## For Safety's Sake

For the safety of your RV's electrical system and components, as well as your own personal safety, <u>before</u> you make a connection to any outlet at any RV Campground/RV Resort/RV Park, etc., always make sure you . . .

1. Check to see if the pedestal's metal box is completely intact – no missing covers, no gaps or openings in the metal, and no rust through.

2. Check to see if each outlet at the power pedestal has an associated circuit breaker. (There should be an exclusive breaker for each outlet.) Turn "OFF" all of the breakers.

3. Check to see if each outlet/receptacle is physically unbroken – no cracks or missing pieces/chunks.

4. Check to see if there are any signs or indications of "burn" or "scorch" marks on the front panel, anywhere around the outlet(s).

Please, report any discrepancies to the management office. Do NOT attempt to repair anything "on or in" the box, yourself. (**Comment:** And, keep your fingers and tools <u>out</u> of it – remember, it does not belong to you!) **WARNING:** Intentionally interfering with or modify the function of any RV post/pedestal, without permission, is considered to be felony trespass in many states.
