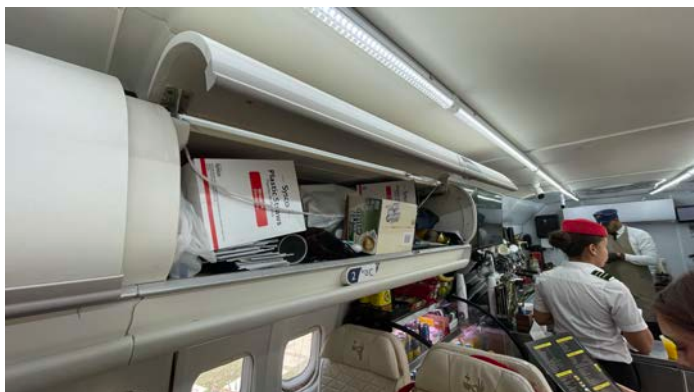
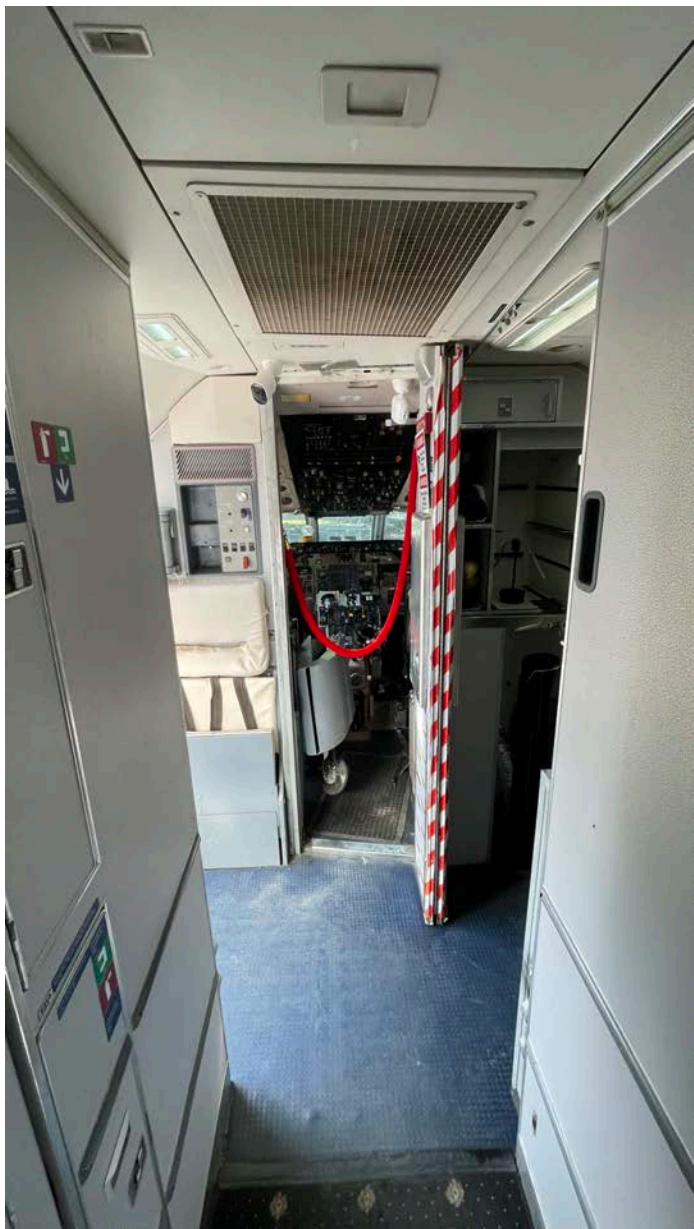

You actually walk into the front part of a fuselage which was a plane. The overhead compartment is used to store restaurant supplies. Instead of a departure and arrival monitor you have menu items.

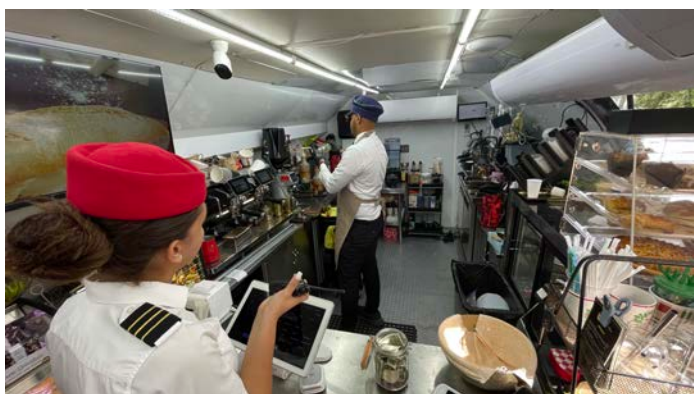




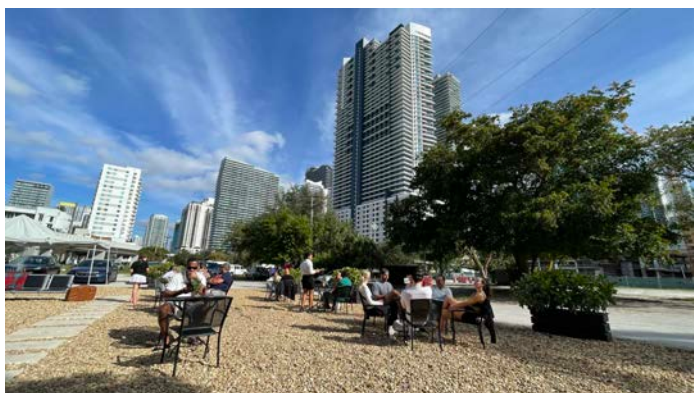

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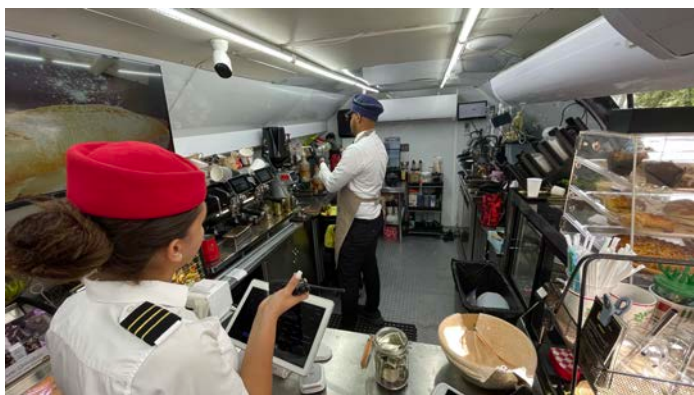
