On March 1st, Jeff was officially no longer on active duty and so that chapter of our lives was officially closed. Two days later was Keegan's 20th birthday but unfortunately she was sick. When Keegan recovered Kristy took her for a spa day. Getting a manicure/pedicure is one of Keegan's favorite things.

In April, we celebrated Kristy's 53rd birthday by registering her as a Texas resident and getting her a new Drivers License and Voter Registration card. But we are still diehard Boomer Sooners!!! Since this was Braden's last year of school we wanted to begin transitioning him into the next phase. Braden began going to Special Abilities, which is an adult day program.













Before we knew it was May. Because Braden went to four years of high school in Germany, we celebrated his senior year in 2016. But because of his autism, Braden was allowed to continue in school through end of the 2018-19 school year. At the end of May Braden received his diploma from Flower Mound High School. Although academics were difficult for Braden, we are so proud of how he persevered and continues to grow.

In June Kristy and friend, Jennifer, traveled to North Carolina for another Wild Women of Waldmohr reunion. They went to visit Cyndie



and Paul Maloy before they moved back to Germany. All of these ladies lived in the same village with us from 2012-2016. The weekend was a perfect opportunity to enjoy each other's company again, laugh, drink wine and see the wild horses on the Outer Banks of North Carolina. The ladies have already planned the next reunion for New York City in fall of 2020.

While Kristy was gone Jeff prepared the Ford Five Hundred for sale. After a local mechanic installed a rebuilt engine, Jeff heard a rattle he wanted checked before putting the car on the market. Unfortunately by the time the Ford dealership finished those repairs (more expensive than estimated), and we negotiated a price, we sold the car for slightly less than all the rebuilt engine and repairs.
