- His followers become frustrated.

- What is it that Isaiah said in chapter 55?

 - However those letters are still preaching his gospel some 2,000 years later.
- For my ways are not your ways and my thoughts are not your thoughts.
- My knowledge of the word and ways of our God is less than complete......However
 - I believe with all my heart that He knows my thoughts and the intent of my heart.
 - That He is always acting in my best interest.
 - And that He orchestrates the affairs of our lives for His purposes.
- I don't know what tomorrow holds.
- But I do know who holds tomorrow and I'm convinced He holds my hand.
- I know He will never leave me or forsake me and is an ever present help.
- He has promised to walk with me thru the valleys of this life &
- My experience with Him over more than half a century confirms His word.
