John Demonet has had some good tournaments at San Vicente over the years and it was good to him again this year. John caught one bass early on an A-rig, and then ground it out the rest of the day catching two keepers on a Dropshot, and two more on the Neko rig. John's five bass tipped the scale to 11.36 pounds for the win.

Mark Quaternik had the only other limit of the day, catching his fish on his famous Bill Norman crankbait and a Morning Dawn Robo Worm on a drop shot rig. Mark's limit weighed 8.61 pounds to take 2nd Place at the second tournament of the year.

Andy Willoughby fished an A-rig and a drop shot

Arron's Magic worm to entice three bass into the boat, totaling 7.13 pounds. His three bass were good enough for the 3rd Place Trophy. Andy also did very well in the Anglers Marine tournament at El Cap the next weekend, taking 1st Place in the Rookie Division and 4th Place in the Master Division. Being that there were ninety boats in the tournament, I'd say Well Done Andy.

Mitch Garcia is "In the Boat Again", taking 4th Place bringing three bass to the scale for 6.79 pounds. Mitch found some nice bass on his electronics, but they wouldn't bite. Later in the day he found that the wakeboarders were making the shore muddy with the wake they

were making, and the bass were in the muddy water probably eating crawdads, because he caught his bass all on a dropshot rig with an Orange Crusher for a bait.

Ken Cox took the fifth spot catching only two fish, but the right fish, as one was a 3.24 pounder that took BIG FISH honors for the tournament. The big fish liked a Texas rigged MMIII in 30 feet of water, and his other keeper ate a Jig. The OCBC welcomes the new members for the 2023 season, Ryan Tucker, Cody Grover and Louis Lou, and also two guests that fish the San V tournament, Rick Grover and Ryan Manzon. Leave it to Beaver to find the Winning Fish

What a difference a month makes, and for that matter, what a difference a day makes. The majority of the members stated that what they caught their fish on day one didn't hold up for day two, and they had to switch to something else. The weather played a part in the change as day one was cloudy with a slight breeze, while day two was windy most of the day.

Keith Beever fished the saddle dam on day one using a Texas rigged slim Senko weightless for his second place start of 19.50 pounds. On day two he had to fish the coves with a crankbait and a drop shot rig to add another 13.54 pounds to be declared the winner with 33.04 pounds.

Jim Valladares only weighed in eight fish for the two days, but some nice hogs as he took BIG FISH honors with a 9.21 pounder on day one and a 6.59 pounder on day two, fishing a Neko Senko out off the walls in 8-10 feet of water. Jim also used the DVL standby, "the drop shot MMIII", to come from Fifth Place on day one to Second place on day two with 31.07 pounds.

Jonathan Demonet started in Third Place on day one and finished in Third Place on day two, bed fishing with the 5 inch Senko. Jon brought 4 fish to the scale each day for a total of 29.93 pounds.

Rick Anderson brought limits to the scale both days fishing his usual Black Jitterbug with a MMIII trailer, NOT. Most of his fish were caught on a drop shot MMIII except the last fish of day two that chomped a 6 inch Texas rigged MMIII after he broke off his drop shot setup. Rick jumped from Seventh Place on day one to Fourth Place on day two with a total of 28.55 pounds.

John Demonet weighed in a limit on day one fishing the slim Senko and the regular 5 inch Senko Wacky, style tipping the scale to 14.87 pounds, and added four more on day two weighing 12.40 pounds for a total of 27.27 pounds.

The club brought 122 fish to the scale, of which 12 were four pounds or better. At 378.52 pounds for the two days made an awesome tournament! Great job Keith and the Orange County Bass Club.
