

From the Desk of our Boat Warden Matt Cohen....

ATTENTION, ANY ONE WHO FISHES LAKE FOREST:



There is a growing problem (that I have also been guilty of) among the people that fish our lake. The problem is getting baits snagged on the bottom adjacent to shore or on shore and breaking them off, leaving exposed hooks where people walk and swim. Because of this bad habit, a child was injured.

I have already had home owners that live adjacent to the lake ask me to not fish around their homes and others have talked about putting no fishing signs on their properties. Getting hung up has always been one of the hazards of fishing. Some people say "if you're not getting hung up, you're not fishing where the fish are". Be that as it may be, breaking your line must be an absolute last resort.

When your bait is snagged under water, if you can, bring your boat forward of where you're stuck. Most times this will free your lure. You can try tightening your line a bit and snap it a couple of times. This trick can also work. Keep a plug knocker with you. The design and weight of this device will help free treble hooks from a snag. If you're snagged on a dock or in brush or rocks on shore, do everything possible to retrieve your bait. I repeat breaking your line must be an absolute last resort.

If you have no choice but to break your line where someone could get hurt, PLEASE MAKE A CONCERNED EFFORT TO LET THE HOME-OWNER KNOW WHAT YOU'VE DONE AND APPROXIMATELY WHERE THE LURE IS. I would really hate to have this cause a bigger problem for the lakeside home owners. The repercussions and possible regulation changes are troubling to me and should be to all that fish. Especially if someone else gets hurt!

All boats must be off Lake Forest's property by Sunday, October 13th. If you need the large gate opened, please call me at (203) 243-3219. I'll be available on Saturdays and Sundays between 10:00 A.M. and 3:00 P.M. Boats left on the property after October 13th become property of Lake Forest.
