EXHIBITORS, PARTICIPANTS & VISITORS GENERAL INFORMATION

ENTRY FORMS & TAGS

Those wishing to obtain additional entry forms may visit the web site for a downloadable version which can be printed

Entry tags may be picked up at the Fair office during the week of the Fair between the following times when the office will be open:

TUES. – 9:30 am to 1:00 pm; WED. – 9:30 am to 2:00 pm; THURS. – 9:30 am to 2:00 pm.

Fri. – (when bringing in exhibits) – 8:00 am to 12 Noon

Entry tags may also be picked up in advance after July 1st by visiting “Barn & Bunkie”, located at 41 Lindsay Street in Fenelon Falls, during their regular business hours.

OPERATION: The Fenelon Agricultural Society (Fenelon Fair) operates under the auspice of the “Agricultural and Horticultural Organizations Act” in the province of Ontario, which is administered by the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food, and Rural Affairs.

Under the rules of the above named Act, the Fenelon Agricultural Society has the right to prohibit any theatrical, circus or other acrobatic performance; and the sale of goods and produce on the exhibition grounds operated by the Society, or within 275 metres thereof on the days of an exhibition or event organized by the Society.

DRAW TICKETS: No draw tickets are to be sold on the premises during the Fair unless the proceeds are given to the Society to be dispersed as prize money at their discretion.

VENDING/SELLING: The vending or selling of goods or distribution of promotional material is to be conducted from authorized booths only.

ALCOHOL: Alcohol is prohibited other than in a licensed facility on the grounds sanctioned by the Agricultural Society if one should exist.

DOGS: Dogs are allowed only if on a short leash, with one animal per adult handler. Handlers are expected to be in complete control of their animals at all times. Cleanup bags are a must.

ADMISSION: Admission to the Fair shall be as follows:

Adults - \$12.00; Seniors - \$10.00; Students 14 to 18 - \$10.00; Elementary & Pre-School – FREE; Parking \$3.00,

Weekend Passes: \$24.00 for Adults, \$20.00 for Seniors and Teens.

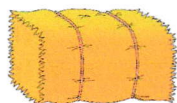
CAMPING: A limited number of camp sites will be available from Friday until Sunday. Sites include washroom access. No electrical hookup is provided. Cost is \$40.00 per site plus regular admission to the Fair for the weekend. Contact the Secretary for further information.

ANNUAL MEETING: It is the intent of the Society to hold the 2025 Annual Meeting of the Fenelon Agricultural Society on Saturday, November 15, 2025 – location to be announced. Contact the Secretary or check the web site & facebook page for further information and date/time verification.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR EXHIBITORS

- 1 – RULES:** All Exhibitors participating at the Fenelon Fair are governed by the "General Rules for Exhibitors" listed in this prize list, as well as specific rules that may be listed within any division or section. It is the responsibility of every exhibitor to be familiar with these rules and abide by same.
- 2 – MEMBERSHIP:** All exhibitors will be charged a membership fee of \$10.00, which shall be paid at the time of making entries. Membership is not required for those participating only in "Junior" classes. Any Junior wishing to enter in a Senior class that is open to adults must pay the membership fee.
- 3 – ADMISSION:** Those paying a membership fee will be allowed one free admission to the grounds during the Fair by using the appropriate stub from their membership card.
- 4 – OWNERSHIP** – All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.
- 5 – JUDGE'S DECISION:** - In all cases the Judge's decision shall be final.
- 6 – NUMBER OF ANIMALS:** An exhibitor may not show more than two animals in any one section, except group entries where only one entry is allowed per exhibitor, unless otherwise noted in their specific division.
- 7 – NUMBER OF ENTRIES:** Exhibitors are allowed a maximum of one entry in each section unless otherwise noted in the rules for that particular division.
- 8 – ENTRY FEES:** Unless otherwise noted for their division, 10% will be deducted from the winnings of \$10.00 and over in lieu of entry fees.
- 9 – PRIZE MONEY:** Prize Money for Junior Arts and Crafts will be paid to exhibitors in cash, and may be picked up starting Saturday afternoon from the Fair Office. Prize money for Homecraft and Agricultural Products will be paid by cheque, and cheques will be made available to the exhibitors when they pick up their exhibits after on Sunday. Prize money for all other divisions will be paid by cheque and will be mailed out as soon as possible following the Fair, with the exception of some sections or events which may be paid at ringside. All cheques must be cashed no later than December 31st of the current year.
- 10 – WORTHINESS OF EXHIBITS:** No animal or article deemed unworthy shall be awarded a prize. No prize shall be withheld merely because there is no other competition but the Judge shall award the grade of premium according to the merits of the animal or article.
- 11 – SOCIETY LOSS:** In the event of the Society being unable to pay the prize money in full due to bad weather or any other cause over which the Society has no control, a reduction may be made on prize money. This rule will not be enforced unless absolutely necessary.
- 12 – PROTESTS:** Protests must be made in writing and signed, and filed with the Secretary together with a deposit of \$75.00 on the day of the Fair. Deposit will be forfeited if protest is not sustained.
- 13 – SAFETY OF EXHIBITS:** The Society will use every precaution to ensure the safety of exhibits entrusted in its care. The Society, it's Directors, Volunteers and Stakeholders however, will not be responsible for lost, damaged, or stolen items in the buildings or on the grounds.
- 14 – RISK:** Those attending or participating in the competitions, activities or attractions sanctioned by the Fenelon Agricultural Society do so at their own risk, and shall not hold The Society, it's Directors, Members, contractors, partners or stakeholders responsible for any accident, loss or damage.

15 – INTERPRETATION: The right to alter, interpret, amend, add or cancel any of these rules or grant relaxation from them in individual cases is limited to the Board of Directors of the Fenelon Agricultural Society.

- 1 – Exhibits must be in place for judging in the main building by 12 Noon on Friday, and must remain on display until 4:00 PM Sunday. (Building will close at 3:30 pm Sunday, and will re-open for picking up of exhibits at 4:PM)
- 2 – Only one entry per section will be allowed. Variety named if possible for all entries.

CLASS 16 – FIELD CROPS

PRIZES (for each section unless otherwise noted): \$10 \$8 \$7 \$5

EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE: In Class 16, sections 5 to 11, grain may be grown in the current year or in the previous year.

Sections:

- 1 – Sheaf of Corn, at least 8 stalks
- 2 – Sheaf of Grain, named if possible, at least 3" in diameter
- 3 – Sheaf of Oil Seed, named if possible, at least 3" in diameter
- 4 – Sheaf of fresh Soybeans, with roots in a pail of water, 6 stalks
- 5 – Grain Corn – 1 pint
- 6 – Wheat – 1 pint
- 7 – Oats – 1 pint
- 8 – Barley – 1 pint
- 9 – Mixed Grain – 1 pint
- 10 – Soybeans – 1 pint
- 11 – Any Other Grain – 1 pint

SPECIAL – For the exhibitor with the most points in Class 16 - \$15.00, sponsored by Alliance Agri-Turf, Fenelon Falls.

CLASS 17 – HAY

Division named in memory of the late Jeremy Surette

Limited to one entry per exhibitor per section

- 2 – First Cut Hay – from a round bale in a clear bag equal in size to one small bale flake

- 20 – Romaine Lettuce (1), stem or root in water
- 21 – Potatoes (3) red skin – variety named if possible

- 23 – Potatoes (3) A.O.V. – variety named if possible
- 24 – Cabbage (1) white – must retain 2 layers of sound outer leaves
- 25 – Squash (2) Green Zucchini – under 8"
- 26 – Squash (2) Golden Zucchini – under 8"
- 27 – Peas (5) pods
- 28 – Peas (5) pods, sugar snap
- 29 – Radish (3) round, stems no longer than 1"
- 30 – Radish (3) long, stems no longer than 1"
- 31 – Vegetable – not listed above – named.

32 - SPECIAL – Collection of 3 different vegetables, 2 of each, labelled, displayed in suitable basket or tray that is sturdy enough to be moved by the judge. 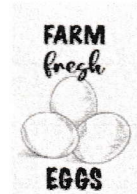
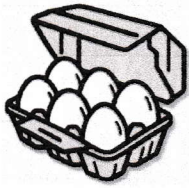

COMPETITIVE CLASSES FOR EGGS

The Agricultural Products Committee and the Feather N' Fur Show Committee are again working together to provide competitive classes for Eggs at Fenelon Fair.

1. Each entry consists of one carton of a dozen eggs.
2. Please specify on your entry tag the breed that laid the eggs in that entry.
3. Eggs will be placed 1st through 3rd in sections 1 through 10. 1st = \$5.00, 2nd = \$3.00, 3rd = \$2.00
4. The "Golden Egg Award" (perpetual trophy) will be awarded to the best overall dozen.
5. Entries in the egg competition may be registered through the Agricultural Products division (Class 16) or Saturday morning through the Poultry Palooza (Class 14) with Judging to commence at 10 AM Saturday.
6. Eggs must remain in place until Sunday at 4 PM. Any eggs left behind will become the property of the Fenelon Agricultural Society, with the promise that they will not be hatched, sold or given away.
7. Eggs can be washed, but must be natural. No dyes permitted.
8. Eggs may not be blown out.

RULES:

- 1 – All articles competing must be clean, and must have been made by the individual making the entry.
- 2 – All articles competing must have been completed since July 2024.
- 3 – All food items are to be covered with transparent wrap, or exhibited in plastic bags.
- 4 – Plates are not to exceed 7" in diameter.
- 5 – Any Junior wishing to compete in any SENIOR Class (ie any section that is not part of Class 19) must pay the regular \$10.00 membership fee and enter those classes on a separate entry form entering as an adult.

- 6 – All exhibits must be delivered to the Fenelon Fair building no later than 12 Noon on Friday. Exhibits are to remain in the building until 4 PM Sunday. Building will close Sunday at 3:30 pm and will re-open at 4 PM for the purpose of picking up exhibits.
- 7 – Each exhibitor may make only one entry in each section.
- 8 – All entries must demonstrate appropriate and correct grammar as needed.
- 9 – If articles are incorrectly listed on the entry form or entry tag the committee reserves the right to re-enter the article in the correct section.
- 10 – Please list your age at the top of the entry tag and on the entry form.
- 11 – Prize money will be available for pick up after 12 Noon on Saturday in the Fair office.
