There were still some bed fish to be had, and Andy Willoughby fished a dropshot on those beds to catch three keepers, and caught one cruiser on a Senko for his four fish weighing 12.03 pounds to take 2nd Place.

Mitch Garcia seems to like 3rd Place as he has nailed down that spot in the last

two tournaments. Mitch threw an Ika and a Slim Senko right into the fry balls to catch 4 bass, pulling If the guests, Dylan with 11.92 pounds and Randy with 11.54 pounds, would have joined the club, Mitch would have finished in 5th Place.

Mike Byrum fished a wacky 3.41 pounds per fish. I Slim Senko in the back of a cove for his three bass which included the BIG FISH of the tournament weighing 4.33 pounds. Adding his other two fish placed him in 4th Place totaling 9.74 pounds for the day.
