
Iota Phi Lambda Sorority, Inc., the first African American business and professional women's organization and sisterhood founded

HERSTORY LOLA MERCEDES PARKER HERSTORY



Lola Mercedes Parker, founder of Iota Phi Lambda Sorority, Inc, was born in Little Rock, Arkansas to Mr. and Mrs. John H. Smith around a finishing elementary school, she and her family moved to Kansas City, Missouri, where she completed high school. In 1919, she became of Chicago, Illinois, where she began her post secondary education, culminating with graduation from Chicago Business College. In 1922 ried William S. Parker. Two children were born of this union, both of whom preceded their parents in death.

In 1929, while employed as secretary to Rev. L. K. Williams, then president of the National Baptist Convention, she founded I ota Phi Lam aim: "To encourage young women to enter the Business Field by means of business training". Lola M. Parker was founder of a premier so its National President from 1929 to 1946 and President-Emeritus until her demise in 1987.

Subsequent to her employment with Dr. Williams, Mrs. Parker held many important positions: Administrative Assistant to Congressman Mitchell; Director of Women's Activities; Chicago Negro Chamber of Commerce; first Negro Department Manager at R.H. Donnelley Corp Secretary –Treasurer, Business and Professional Association's Credit Union; and Business manager, South Parkway YWCA.

In 1935, as the sorority's National President, she was instrumental in Iota Phi Lambda Sorority being present when Dr. Mary McLeod Bet the historic first meeting of the National Council of Negro Women on December 5, 1935, in Harlem. The sorority was one of three sororit sent, along with representation from other national organizations.

She was active in many national and community organizations including member of Olivet Baptist Church; served as National Vice-Preside Women's Army for National Defense; National Council of Negro Women, co-organizer of the first Chicago Section; Life Member NAACP; Welfare Organization; YWCA; and many national and local organizations engaged in civic endeavors for racial, educational and economic

Lola Mercedes Parker died on March 19, 1987, and was buried in Lincoln Cemetery, 12300 Kedzie Avenue, Blue Island, Illinois.

There are now more than 100 chapters with membership numbering more than 5,000 in 85 cities and the US Virgin Islands Iota Phi Lambda is not an NPHC sorority and dual membership within Iota Phi Lambda Sorority and NPHC sororities is allowed.

Motto: "Upward and Onward in Efficient Service"

Iota Phi Lambda Sorority, Inc. was founded in Chicago, Illinois, June 1929 by Lola Mercedes Parker and six other ladies, all of whom were engaged in the field of business. Her vision was to establish an organization which would offset the result caused by the great depression.

PURPOSE

(1) unite a sisterhood qualified business and professional women, (2) promote increased interest in business education among young ladies high school and college through planned programs and scholarships, (3) encourage leadership development through educational opportunities, (4) establish and promote civil and social service activities for youth and adults.

To make worthwhile contributions o our increasingly global society, promote the pursuit of excellence in all worthy endeavors among youth and adults, and develop leadership expertise among business and professional women.

IOTA PHI LAMBDA SORORITY, INC. LEADERSHIP DISCUSSES MEMBERS IMPACTED BY THE U.S. GOVERNMENT SHUTDOWN
