NO ENTRY FEE or MEMBERSHIP FEE required to compete in any section in Class 19.

### RULES:

- 1 – All articles competing must be clean, and must have been made by the individual making the entry.
- 2 – All articles competing must have been completed since July 2025.
- 3 – All food items are to be covered with transparent wrap, or exhibited in plastic bags.
- 4 – Plates are not to exceed 7" in diameter.
- 5 – Any Junior wishing to compete in any SENIOR Class (ie any section that is not part of Class 19) must pay the regular \$10.00 membership fee and enter those classes on a separate entry form entering as an adult.
- 6 – Exhibits must be delivered to the north door of the main building either on THURSDAY from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm, OR FRIDAY from 8:00 am to 12: Noon. All exhibits must be received no later than 12 Noon on Friday and must remain on display until 4:00 pm Sunday. (Building will close at 3:30 pm Sunday, and will re-open for picking up of exhibits at 4:00 pm).
- 7 – Each exhibitor may make only one entry in each section.
- 8 – All entries must demonstrate appropriate and correct grammar as needed.
- 9 – If articles are incorrectly listed on the entry form or entry tag the committee reserves the right to re-enter the article in the correct section.
- 10 – Please list your age at the top of the entry tag and on the entry form.
- 11 – Prize money will be available for pick up after 12 Noon on Saturday in the Fair office.

## **CLASS 19 - JUNIOR PHOTOGRAPHY**

### **RULES:**

- 1 – All photographs must have been taken by the Exhibitor and must not have been entered in previous competitions at Fenelon Fair.
- 2 – Exhibitor will be allowed to make a maximum of TWO entries in any one section
- 3 – All prints to be mounted on Bristol Board or construction paper – no mounting board please. Mount securely with tape or glue. There must be a minimum ½" border around all photos for display purposes, and to help prevent damage to the entry.
- 4 – **Exhibitor's name, address, phone number, class & section to be printed on the BACK of each photo.**
- 5 – Prints must be no larger than 4" x 6"
- 6 – All possible care will be taken of all prints, but no responsibility can be assumed by the Fenelon Agricultural Society for loss or damage.
- 7 – Exhibits must be delivered to the north door of the main building either on THURSDAY from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm, OR FRIDAY from 8:00 am to 12: Noon. All exhibits must be received no later than 12 Noon on Friday and must remain on display until 4:00 pm Sunday. (Building will close at 3:30 pm Sunday, and will re-open for picking up of exhibits at 4:00 pm)

## **CLASS 19 - JUNIOR QUILT COMPETITION**

### Rules:

- 1 – All exhibitors in the Junior Quilt Competition must be 16 years of age or under as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current year
- 2 – All quilts must have been made by the exhibitor.
- 3 – All Fenelon Fair Quilt Competition rules (if applicable) apply to the Junior Quilt Competition.
- 4 – Exhibitors in the Junior Quilt Competition are not required to pay a membership in the Fenelon Agricultural Society unless they are also entering in other sections of the Homecraft Division.
5. There will be no entry fee for classes in the Junior Quilt Competition.

**PRIZES: (Section 290 - \$3, \$2, \$1) (Sections 291 to 297 - \$5, \$3, \$2) MUST HAVE SAMPLES ATTACHED  
Prize money donated in part by "The Library Quirkey Quilters".**

  - 291 – Doll's Quilt, not to exceed 15" x 17"
