

But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. ²¹Then the son said to

him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' ²²But the father said to his slaves, 'Quickly, bring out a robe—the best one—and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. ²³And get the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate; ²⁴for this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!' And they began to celebrate.

²⁵"Now his elder son was in the field; and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. ²⁶He called one of the slaves and asked what was going on. ²⁷He replied, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has got him back safe and sound.' ²⁸Then he became angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him. ²⁹But he answered his father, 'Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends. ³⁰But when this son of yours came back, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!' ³¹Then the father said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. ³²But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found.'"



Teacher's Teammates

This year during Lent we will be having a collection for a charity we have not donated to previously, Teacher's

Teammates. Teachers' Teammates is a non-profit organization that provides resources for K-12 students and teachers in Delaware County to help them succeed in their education. They distribute free school supplies to students and teachers in public, charter and parochial schools where at least 65% of the students qualify for the National Student Lunch Program.

What makes this different from the backpack collection is that they also accept used items. These used items must be in good working order, readily usable without assembly, and free of dirt, mold, water damage or pet hair. Reusing these items reduces waste and helps our environment.

They also accept items other than school supplies like toys, puzzles, arts and craft supplies, reusable shopping bags, office supplies and more. Please see the enclosed list for acceptable donations.

At the present time there is a special need for school supplies for the 2nd semester: markers- dry erase and highlighters, filler paper, pens, crayons and colored pencils, pencil sharpeners- hand held barrel type erasers, wedge rulers, pencil pouches 3 hole with grommets, 2 pocket folders and glue sticks.

The collection will run **from March 1- April 6th.** The collected items will be taken to their warehouse in Folcroft. You can also donate money on their website: teachersteammates.org or donate to their Amazon Wishlist. I hope the members of Holy Spirit will support this worthwhile outreach program.

GOSPEL MESSAGE

Less Grumbling, More Humbling

Grumbling! The crowd around Jesus—the "in" crowd, that is—was grumbling. Grumbling because Jesus welcomed those who traditionally had been set apart: tax collectors and sinners. Who are those who cause us to grumble? Whose seemingly undeserved handout or unearned status change filled our hearts with resentment this week? Jesus speaks to us today because we too often see life as a game with winners and losers, points and playbooks, offense and defense. Can we open our hearts and minds to hear today's humbling good news? God's love is freely shared with all: we cannot earn it, we cannot deserve it. When we attend worship, we do so out of thanksgiving and praise for God's glory, hunger and thirst for God's word and sacrament. We do not attend worship to achieve some status within God's kingdom. When we help a neighbor, share with a stranger, assist the afflicted, or acknowledge the overlooked we do so because Christ first did the same for us. We respond to God's grace and mercy with our own feeble attempts to emulate God's perfect love. It is challenging, exhausting, never-ending, perspective-altering, radically humbling work. It's work that is impossible to do without the inspiration of Christ, the nourishment of wine and bread, and the strength of the saints who have gone before us and with whom we walk Christ's path today. Let us find those in our world who teach us about Christ's unending reconciliation, so that we can all celebrate and rejoice as the family of God.
