San Vicente Delivers for Byrum

Fourteen members of the Orange County Bass Club and one guest, Angela Ragusa, plied the waters of San Vicente on a somewhat rainy day to start off the 2022 tournament season. Forty six fish were presented to the weighmaster totaling 99.49 pounds of San V bass.

Mike Byrum topped the field catching a five bass limit tipping the scale to 14.60 pounds. Mike fished the brush piles with an assortment of baits, including the IKA, Senko, and the Ned Rig.

John Demonet placed Second, weighing in a five bass limit of 12.48 pounds, using only one

bait, the thin Senko fishing in the brush.

To lock up Third Place, Tony Ragusa fished from 1 foot to 35 feet of water with a drop shot Aarons Magic 6" Robo worm. His 5 fish limit totaled 11.60 pounds' thanks to his lucky charm, Angela, who has always been his good luck girl!

Keith Beever weighed in a 5 bass limit for 10.21 pounds for Spot Number Four. Keith started shallow, catching two fish on the square bill crankbait, but had to switch to fishing in 35' of water with a drop shot MMIII 4" Robo worm to fill out his limit.

Ken Cox was the only one in top five that didn't have a limit of bass, but the BIG FISH of the tournament, weighing 4.51 pounds, made up for weighing in only four fish. Ken was having good success fishing a 6" Texas rig MMII Robo worm and broke of a fish that he got a good look at, that was bigger than the 4.51 bass he got in the boat.

Congratulations to Mike Byrum for a great start for 2022, and good luck to those that venture to Perris next month, you're probably going to need in on that stingy lake, but it does have some big ones.



Cast From The Past: January 2018

Andy Willoughby has the Perris Flair

Andy Willoughby had the right flair on his A-Rig to catch several bass, one of which was a keeper around noon on Jan. 5th, and caught his biggest fish fishing an Ika in the tree tops at 20-25 feet of water to win the Perris Tournament of 2019, totaling 8.36 lbs. for his 15 inch minimum two fish limit.

The only other OCBC angler to have a limit was Jonathan Demonet who took Second Place with 5.58 pounds fishing a deep diving crankbait in the tree tops. Jonathan stated that you had to just tick the top of the trees to get bit.

Jeff Grant brought only one fish to the scale, but it was the right fish. Fishing a Texas Rig MMIII 6" Robo worm, his fish tipped the scale to 5.17 pounds earning Jeff Third Place and BIG FISH of the tournament.

John Demonet caught his fish on the dam fishing a deep diving crankbait. Some fish came unbuttoned but a 4.39 pounder made it into the livewell and put John in Fourth Place.

Jim Valladares finished in the top 5 by fishing a drop shot MMIII in 20' over brush piles.

Overall this was a tough tournament for the OCBC as nine out of 36 anglers brought fish to the scale. Eleven fish were weighed in totaling 35.06 pounds and that is the beginning of the 2019 OBCB Tournament season. It can only get better from here on out.
