Ostara blesses our work and the Green Man stands guard.


All life takes hold and the first sprouting pushes up towards light.

Who is the Green Man?

The Green Man is found in many forms throughout history. He is to be found in many different guises, but the common feature is the face

covered by foliage, very often sprouting from their mouths. He is often found carved in wood or stone in medieval churches and cathedrals.

Why they were included in the construction of these buildings by the masons has perhaps been lost in the mists of time.

Some people suspect that he was a bridge between the new beliefs of Christianity and the Pagan beliefs it replaced. Evidence for this cross-over of religions could be assumed from the siting of Christian churches at the site of pagan sacred places.

The term "Green Man" is modern in nature, dating back to 1939 when Lady Raglan published an article in the "Folklore" journal. He has appeared as "Jack in the Green" and there has been a revival of these appearances around the date of Beltane or May Day every spring, marking re-birth and the start of the cycle of growth.

I am sure that the Green Man means different things to different people in this day and age. To many he represents a figure who is an Environmental guardian "the keeper of the forests and woods".

The Lore of Ostara



Ostara, or Eostre or Eastre, is the Germanic Goddess of spring and dawn. She is only mentioned once in scholarly writings of the period - Bede the monk states that during Eostremonath (the old Anglo-Saxon names for April), the pagan Anglo-Saxons help festivals in her honor. (Two hundred years later in Germany, in his *Life of Charlemagne*, a monk named Einhard gives the old name for April as Ostaramonath.) She is also mentioned in a number of inscriptions in Germany, and the modern holiday of Easter - originally the name for the spring Equinox, but later subsumed to the Paschal calendar for the Christian resurrection holiday - is named for her. The name "Eostre" (Old Germanic "Ostara"), is related to that of Eos, the Greek goddess of dawn, and both can be traced back to a Proto-Indo-European goddess of dawn.



Ostara is a Pagan holiday falling on the vernal or spring equinox. Ostara, more commonly known as Eostre, is also the Germanic goddess of fertility and spring. It is believed ancient celebrations of this goddess, which include hares, *rabbits*, and eggs, are the ancient roots of what we know as Easter today.

Bountiful Garden Salad with Raspberry Vinagarette

6 cups spinach, torn

1 lb romaine lettuce, torn

1 stalk celery, chopped

1 tomato, chopped

½ cucumber chopped

1 bunch fresh cilantro, chopped

1 clove garlic, finely chopped

½ orange, peeled and sectioned

¾ cup blackberries, raspberries and/or blueberries

¼ cup strawberries, hulled and sliced

¼ cup chopped walnuts or pecans, toasted

Garnish: croutons

Place all of the ingredients except croutons into a large salad bowl and toss to mix. Drizzle with Raspberry Dressing; garnish with croutons. Serves 6-8

Raspberry Dressing

34 cup to 1 cup raspberries, crushed

1 cup oil

¼ cup raspberry vinegar

1 TB sugar

2 TB lemon juice

Salt & pepper to taste

Combine all ingredients except salt and pepper; whish well. Add salt and pepper to taste



Green Onion Pancakes



INGREDIENTS

1 ½ C all-purpose flour
½ teaspoon sea salt + extra for garnish
¼ teaspoon baking powder
¼ C hot boiling water

¾ C room-temperature water (you may not need all of the water)
2 tablespoon toasted sesame oil
1 C green onions (appx 8 stalks, or 1 bunch) chopped
3-4 tablespoon avocado oil (or any high-smoke point oil) for pan-frying

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Combine the flour, salt, baking powder and hot water together in a large bowl. Mix with a pair of wooden chopsticks.
- 2. Gradually add in the room temperature water until a dough is formed. (You may or may not need all of the water).
- 3. Knead the dough for a few minutes until it becomes slightly smooth. Cover with a cloth or plastic wrap and leave for 15 minutes.
- 4. Divide the rested dough into 3 or 4 equal pieces (depending on how large you want them). Roll each portion into a long rectangle about 2" in width and 8" in length.
- 5. Brush on ¼ tablespoon of sesame oil on the dough and sprinkle the green onions on. (Sprinkle with additional flaked sea salt if you wish).
- 6. Fold the dough in half lengthwise to close.
- 7. Roll out the dough width-wise until it's about 2" again. Brush with sesame oil.
- 8. Fold the dough over in half lengthwise to close and tuck in the 2 ends together to seal.
- 9. Heat a griddle or pan over medium-high heat. Add about 1 tablespoon of oil to the pan.
- 10. Place the green onion pancake onto the griddle/pan and cook until crisp, about 2-3 minutes per side.
- 11. Sprinkle on additional flaked sea salt, cut into quarters and serve immediately.
- 12. Serve with chili garlic sauce or chili oil.

2 parts sandalwood


1 part lemongrass
