

American Education Week



DR. GOREE NAMED 2019 LOUISIANA SUPERINTENDENT OF THE YEAR

President E. Mosley and Soror Willie Myers visited with Dr. T. Lamar Goree during American Education week to congratulate him on being named the 2019 Louisiana Superintendent of the Year and to present him with his book written by activist Pastor Harry Blake.

Northwest Loiusiana Sickle Cell Anemia Radio-thon

Each year Beta Psi Chapter contributes to the Northwest Louisiana Sickle Cell Anemia Foundation through it annual Radio-thon Fundraiser. Pictured below on the right side is President Mosley and member Connie Reynolds presenting Ms. Bradford with a \$100 donation. SCD is a group of inherited red blood cell disorders. Healthy red blood cells are round, and they move through small blood vessels to carry oxygen to all parts of the body. In someone who has SCD, the red blood cells become hard and sticky and look like a C-shaped farm tool called a "sickle". The sickle cells die early, which causes a constant shortage of red blood cells. Also, when they travel through small blood vessels, they get stuck and clog the blood flow. This can cause pain and other serious problems such infection, acute chest syndrome and stroke.



Beta Psi Chapter was excited to have two students to participate in the **Evelyn D. Wilkey Essay Contest**. Soror Myers provided her church member who is a student at C. E. Byrd High School the information and the student took the initiative to follow up with Soror Myers to let her know that she was going to participate. She typed the essay, made 3 copies and took them to Soror Myers house. Soror E. Mosley presented the information to her middle school Sunday School class a week prior to the chapter's deadline and two students, who are twins, accepted to write an essay. One of the twins who attends Caddo Middle Magnet, fulfilled the request to have the finished essay the following Sunday. These young ladies showed responsibility, integrity, and determination.

Black Girls Code - Dallas

On Saturday, October 20, 2018, Epsilon Tau Sorors Michelle Peace and Vena Thomas volunteered for the Black Girls Code-Dallas Virtual Reality experience. 56 girls got the opportunity to participate in the workshop designed to teach girls about the coding associated with Virtual Reality and its uses in Gaming and the Real World. The workshop was held at Cedar Valley College.

The mission of Black Girls Code is to expose 1 million girls to the world of coding by 2040. The program teaches esteem, cooperative learning, and confidence to girls of color. Women of color represent less than 3% of the workforce in this field of study. Seventeen community service hours were logged for our 90 for 90 anniversary campaign.
