

# Countdown to the Thanksgiving Holiday

As Thanksgiving approaches, cooking the traditional turkey dinner gives rise to anxieties and questions. What kind of turkey should I buy? Should I buy a frozen turkey or a fresh one? How do I store my turkey?

A few simple steps will not only ease your holiday fears, but will ensure a delicious and a safe meal for you, your family, and your friends. The following information may help you prepare your special Thanksgiving meal and help you countdown to the holiday.

Plan your menu several weeks before the holiday. Shopping early will ease the countdown tension for your Thanksgiving meal. Ask these questions to help plan your meal. Do you want a fresh or frozen turkey? Do you have enough space to store a frozen bird if purchased in advance; if not, when should you purchase a turkey? What size bird do you need to buy?

### Fresh or Frozen

If you choose to buy a frozen bird you may do so at any time, but make sure you have adequate storage space in your freezer. If you buy a fresh turkey, be sure you purchase it only 1-2 days before cooking. Do not buy a pre-stuffed fresh turkey,

### Thawing

### In the refrigerator

Place frozen bird in original wrapper in the refrigerator (40 °F or below). Allow approximately 24 hours per 4 to 5 pounds of turkey. A thawed turkey can remain in the refrigerator for 1-2 days.

### Preparation

### The day before Thanksgiving

Make sure you have all the ingredients you need to prepare your holiday meal. Check to make sure you have all the equipment you will need, including a roasting pan large enough to hold your turkey and a food thermometer. Wet and dry stuffing ingredients can be prepared ahead of time and refrigerated separately. This may also be done on Thanksgiving Day. Mix ingredients just before placing the stuffing inside the turkey cavity or into a casserole dish.

• National American Education Week - November 18-22, 2019. This year's lota's essay concept for the Evelyn D. Wilkey National Youth Essay Contest is "CYBER BULLYING" . . . its impact on today's youth. DEADLINE SUBMISSION – NOVEMBER 30, 2019.

Sorors, American Education Week-November 18-22, 2019-will present to us an opportunity, as an organization, to celebrate the need for a great public-school system and the need to educate our community on financial empowerment through education. It also grants us an opportunity to celebrate and honor the many teachers and support staff personnel that is responsible for ensuring that every child, in every community, receive a great public-school education.

American Education Week began In 1921, when members of the American Legion, the U.S. Office of Education and the National Education Association joined together to create a plan to draw attention to the need to improve literacy and physical education, after it was found that a number of young people joining the armed services were either illiterate or unfit. Over time, the focus of American Education Week has evolved to incorporate new themes and goals.

This year, the American Education Week's theme, **'Reach. Educate. Inspire.'**, gives us an opportunity to incorporate our vision of addressing financial literacy in our communities. The NEA's vision is to educate every child so they can grow and achieve in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. We agree with this vision, but wish to enlarge it to include building a foundation for financial empowerment.

We want to **REACH** the students and parents in our local community. We want to **EDUCATE** them with financial literacy programs and workshops. And we want to **INSPIRE** them to build for the future by establishing means of generating generational wealth.

These are just a few of the suggestions offered that you may wish to incorporate into your planning. There are others listed in the convention report book, that you may also wish to explore. But, no matter what you plan, I encourage each chapter to meld together the importance of a quality education and financial literacy, staying focused on our national theme, "Business and Professional Women Building the Foundation for Generational Financial Empowerment"
