Here's to a Happy Grateful Heart!

This month, the shortest month of the year, February, signifies Heart Health Month and Black History Month. Have you ever been curious about why we have leap years? Even though the standard calendar year is 365 days, Earth actually takes 365 days 5 hours 48 minutes and 46 seconds to go completely around the sun. (This is called a solar year.) In order to keep the calendar cycle synchronized with the seasons, one extra day is (usually) added every four years as February 29. In 365-day years, known as common years, fixed dates advance one day in the week per year. For example, Christmas fell on a Tuesday in 2018 and on a Wednesday in 2019. With the insertion of a leap day, dates (following February) advance two days instead of one. In 2020, Christmas will leap over Thursday to fall on a Friday.

The year 2020 marks the centennial of the Nineteenth Amendment and the culmination of the women's suffrage movement. The year 2020 also marks the sesquicentennial of the Fifteenth Amendment (1870) which granted black men a place at the ballot box after the Civil War. This month's Black History Theme is "African Americans and the Vote". The theme speaks, therefore, to the ongoing struggle on the part of both black men and black women for the right to vote.

Epsilon Tau's newest members, Sorors Calinda Jones and Krystal Brown had their new member orientation after their first chapter meeting on January 2020.



The Career Exploration Committee hosted the Careers in Flight Career Exploration with the 332nd Aviators of Dallas on Sunday, January 19, 2020.




