Key Things to Know About the COVID-19 Vaccine

Because COVID-19 is a new disease with new vaccines, information is rapidly emerging about how vaccines can help us stop the pandemic. Currently, two vaccines are authorized and recommended to prevent COVID-19:

- Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine
- Moderna COVID-19 vaccine

Studies show that COVID-19 vaccines are effective at keeping you from getting COVID-19. Experts also think that getting a COVID-19 vaccine may help keep you from getting seriously ill even if you get COVID-19.

COVID-19 vaccines teach our immune systems how to recognize and fight the virus that causes COVID-19. It typically takes a few weeks after vaccination for the body to build protection (immunity) against the virus that causes COVID-19. That means it is possible a person could still get COVID-19 just after vaccination. This is because the vaccine has not had enough time to provide protection.

If you are vaccinated against COVID-19, you may still be exposed to the virus that causes COVID-19. After exposure, people can be infected with or "carry" the virus that causes COVID-19 but not feel sick or have any symptoms. Experts call this "asymptomatic infection."

ET's Youth Empowerment Conference



Epsilon Tau Chapter presented its Unleash Your Superpower Youth Conference on Saturday, January 30, 2020. This mega youth event was presented to address lota's Youth Programming of Career Exploration; Toys U Can't Return; and Future lota Leaders. The conference had 53 youth from Dallas, Ft. Worth, Houston, Tyler, and Ames, Iowa.

Our Career Exploration Segment of the Event was moderated by Dr. Keisha White of The PREP Factory. "Your superpower means you are super prepared. Chasing Dreams means Chasing Green. Get you an accountability partner to make sure you stay on top of your essays and applications., along with guidance on finding and getting scholarships for college."

The Image and Self Confidence portion of the Toys U Can't Return Program was covered in the "Dare To Be The Super You" segment of the event. It was presented by Katrina Collins of Spark Tomorrow Ministries who asked the question to our youth: "When did you start to hide and stop embracing your superpower given you when you were created?" Most students answered, "Middle school". To remedy this Ms. Collins told adult mentors to start affirming the talents, gifts and superpowers of our middle schoolers. Her three takeaways; Get Moving, Get Rested, and Get Connected.

The final presentation of the conference discussed the Social Justice League. Epsilon Tau soror Katrina Stevens, presented the final topic of the day. Soror Stevens discussed how the teens could become active and find their voices in social justice issues. She discussed five areas of interest to most teens and presented 2021 inaugural poet laureate, Amanda Gorman and two local DFW teens who used their influence to garner an apology from the SONIC restaurant.

Epsilon Tau Future lota Leader President, Andrell Fisher Jr. and Melvin Randle III did an awesome job of participating on the program and introducing our presenters. Soror Courtney Taylor facilitated the activities; "Unleash Your Inner Picasso" and "Use Your SuperPower Knowledge about Superheroes." 
Epsilon Tau Chapter Awards Local Scholarship




