furniture
- 12 = Your Choice of Technique on a Triptych (3 panels)

#### **PERSONAL CHALLENGE ZONE**

- 2 = Pour over a sphere or vase (Lazy Susan optional)
- 3 = Feature your least favorite color in a painting
- 4 = Master a technique that has been difficult for you
- 5 = Multiple flip cup painting (3 or more)
- 6 = Pour over an object (sink strainer, bottle bottom, funnel, colander)
- 7 = Embellish over a pour (acrylics, beads, objects)

- 7 = Create a new technique and share it!
- 8 = Use the last painting you saw as inspiration
- 9 = Use outer space as a theme
- 10 = Pour on the largest canvas you can find
- 11 = Pour over texture
- 12 = Pour a painting to give away... make someone's day!

#### **PAINT COLORS**

- 2 = 2 Colors
- 3 = 3 Colors
- 4 = 4 Colors
- 5 = 5 Colors
- 6 = 6 Colors
- 7 = Rainbow
- 8 = Black and White
- 9 = Black, white, and one other color
- 10 = Use gold as your swipe color
- 11 = Primary colors only (red, yellow, blue)
- 12 = Use black as your swipe color or base color
