High Quality Candidates

Do you remember that, before the election, Keir Starmer told us he only wanted the 'best quality' candidates going into the election. Now, in the dawn of his premiership, we see one of his MP's, Mike Amesbury, on video delivering a sucker punch to a man he then appears to punch and kick when he is on the ground.
