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



Color Scheme: Green & White (w/ accent colors)

Whatnots and doodads for counters, tables, dressers and shelves; children books; plastic storage bins (2); dish washing liquid and laundry detergent; toilet paper and paper towels; mop with bucket and broom with dust pan; household cleaning products; shower curtain with hooks and shower curtain liner; bathroom rugs (2 - medium size); towels (3-sets at least.), throw rugs (1- for the bedroom / 1- large size for the living room area - 5x7); shear curtains 84 in length (double windows in living room / 2 pair four panels) your color choice, shear curtains 63 in length (1 pair 2 panels) your color choice, and tension curtain rods (2- on for living room-large and bed room-medium); twin size bed-in-a-bag and twin bed sheets (2 sets); personal hygiene items: toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, soap, tampons, pads, hair oil/ moisturizer, shampoo, hair conditioner.

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Financial Fitness for Your New Year

With the New Year comes New Year Resolutions: to eat healthier, be more responsible, spend more time with family, the list goes on. But have you ever thought about focusing on your financial fitness? At a time when we want to focus on healthier bodies, we should also focus on healthier bank accounts and personal financial strategies. Here are four simple ways to improve your finances this year:

- **1.) Be prepared.** In a time of trauma, could you locate your trust, will, mortgage statements or insurance policies? Start the New Year by being prepared. Make sure you have the right documents in the right places. We suggest keeping original documents in a safety deposit box along with copies of your driver's licenses and some cash. Here are the documents you may want to collect:
 - Birth certificates, marriage license, death certificates, trust and will documents
 - Credit cards
 - Driver's licenses
 - Insurance policies
 - Mortgage/house deeds or statements
 - Bank statements

It's also a good idea to keep copies of these documents, including insurance policies and extra cash, in an emergency kit.

- **2.) Pay down debt, but don't forget about you!** Be wise with any bonus check, tax refund or holiday money you have received this year. Pay down your **debt** starting with the highest interest rate. Set a monthly amount to pay and if that number is right, you'll be paying off your debt right on schedule! 
