DEALING WITH COVID



There is some encouraging news with our Covid situation. Our state has been fully opened, and the mask restrictions have been legally lifted. This is wonderful news for our church, but we want to be cautious how we move forward.

Thank you for your willingness, as a congregation, to follow our guidelines for the past year as we have worked to honor God and each other. Our county will still have the authority to move back to the 25% restriction and 6-foot social distancing if the number of Covid patients reaches 15% of total bed capacity in our hospitals for more than 7 consecutive days. We are monitoring this number daily at the church. At the time of this writing, our county has been under this threshold for the past two weeks.

Here are our suggestions. Be thoughtful of others. If you are more comfortable wearing a mask, please do so at all times. If you are sick or have Covid symptoms, please stay home. Wash your hands and use hand sanitizer frequently. Respect the personal space of others. If you are really edgy about having a lot of social distancing, come to the 8:00 service that has a lower attendance.

Our chairs are still set up to encourage social distance, and we will be dropping the space between families from three chairs to two chairs at the 10:00 service. We are still fogging the building and sanitizing the bathrooms on Saturday evenings. We still have masks and hand sanitizer available.

Many of our at-risk members are already immunized, and many others have already had Covid. We are working hard to get this right, and there is much to celebrate. If you have questions or concerns, please contact any member of our staff.

GUATEMALA

Three of our church members will be going to Guatemala in April to assist with a medical mission trip. We are quite excited because doctors and dentists from Honduras and Guatemala will be leading the medical clinics, with the help of nurses and other medical personnel from Missouri.



There are some things you can help with: We need several large suitcases for transport of medical gear, children's ministry materials, etc. We will also need money to pay for additional bags. The luggage, plane tickets and in-country costs have already been paid for the team. The third bag of supplies will cost \$150 per bag, and we also need the children's ministry items to go in them. We had intended to purchase most of this in Guatemala, but scheduling will not provide enough time for the shopping, sorting and other issues for this particular trip and team.

At the dollar store (or whatever cheap source you can find) we can use jump ropes, checker boards and checkers, frisbees, ankle hoops with balls, crayons, coloring books and individually wrapped small candy. Pop rocks and fun dips are among the most desired candy options. We could also use reading glasses in the lower range (1.50 to 2.75—please do not bring glasses stronger than 3.0). We will need these items to be brought to the church by Wednesday, April 7.

Please note that if you donate a suitcase, it will not be returned to you.

Youth & Children News


