I am honored to present my candidacy for the presidency of the UNESCO-NGO Liaison Committee. This candidacy comes at a critical time, when global instability is unprecedented and humanity faces numerous challenges.

At this moment, I am reminded of the words of UN Secretary-General António Guterres at the Civil Society Conference in Nairobi: "You (the NGOs) are my hope for the future." This statement is both a call to action and recognition of civil society's vital role. Despite international tensions, it affirms the value of our tireless work for global wellbeing.

Under the banner of the UNESCO-NGO Liaison Committee, we form a family united by shared values: gender equality, climate education, intercultural dialogue, ocean protection, and the fight against discrimination. These principles are core to UNESCO's mission, and I am committed to upholding them.
