HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS OF IOTA PHI LAMBDA, INC.—1

FROM A SMALL ACORN

Early in 1929, Mrs. Lola M. Parker of Chicago, Illinois, was stimulated by the need for and the great vision of an organization that would offset the results of the Great Depression. She saw many African-Americans who were left without employment. In particular, African-American women who were working at comparatively new skills in white-collar jobs in the business field were doubly penalized by race and sex. Mrs. Parker called together the following women for the purpose of organizing a business sorority: **Ethel T. Edwards, Mildred G. Hardin, Harriett M. Robinson, Ophelia Harrison, Burdetta Trigg, and Marjorie Tyndall.**















Mrs. Parker believed that through such a sorority the status of business women could be elevated; they could be encouraged to seek higher formal training which would result in greater prestige to women in business and to women who chose business as a career. Thus, Iota Phi Lambda was born.



There are now more than 100 chapters with membership numbering more than 5,000 in 85 cities and the US Virgin Islands Iota Phi Lambda is not an NPHC sorority and dual membership within Iota Phi Lambda Sorority and NPHC sororities is allowed.

Iota Phi Lambda Sorority, Inc. was founded in Chicago, Illinois, June 1929 by Lola Mercedes Parker and six other ladies, all of whom were engaged in the field of business. Her vision was to establish an organization which would offset the result caused by the great depression.

IOTA PHI LAMBDA SORORITY, INC. LEADERSHIP DISCUSSES MEMBERS IMPACTED BY THE U.S. GOVERNMENT SHUTDOWN
