
ET Celebrates Our EO Sisters

The meeting started with greetings from the National President of Iota Phi Lambda Sorority, Inc., Dorothy White announcing that Southwestern Regional Director, Vahnita Loud would be completing her term of office through the 2020-2021 Sorority year.

The election of Regional Officers occurred, and Epsilon Tau Soror Robin Mack was re-elected to serve as the Regional Recording Financial Secretary. Reports shared with the Conference included the Past Regional Officers Council; National Membership Committee, the Undergraduate Membership Committee, and the Special Taskforce on the SWR Policies and Procedures led by Epsilon Tau Soror Michelle Peace.


The "Greenprint" Virtual Webinar Series

With the 2019-2020 Sorority Year coming to an end and the election of officers upon us, Soror Slone felt this was the opportune time to compose these trainings.






Soror Nicole is Now Mrs. Nicole Owens!

The Iota Relief Fund

Iota Phi Lambda Sorority, Inc, in partnership with the Lola M. Parker Foundation is committed to empowering youth and women to achieve financial independence through entrepreneurship and business education. Small businesses owned by African American women are being adversely affected by COVID-19. As we continue to recover from the effects of COVID-19 Pandemic and the inequality of loan assistance and resources, Iota has renewed its efforts to help small businesses in our communities.

Iota will award up to 10 micro-grants ranging from \$500.00 to \$1,000.00 to small businesses owned by African American women, with less than 15 employees, to aid in their survival and recovery. The grants are to be awarded by a lottery of qualified applicants on August 8, 2020. To qualify, a business must have been in business for at least one year, have less than \$100,000.00 in annual revenue and experienced a 25% decrease in revenue as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.



The Epsilon Tau Chapter was pleased to submit three (3) local small businesses for consideration of receipt of funds from the Iota Relief Fund. Each of these businesses have been honored as business owners during Epsilon Tau's Business Month Celebrations in the last two years.

- 3. HeyyHealer Holistic Health +Wellness Studio (ET Business Month Honoree, 2019-2020)

Epsilon Tau Chapter Sorors supported this effort during our Sisterhood week in May leading up to our 91st Founder's Day celebration. We sent over \$800 in donations to the Iota Relief Fund Through the Lola M. Parker Foundation. Epsilon Tau Chapter in partnership with Epsilon Tau Outreach will be sponsoring micro grants as part of its local Iota Relief Fund
