### Freshwater Bike Path update

The plans for a proper cycleway connecting Curl Curl and Freshwater to the rest of the cycle network are one step closer.

This proposal has gone through many iterations, bouncing back and forth between separated cycleway designs and shared path designs.

The most recent recommendation from staff was to adopt a shared path design, however for the path to have sufficient width, this would necessitate clearing a number of street trees (potentially as many as 43, although perhaps this number would reduce on a detailed design).

While there are issues identified in the safety audit for the separated bike path, I think we should take the time to try and work through those issues and refine the design. As such, at the Tuesday night meeting I moved to adopt an alternative resolution:

#### That Council:

- 1. Defer the decision to enable additional information to be sought.
- 2. Work with TfNSW Active Travel Team and experts in Road Space Reallocation with the view to refining the design option/s for a separated dedicated bike path in Oliver Street, with the goal of trying to:
- a. Address relevant safety issues identified in the safety audit.
- b. Minimise the number of car spaces lost

This alternative motion was passed by a majority of Councillors. As such, the staff will now be working on refining the design of the separated path to resolve the issues raised in the safety audit.

#### Update on my responsible dog ownership motion

I am pleased to say that my motion for staff to report back on the options and costs for additional measures to promote responsible dog ownership was successful, with an amendment proposed by Cr Sprott to additionally look at responsible cat ownership measures.

The staff will now look at additional opportunities for proactive education in this area, incentives Council can offer to encourage and assist people to take their dog to training, and considering what other measures we can take.

Unfortunately (un)responsible dog ownership is a common source of complaints to councillors - but I am hoping we can do more to upskill and educate the community to do the right thing and be good neighbours.



#### 'Signal Fires' Coastal Art launch

I battled a very windy morning with other Councillors to launch of our new public artwork, Signal Fire, on Freshwater headland. Designed by Aboriginal artist Nicole Monk, it pays tribute to the signal fires Aboriginal people would light on headlands along

the east coast to send messages, celebrate, and hold ceremonies. It's also a beautiful place for everyone to rest, meditate, meet, and play, nestled amongst nature and beautiful native plantings by local Aboriginal plant nursery Bush to Bowl.

#### **Manly Dam Pollution Incident update**

At our last Council meeting Councillors voted unanimously to continue pressuring the state government and Department of Fisheries to address the pollution incident into Manly Dam from the construction site for the new Forest School at Allambie Heights specifically



with regard to addressing the impact of this incident on aquatic wildlife in the dam, with council now calling upon NSW Fisheries to set short medium and long term plans for the recovery of the Climbing Galaxia fish at Manly Dam. Whether this species has survived the pollution incident is sadly not yet known.
