## Sleaze

The notorious wallpaper scandal, in 2021, was seen by many as the start of Boris Johnson's downfall. A leaked copy of the cost of renovations to Downing Street totalled more than £200,000. Items included gold wallpaper costing £2260 and a £3,675 drinks trolley. It was apparently like one owned by the ballet dancer Rudolph Nureyev, and a £500 kitchen table cloth to go with it.

This bill was sent to the Cabinet Office whose budget for renovation of the PM's official Downing Street flat was £30,000. The rest of the cost was secretly funded by Lord Brownlow of the Conservative Party. Boris Johnson apologised later and Johnson, or the Conservative Party, it's still not clear, had to repay the money.
