- **1. Tee up.** Grab your clubs, kart, and take a swing at <u>Lyman Orchards Golf Club</u> in Middlefield, <u>Gillette Ridge Golf Club</u> in Bloomfield, <u>Longshore Park</u> in Westport, <u>Lake of Isles</u> in North Stonington, <u>Rockledge Golf Club</u> in West Hartford, or <u>Fairview Farm Golf Course</u> in Harwinton
- **2. Row, row, row your boat.** Get out on the water and rent kayaks from <u>Sea Kayak Connecticut</u> in Westport, Black Hall Outfitters in <u>Westbrook</u> and <u>Old Lyme</u>, <u>Clarke Outdoors</u> in West Cornwall, or <u>Branford River Paddlesports</u> in Branford.
- 3. Take a scenic hike. Climb to new heights on these treks with cool views or catch great views along these saltwater hikes.
- **4. Float through the sky.** Breathe in the warm spring air from way up top with a hot air balloon ride! Make unforgettable memories at Berkshire Balloons in New Hartford, Connecticut Voyager Balloons in Woodstock, or Aer Blarney Balloons in Bethlehem.
- **5. Explore waterfalls.** Spring is the perfect time for chasing waterfalls and discovering all the ways to enjoy them. Try these <u>waterfall</u> <u>activities</u> and visit these <u>cool cascades</u>.
- **6. Get bold.** Take advantage of the warm weather and go big-time adventuring. Zipline at <u>Highflyer Zipline</u>, try a ropes course at <u>Nomads Outdoor Adventure</u>, or even go skydiving at <u>Skydive Danielson</u>. Want to make the adventure even more unique? Try ziplining through a glow in the dark course!
