Quaternik Cranks His Way to a TOC Win

Mark Quaternik has entered the OCBC statistics in his first year with the club by taking 2nd place at the Skinner tournament, and now winning the TOC for 2022. Mark had a clean deck on his boat, catching all his fish on a Bill Norman lavender shad crankbait. Mark caught two fish on the first day of the tournament and had the only limit on day two, pushing the scale down to 14.96 pounds for his first win with the OCBC.

Mike Byrum is no stranger to Lake Havasu and it showed at the TOC. Mike had the only limit on day one fishing with a tailspin, a dropshot and a jig. Mike caught the first day BIG FISH weighing 3.45 pounds on the jig. I'm sure he had dreams of winning the TOC that night,

but things change and so did the bite. Only one fish latched on to a chatterbait on day two to bring his total to 14.73 pounds and 2nd Place.

Will Hogue likes 3rd place, as this is the second year in a row that he fished in 3rd place in the TOC. "The wind is your friend", so they say, and Will can tell you about it. It was windy on day one and Will caught two keepers on a shallow crankbait, one on a top water bait, and one on a worm. On day two Will casted out his crankbait and the wind caught it and made a big backlash, or professional over run if you've been fishing for a few years. While pulling out the backlash a fish hit the crankbait giving him one fish for day two. The wind

died down and so did his bite. Will's four fish totaled 10.15 pounds in the 2022 TOC.

John Demonet stayed true to form for this year, winning the AOY, the BIG FISH of the year and the BIG FISH of the TOC weighing in at 3.97 pounds. John caught his fish on a chatterbait totaling 9.52 pounds for his three fish and ending the year with a 4th Place finish.

Keith Beever took 5th Place honors with four bass weighing 9.26 pounds fishing with a spinnerbait and an Ika.
