

<u>Youth Classes</u> are for 17 years and under. \$0 entry fee.

Ribbons to 3rd Junior Stock may not show in other classes with the exception of Showmanship.

Children should be able to handle their own stock.

RULES

- 1) Stock entered must be free from disease and parasites. Unhealthy stock will be removed or refused entry. This stock shall forfeit prize money.
- 2) Exhibitors must hold a membership to the Fenelon Agricultural Society for the current year (\$10) Membership fees can be added to your entry form.
- 3) Any person who leaves before ending Awards ceremony without the express permission of the committee shall forfeit all prize money & may be banned from future shows.
- 4) This is a carry case show with the exceptions of Doe & Litter / Sow & Litter which will be copped.
- 6) The Show Committee has the right to refuse entry and decisions made are final



The Husbandry & Management Contest recognizes youth participants on their careful and responsible care and raising of animals, focusing on their breeding, records, feeding, health, and shelter.

Open to youth aged 8-17 as of August 1, 2025.

 Each contestant must independently compose and complete their management application.

 Applications should be typed in Times New Roman or Arial, using 10 or 12-point font for clarity and readability.

Applications may be up to seven (7) single-sided pages.

 Do not include Names or identifying headings. Cover sheets are not allowed.

SCORING CRITERIA

Applications will be evaluated on: Herd, Housing & Equipment – 50 points, Care, Health & Herd Management – 50 points, Neatness, Clarity & Thoroughness – 20 points Breeding & Production – 50 points, Record Keeping – 30 points

Husbandry & Management Contest

CATEGORIES & JUDGING

Applications will be judged based on age and size of Rabbitry/ Caviary.

Contestants may enter one Rabbit Division and one Cavy Division

Winners will be selected for each division:

Age 8-11:Small Rabbitry/ Caviary(1-20 Holes),Rabbitry/ Caviary(21-50 Holes),Rabbitry/ Caviary(51+ Holes)
Age 12-14:Small Rabbitry/ Caviary(1-20 Holes),Rabbitry/ Caviary(21-50 Holes),Rabbitry/ Caviary(51+ Holes)
Age 15-18:Small Rabbitry/ Caviary(1-20 Holes),Rabbitry/ Caviary(21-50 Holes),Rabbitry/ Caviary(51+ Holes)

Penalties: Applications that do not comply with the listed rules will incur a 10-point deduction per infraction.

Failure to include the written question in your response, could result in points deductions.

- How do you manage and dispose of the manure and waste produced by your rabbits/ cavies?
- Outline your daily, weekly, and monthly rabbit/cavy care routine. Be as specific as possible.
- What biosecurity measures do you implement in your rabbitry/ caviary?
- Have you encountered any diseases in your rabbitry/caviary? If so, describe how they affected production and the steps you took to control them.
- Explain your breeding process, including factors such as breeding age, time of year, and how you select breeding pairs.
- Describe your preparations for kindling birthing and the care you provide to the mother and young from breeding to weaning. Include details on your weaning process, age at weaning, and any special considerations.
- Provide a table or list of the total litters born, total young born, and number of young successfully weaned since January 1, 2024. If there is a difference between total young born and total weaned, explain the reasons.
- What factors do you consider when introducing new stock or bloodlines into your breeding program? What specific traits are you looking for?
- Describe your culling process. How do you manage surplus animals?
- What types of records do you keep for your breeding program? Why are these records essential for the success of your breeding program and achieving your goals?
- Create a table or list outlining your expenses and income since January 1, 2024. Explain any significant expenditures.
