Rules:

(Building will close at 3:30 pm Sunday, and will re-open for picking up of exhibits at 4:PM) 2 – Only one entry per section will be allowed. Variety named if possible for all entries.

CLASS 16 - FIELD CROPS

PRIZES (for each section unless otherwise noted): \$10 \$8 \$7 \$5

*NEW 2024: In Class 16, sections 4 to 10, grain may be grown in the current year or in the previous year.

Sections:

- 1 Sheaf of Corn, at least 8 stalks
- 2 Sheaf of Grain or oil seed named if possible, at least 3" in diameter
- 3 Sheaf of fresh Soybeans, with roots in a pail of water, 6 stalks
- 4 Grain Corn 1 pint
- 5 Wheat 1 pint
- 6 Oats 1 pint
- 7 Barley 1 pint
- 8 Mixed Grain 1 pint
- 9 Soybeans 1 pint
- 10 Any Other Grain 1 pint

SPECIAL – For the exhibitor with the most points in Class 16 - \$15.00, sponsored by Alliance Agri-Turf, Fenelon Falls.

CLASS 17 - HAY

Division named in memory of the late Jeremy Surette

PRIZES (for each section unless otherwise noted): \$10 \$8 \$7 \$5

Limited to one entry per exhibitor per section

Sections:

- 1 First Cut Hay 2 flakes
- 2 First Cut Hay from a round bale in a clear bag equal in size to one small bale flake
- 3 Second Cut Hay 2 flakes. State year grown (Can be this year or the year before)

SPECIAL - Best Flakes of Hay in the show. Sponsored by Walkwoods of Lindsay (Merchandise)

CLASS 18 – VEGETABLES

Note: A.O.V. = Any Other Variety; A.O.C. = Any Other Colour. Exhibitors limited to one entry per section

PRIZES: for each section unless otherwise noted: \$4 \$3 \$2 \$1

Sections:

- 1 Garlic (3 bulbs)
- 2 Table Beets (3) round, stems no longer than 1"
- 3 Carrots (3) short type, stems no longer than 1"

- 4 Carrots (3) long type, stems no longer than 1"
- 5 Tomatoes (3) ripe (with calyx)
- 6 Tomatoes (3) green (with calyx)
- 7 Tomatoes (3) small fruited ripe (with calyx)
- 8 Tomatoes (3) small fruited green (with calyx)
- 9 Cucumbers (3) table, not over 8"
- 10 Cucumbers (3) picking, between 2" & 4" in length
- 11 Peppers (3) green, with stems on
- 12 Peppers (3) A.O.V. with stems on
- 13 Beans (5) green, (must retain stem)
- 14 Beans (5) yellow, (must retain stem)
- 15 Beans (5) A.O.V. (must retain stem)
- 16 Cooking Onions (3) mature, 1 to 1 ½" stem
- 17 Spanish Onions (3), mature, 1 to 1 1/2" stem
- 18 Multiplier Onions (3) clusters. 1 to 1 1/2" stem
- 19 Head Lettuce (1), stem or root in water
- 20 Romaine Lettuce (1), stem or root in water
- 21 Potatoes (3) red skin variety named if possible
- 22 Potatoes (3) white variety named if possible
- 23 Potatoes (3) A.O.V. variety named if possible
- 24 Cabbage (1) white must retain 2 layers of sound outer leaves
- 25 Squash (2) Green Zucchini under 8"
- 26 Squash (2) Golden Zucchini under 8"
- 27 Peas (5) pods
- 28 Peas (5) pods, sugar snap
- 29 Radish (3) round, stems no longer than 1"
- 30 Radish (3) long, stems no longer than 1"
- 31 Vegetable not listed above named.
- **32 SPECIAL Collection of 3 different vegetables**, 2 of each, labelled, displayed in suitable basket or tray that is sturdy enough to be moved by the judge. To be judged on an equal basis between: a) quality, condition, and uniformity; b) effectiveness of display and vegetables properly prepared according to Horticultural Judging Standards. ***NEW 2024 - COMPETITIVE CLASSES FOR EGGS

The Agricultural Products Committee and the Feather & Fur Show Committee are working together to provide a brand new set of competitive classes for Eggs at Fenelon Fair. (See Class 15, Sections 37 to 45 under Poultry Show). Egg classes are open to anyone. Those wishing to compete in the Egg classes may register their entries on their Poultry Show entry forms which are sent in advance to Ashley Leonard, OR they may list their entries on a regular Fenelon Fair entry form through the Fair office on Friday. Eggs may be delivered to the main exhibit building on Friday between 8 AM and 12 Noon, OR may be delivered to the Poultry Show building on Saturday no later than 9 AM. Eggs will be Judged on Saturday, and will subsequently be displayed in the main Fair building. Eggs must remain on display until Sunday at 4 PM.
