Second Chance” Legislation is Smart Criminal Justice Reform

A criminal record, however slight, can be a Scarlet Letter that an ex-offender can never shake. Background checks have never been easier to obtain because of the Internet. Combine this with a rapid increase in negligent hiring/housing lawsuits and successful reentry of ex-offenders post incarceration or community supervision has never been tougher. Without proper employment or housing, studies show that ex-offenders are much more likely to return to their criminal pasts, making our communities less safe and denying these individuals a real opportunity to contribute economically to society (Greg Glod, Policy Analysts Right On Crime).

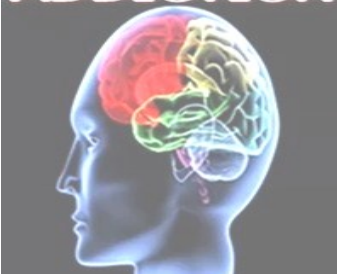

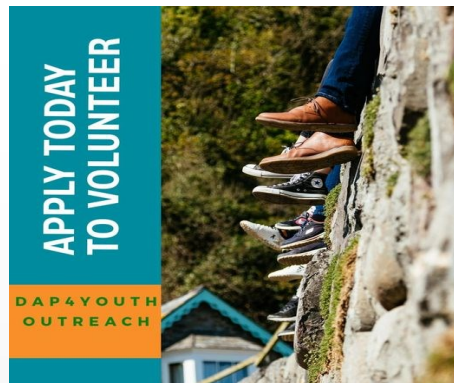
