## **Following the Lights**

Widely regarded as one of nature's most gorgeous phenomena, glimpsing the aurora borealis, or the "Northern Lights" is high up on many people's bucket lists. The only problem is finding them, as they require clear skies and total darkness in order to be seen.

This makes the months of January and February peak aurora chasing season in Norway, with the nights being both longer and darker. For those who long to experience the unbelievable colors that dance across the limitless Arctic sky, there are few places on Earth that offer more chances to glimpse the Northern Lights than Norway. Top destinations for aurora chasers include Tromsø, Kirkenes, the Lofoten Islands and Svalbard.

### **Deirdre Bissonnette**

My name is Deirdre Bissonnette. My husband Ray and I have been married 14 years this year. We both work for the state, I work in the office at Fish and Wildlife, and Ray supervises a road crew for Ecology. The kids are in 8th and 10th grade this year, and attend Olympia schools on the west side. We've lived in Olympia for 6 years, but have moved around for work quite a bit. I enjoy cooking and baking, and lately have been making earrings.

Sofie/Olson Scholarships Available for SON Summer Camps

Do you know of a 9-15 year-old that would be interested in taking part in a Sons of Norway youth summer camp? District 2 plans to hold their annual summer camps - Camp Nidaros in Gearhart, Oregon and Camp Normanna outside Arlington, Washington for 9-12 year-olds, and Camp Trollhaugen in Easton, Washington for 13-15 year-olds. At each camp, kids will explore and celebrate Norwegian culture and heritage. Each year a scholarship is awarded for each camp, eligible to children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren, nieces, and nephews of current District 2 Sons of Norway members.
