What is Wits End?

(Walk In Their Shoes)

is an interactive educational and advocacy program that fosters empathy with victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, child abuse, bullying, addictions, and other victimization that are oppressive.



It is the experiential nature of Wits (Walk in Their Shoes) End that allows participants to understand the severe challenges faced by victims or survivors of abuse in any form.

Often abusers or victims of ill-treatment at wits end before seeking help.
