

FRAMEWORK OF AGREEMENT OF EASTERN SASK RISING PRIVATE MEMBERSHIP ASSOCIATION

Article 1

NAME AND PURPOSE

Eastern Sask Rising Trading Post Private Membership Association is an independent private organization that shall herein be referred to in this Framework of Agreement and Bylaws as “The Association”. The Association’s purpose is to provide the membership with a venue to conduct all manner of exchange in the private domain. As free men and women with unalienable rights, we are granted the right to any transaction without any oversight and as such this Association will honor that.

Article 2

GENERAL PROVISIONS

The Association is like a close-knit family; what is communicated or transacts inside the family among family members are private matters and as such are immune from and not subject to censorship or control by administrative, officers, agencies of any local, provincial, federal or territorial governments, global or like bodies.

Our right to conduct transactions within the membership does not come from the authority of any global body, treaties or covenants. It is based on common and natural laws of interaction.

Article 3

Definition of Common Law and Natural Law

The Association defines and uses the definition of Common law as a partnership that recognizes unions created by mutual agreement and mutual benefit, and to do no harm.

The Association defines and uses the definition of natural law as the unchanging moral principles of human conduct. These are universal moral standards that are seen across time, periods and societies that form the basis of a just society. It holds that the law is based on what is correct through the use of reason and choosing between good and evil.

Article 4

Administration and Governance

An overseeing committee will be chosen from the membership and will consist of three (3) equal positions. These three (3) equal positions will serve one (1) year. At the end of the one (1) year, the membership of the Association will select three (3) new members to the overseeing committee of the Association at an annual meeting. These three (3) positions can not be held by the same individuals year after year. One (1) of the three positions can be a previous committee member but that committee member can only hold a position for a maximum of two (2) years.

The three (3) positions of the overseeing committee will collectively with two (2) other members of the Association, keep a record of the Association membership.

The overseeing committee members plus two (2) different members will also be involved in the vetting of new members, educate new members on how the Association conducts business among its members and any other private membership association that it engages with.

The overseeing committee plus any two (2) members will create a Conflict Resolution Board and other such duties that may be required of them.

The overseeing committee must keep record of all proceedings that occur at meetings, vettings, conflict resolution and other such duties that are to be conducted for The Association. These records must be kept in a secure place. These records must be transferred to the new Overseeing committee at the end of each year at the annual meeting.

Article 5

MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION

Membership to the Association shall consist of vetted members who have signed the Association's Membership Agreement. Membership is available to all men and women provided that they pass the vetting process.

A list of members will be kept by the overseeing committee in a secure place. The membership list must include: the members name given to them at birth and date the member joined the Association. Also documented will be the member that invited/recommended the new member, and listed will be the members that vetted and agreed that this man or woman may be a member of The Association.

If a man or woman does not pass the vetting process, this will also be recorded along with the date, who vetted him/her and the reasons for not passing the vetting process.

Article 6

MEMBERSHIP PATRONAGE

There shall be a requirement of each member of The Association to pay \$10.00 Canadian fiat currency as their membership fee to the Association. Each year the collection of that

membership fee will be used to purchase a resource for The Associations members' collective use. The decision on what the purchase will be, will be discussed and decided upon at the annual meeting.

As such the overseeing committee plus two (2) members must keep record of the membership who has paid the membership fee. This recordkeeping will determine the cumulative funds of The Association. The overseeing committee and these two(2) members will select a secure and separate place for the funds and for the membership list each year at the annual meeting. That secure place is known only to the overseeing committee and these two (2) members.

Article 7

ACTIVITIES

The Association will provide the members with a venue to conduct transactions that are private to the membership in the private domain.

Administrator(s) will be chosen by the Association to be the contact man or woman (men or women) for The Association to connect members and when connecting to other private membership associations within and out of Saskatchewan.

Article 8

ADMINISTRATORS

The Administrators of the Association are the initial contact point between The Association and other associations that The Association wishes to connect with.

The Administrator(s) position is to connect only to approved Associations and only when transactions within the Association cannot be conducted with The Association members.

The administrator (s) will contact other Associations to find out which closest Association may provide the service or other necessary items that this Association member needs.

The Administrator(s) will obtain the required information from the other approved Association and forward it to the member of our Association that requires it. That is the extent of the involvement of the Administrator(s).

Article 8

MEETINGS AND QUORUMS

The membership of The Association will hold an annual meeting to conduct and review activities that are private to the Association in the private domain. At the annual meeting the selection of members to the overseeing committee and other 2 member appointments to the above-mentioned committees will be conducted.

Special meetings may be called by The Association members as necessary.

A quorum will consist of 80% or more of the membership. Should that not be attainable the seven (7) members that are the three (3) member of the overseeing committee, the two (2) members in charge of the Associations funds and memberships fees, and the 2 members of the Conflict Resolution process will rule

Article 10

CONFLICT RESOLUTION

All transactions within The Association and with other approved associations are conducted in the private between private members. All disputes will be encouraged to be resolved between the two (2) members in the exchange.

Should the issue not be resolved between the two (2) members, the issue may be brought to The Associations Conflict Resolution Committee. This Committee consists of the Overseeing Committee and two (2) other designate members. The decision made at this mediation meeting will be the final decision regarding the matter.

Members of The Association waive all rights to take each other to court in a local, provincial, federal, global jurisdiction. Outstanding that it is a human rights violation as determined by the overseeing committee.

Article 11

ADOPTION AND AMENDMENTS

The Association will review the Framework of the Agreement and all of its protecting documents every year at the annual membership meeting. Any adoptions or amendments will be recorded with the name of the member who recommended the change and the reasons for the recommended change.

Article 12

PROTECTION

As men and women we have the inalienable right to conduct transactions in the private domain which means without acknowledgement, intervention or include a local, provincial, federal, territorial or global body.

Protecting documents affiliated with The Association's Framework of Agreement include the International Convention on Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR), Saskatchewan Bill of Rights and the Holy Bible.
