The month of November was also a time for recognizing various issues and concerns in society. In Support of Diabetes Awareness Month, the sorors of Epsilon Tau Chapter exchanged our green for red. According to the American Diabetes Association, an estimated 1.5 million cases of diabetes are diagnosed each year (ADA, 2017). Additionally, the Centers for Disease control found that there are 30.3 million people with diabetes (9.4% of the US population) including 23.1 million people who are diagnosed and 7.2 million people (23.8%) undiagnosed. The numbers for prediabetes indicate that 84.1 million adults (33.9% of the adult U.S. population) have prediabetes.

In support of the National Campaign to Prevent Teen and Unplanned Pregnancy, Epsilon Tau supported November 15, "Thanks Birth Control" with a social media campaign. Epsilon Tau took to social media to change the narrative regarding the need for birth control to prevent the rates of teen and unplanned pregnancy. Recent statistics show that nearly 1 in 4 teens get pregnant before age 20 of those under 18, only 38% receive a high school diploma. For unplanned pregnancies, over three million women in the U.S. each year experience an unplanned pregnancy, but this is not, however, usually due to failure to attempt contraception (CDC, 2015).
