
# Black History Program Future Iota Leaders (Fil) Monthly Meeting

# What Is the 2020 Census?

2020 CENSUS By Vee Jordan




The 2020 Census counts every person living in the 50 states, District of Columbia, and five U.S. territories.

### **IMPORTANT DATES**

- March 12 20: Household will begin receiving official Census Bureau mail with detailed information on how to respond to the 2020 Census online, by phone, or by mail.
- March 30 April 1: The Census Bureau will <u>count</u> people who are experiencing homelessness over these three days. As part of this process, the Census Bureau counts people in shelters, at soup kitchens and mobile food vans, on the streets, and at non-sheltered, outdoor locations such as tent encampments.
- April 1: Census Day is observed nationwide. Once the invitation arrives, you should respond for your home in one of three ways: online, by phone, or by mail. When you respond to the census, you'll tell the Census Bureau where you live as of April 1, 2020.

April: Census takers will begin visiting <u>college stu-</u> dents who live on campus, people living in senior centers, and others who live among large groups of <u>people</u>. Census takers will also begin following up with households that have not yet responded in areas that include off-campus housing, where residents

Affordable Housing

- May July: Census takers will begin visiting homes that haven't responded to the 2020 Census to help make sure everyone is counted
- **December:** The Census Bureau will deliver apportionment counts to the President and Congress as required by law.
