John Demonet Wins a Tough One at Skinner

This was such a tough tournament that I had to look back at the records to see if there were any tournaments with poorer results. Guess what, there were three tournaments since I joined the club in 1993, that had worse results. Number three, Hodges 2014 with 6 fish weighed in for 16.90 pounds. Number two, Piru 2010 with 6 fish weighed in for 15.15 pounds, and number one, Piru 2008 with 3 fish weighed in. Jonathan won with 2 fish weighing 1.85 pounds and Rick Anderson had one fish weighing 1.05 pounds. That puts Skinner at the number 4 spot with 7 fish totaling 17.08 pounds.

John Demonet topped

the leader board, catching two bass flippin the tuelles with a creature bait, tipping the scale to 5.53 pounds which included the BIG FISH of the tournament, weighing 3.47 pounds.

Mark Quaternik was the only angler that caught fish on two different baits. Mark caught his biggest fish on a buzzbait and the other one on a dropshot. Four pounds was the total for his two fish that put him in 2nd Place.

Jonathan Demonet got one bite on a Sweet Beaver while flippin the tuelles and was rewarded with a 3.04 pounder, and a 3rd place trophy.

Ken Cox threw everything in his boat with no

results until he put on his standby bait, a 6" Texas rigged MMIII and found a fish hiding behind a rock about 12:35pm. Ken took 4th place with a 2.70 pound Skinner bass.

We are going to start calling this guy, "5th place Bill". Robert Billingsley got one bite for one fish on an Ika flippin the tuelles. Out of the money, but in the top 5 for the second time in a row with a fish weighing 1.81 pounds.

Well we know it can be worse, but hopefully Santa Margarita will make a better showing for the September tournament, or the backup lake, Havasu, which ever the club fishes.

Cast From The Past: September 2012 John Demonet wins in the Grass

Santa Margarita was a ho-hum tournament for most of the 12 OCBC members and three guests who ventured forth in pursuit of those green things, and not all had scales.

John Demonet, using the Jig and Chatterbait, brought in a 5 bass limit of 19.37 pounds on day one and followed up with 3 bass on day two weighing 10.81 pounds to win with 30.18 pounds which included the big bass on day one.

Almost always in the top 5 was Jonathan Demonet who used the Chatterbait and a Frog to fill out his limit on day one of 16.62 pounds and two fish on day two which included the Big Fish of the tournament, a 6.35 pound beauty, totaling 27.00 pounds even.

The only other 5 bass limit caught was third place finisher Rick Anderson who placed 9.94 pounds on the scale on day one and caught one on day two for a two day weight of 11.38 pounds.

Ernie Sudberry, who got off to a bad start by having his trailer come off the ball on his way to Santa Margarita, used a Jig and Craw trailer in rocky areas to take the fourth spot with 7.90 pounds.

Steve Steward secured the 5th spot using a Senko and a Texas Rigged worm to catch 5.43 pounds in the two day tournament.

For those that didn't know, there was also a Bull Frog Tournament going on at the same time. Tony Ragusa won that tournament with 3 Bull Frogs and Brian Barrett came in second with one. Unfortunately the rest of the field blanked.

Congratulations to John Demonet for an outstanding tournament which ended his two year drought of a win in the OCBC tournaments
