

Breast Cancer Survivor Highlight




Ms. Sandra Thomas Williams



Why is November 14th World Diabetes Day? November 14th is a significant date in the diabetes calendar because it marks the birthday of the man who co-discovered insulin, Frederick Banting. Banting discovered insulin in 1922, alongside Charles Best. The logo of World Diabetes Day is a blue circle, and this is recognized by hundreds of thousands of people with diabetes throughout the world.

November is Carcinoid Cancer Awareness Month

Carcinoid tumors are rare, slow-growing cancers that usually start in the lining of the digestive tract and lungs, but can also occur in other areas, including the testes and ovaries. These tumors are a type of neuroendocrine tumor--growths that begin in the cells of the nervous and hormonal systems. Carcinoid cancer often does not produce symptoms in the early stages, and is often diagnosed inadvertently during an x-ray for an unrelated reason. Some carcinoid tumors produce symptoms that are not specific to this disease, such as facial flushing, diarrhea, abdominal pain, rash and intestinal bleeding.

FILS Spotlight






