

Judge Staci Williams was sworn in on January 1, 2015, as Judge of the 101st District Court. Judge Williams seeks to ensure that the 101st District Court is the Court of Choice for all parties, attorneys and citizens. She is dedicated to improving your judicial process with fairness and efficiency.

In September 2015, Judge Williams created the Citizens' Civil Academy ("CCA") to educate Dallas County citizens about the civil court system. The CCA explores the types of cases

Judge Williams is a graduate of the Georgetown University Law Center in Washington, DC, Smith College in Northampton, MA where she a participated in the American heard in the civil courts and what happens to a case from the time the case is filed until it is disposed. CCA's goal is to provide citizens with a better understanding not only of the civil court system but also the inner workings of the George L. Allen, Sr. Courts Building.
