Work



Our delight is in the fear of the Lord, and we shall not judge by the sight of our eyes, nor decide by the hearing of our ears; but with righteousness we shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek

of the earth; You O Lord, shall strike the earth with the rod of our mouth, and with the breath of our lips You, O Lord, shall slay the wicked. Righteousness shall be the belt of our loins, and faithfulness the belt of our waist (is. 11:3-5). Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven (Matt. 6:9). In the name of *Jesus Christ*, let us trust in the name of the Lord and rely upon our God (is. 50:10), in His magnificent name we lift up you and your entire house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) to the Father (Math. 6:9), all of your family (Acts 13:26), all of your blood from the beginning of time until the end of time (Prov. 11:21), all those by adoption (Gal. 4:5), and all those by marriage (Judge 12:9, 2 Chr. 18:1), all your natural seed (2 Sam. 7:12) and all of your spiritual seed (1 Tim. 1:2). In the awesome name of *Jesus Christ*, we love the name of the Lord (Is. 56:6-7), in His mighty and powerful name we go up into the gaps to stand in battle on the day of the Lord, to build a wall (Ezek. 13:5) for you, your posterity (Prov. 11:21) and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21). The words that *Christ*, through us, speaks (Math. 10:19) to you and your family (Acts 13:26) are spirit, and they are life (John 6:63). Thanks be to God, who gives you the victory through our *Lord Jesus Christ* (1 Cor. 15:57)!

But as for us, our prayer is to You, O Lord, in the acceptable time; O God, in the multitude of Your mercy, hear us in the truth of Your salvation (Ps. 69:13). Grace be with you (1 Tim. 6:21). In the name of <u>Jesus Christ</u> of Nazareth (John 16:23), by the precious blood of <u>Christ</u>, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot (1 Pet. 1:19), in <u>Christ</u> (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we ask our Father in heaven that you and your house should eat and drink and enjoy the good of all your labor, for it is the gift of God (Eccl. 3:13). Let the beauty of the Lord our God be upon you and your house and establish the work of your hands (Ps. 90:17). May you and your people give thanks to God (1 Cor. 15:57). May the Lord perfect all that concerns you and your house (Ps. 138:8) and open the doors of opportunity for you and your family that no man can close (Rev. 3:8). Let you and yours be in good order, steadfast in faith (Col. 2:5), immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor is not in vain in the Lord (1 Cor. 15:58); but God give you victory in all that you attempt (1 Cor. 15:57). By the blood of <u>Jesus Christ</u>, the Son of the Highest (Luke 1:32), in <u>Christ</u> (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 15:00) we claim the blessings of the covenant of Abraham for you

and your family (Luke 1:73). May the Lord bless all that you and your family set your hands to (Duet. 28:8) and bless all the work of your hands (Duet. 28:12). In *Christ* (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that your work will be secure (Job 21:23), successful (Eccl. 10:10), satisfying (Ps. 132:15), and profitable (Prov. 14:23). May the Lord perfect humility and the fear of the Lord in you and your people and give you and your family riches and honor and life (Prov. 22:4). According to the joy of harvest (Is. 9:3) let the Lord grant you and your house plenty of goods and increase and bless the produce of your labor (Duet. 28:11). Surely, you and your family will excel in your work and stand before Kings (Prov. 22:29). Let you and your house be like the tree planted by the rivers of His Living water (Rev. 7:17, 22:1), that brings forth its fruit in due season. May you and your family never wither under pressure but grow strong and prosper (Ps. 1:3). Our God is able to make all grace abound toward you and your house, that you and your family, always having all sufficiency in all things, at all times, in all that you do, have an abundance of grace for every good work (2) Cor. 9:8). And: You, Lord, in the beginning laid the foundation of the earth, and the heavens are the work of Your hands; they will perish, but You remain; and they will all grow old like a garment; like a cloak You will fold them up, and they will be changed. But You are the same, and Your years will not fail (Heb. 1:10-12). Your throne, O God, is forever and ever; a scepter of righteousness is the scepter of Your Kingdom (Heb. 1:8)!

In the name of <u>Jesus Christ</u> (John 16:23), our Lord and Savior (2 Pet. 2:20), let your work place be free from wickedness, envy, strife, maliciousness, deceit, whisperers, backbiters, boasters, inventors of evil things and people who are undiscerning, untrustworthy, unloving, unforgiving, unmerciful (Rom. 1:29-31), critical and judgmental, judging according to the flesh (John 8:15) or according to appearance (John 7:24). May the Lord give you and your house favor in the sight of your enemies so that they grant to you and yours what you request (Ex. 12:36); that you and your family should not go empty-handed (Ex. 3:21); but plunder your enemies (Ex. 3:22). The Lord be with you and your family and show you mercy and give you and your people favor in the sight of those in charge of you (Gen. 39:21). Blessed be those who take notice of you (Ruth 2:19) and help you and your people. Whoever you work for, whoever you serve, let them be increased by a great amount, let them be blessed by the Lord your God (Gen. 30:30) because of the Lord's favor on you. According to all His wonderful works (Jer. 21:2), let the Lord give you and your family such favor (Ex. 3:21) that you and your people can name your wages and receive it (Gen. 30:28). May you provide for your own house (Gen. 30:30), owing no one anything except to love one another (Rom. 13:8). Let your work be without stress, may you and your family be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving,

let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through <u>Christ Jesus</u> (Phil. 4:6-7). In the world, you will have tribulation; nevertheless, in <u>Christ</u> (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that you and yours will be of good cheer (John 16:33). Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid, but may you have peace in your heart, receiving the peace of <u>Christ</u> (John 14:27). Many, O Lord our God, are Your wonderful works which You have done; and Your thoughts which are toward us cannot be recounted to You in order; they are more than can be numbered (Ps. 40:5)!

In the name of Jesus Christ (John 16:23), God's Holy Servant (Acts 4:27), in Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that greed will not be a snare in your midst (Ex. 34:12), nor will you be snared in the work of your own hands (Ps. 9:16). In *Christ* (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that neither you nor any of your people put out your money at usury or take a bribe against the innocent (Ps. 15:5). In *Christ* (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that you and your house will not gain wealth by dishonesty, but you and your family will gather by labor and be increased (Prov. 13:11); and keep yourselves from the path of the destroyer (Ps. 17:4). Let you and your house serve God and not mammon deceitful riches, money, possessions etc. (Matt. 6:24 Amplified). In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we ask, in the name of **Jesus Christ** (John 16:23), in him is life, and the life is the light of men (John 1:4), through the Holy Spirit, your Helper, which was given to you and your family by the Father (John 14:16), let Jehovah-Raah, the Lord your shepherd (Ps. 23:1), make you to be temperate, sound in faith, in love, in patience (Titus 2:2), sober-minded, in all things showing yourself to be a pattern of good works; in doctrine showing integrity, reverence, incorruptibility, sound speech that cannot be condemned, that one who is an opponent may be ashamed, having nothing evil to say of you (Titus 2:6-8). According to His word (Ps. 119:65) may God your helper (Ps. 54:4), uphold your steps in His paths, that your footsteps may not slip (Ps. 17:5). For He renders to you and your house according to your work (Ps. 62:12). The Lord, God of truth (Ps. 31:5), keep you from the trap of vanity (Eccl. 2:11). Let your heart not rejoice for all your labor and that be your reward for all your labor (Eccl. 2:10). Surely, you will not look on all the works that your hands have done and on the labor in which you have toiled; and indeed find it was vanity and grasping for the wind, there was no profit under the sun (Eccl. 2:11). Talk no more so very proudly; let no arrogance come from your mouth, for the Lord is the God of knowledge; and by Him actions are weighed (1 Sam. 2:3). In *Christ* (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray, God will teach you what is important in your life, and you not be entrapped by your work (Ps. 9:16). May the God of knowledge (1 Sam. 2:3) teach you to number your days that you may gain a heart of wisdom (Ps.90:12). For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then

vanishes away (James 4:14). Let you and your family not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. Let all the treasures of your heart be in heaven (Matt. 6:19-21). Let you and your family praise God; let all the peoples praise Him. Oh, let the nations be glad and sing for joy! For He shall judge the people righteously, and govern the nations on earth! Selah! Let the peoples praise You, O God; Let all the peoples praise You! Then the earth shall yield her increase; God, our own God, shall bless you! God shall bless you, and all the ends of the earth shall fear Him (Ps. 67:3-7)!

In the name of <u>Jesus Christ</u> (John 16:23), who is the way, the truth, and the life (John 14:6), in all your labor let there be profit (Prov. 14:23). Let your labor lead to life and when you and your family eat the labor of your hands, you and yours shall be happy, and it shall be well with you and your house (Ps. 128:2). In <u>Christ</u> (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that the Lord your God will bless you in all the works of your hand; that the Lord your God will be with you; and that you and your family will lack for nothing (Deut. 2:7). In <u>Christ</u> (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we petition the Lord that He will repay your work, and a full reward will be given to you by the Lord God of Israel, under whose wings you and your family have come for refuge (Ruth 2:12). All the ends of the world shall remember and turn to the Lord, and all the families of the nations shall worship before You, O Lord. For the kingdom is the Lord's, and He rules over the nations (Ps. 22:27-28)!

In the name of *Jesus Christ* (John 16:23), the great High Priest (Heb. 10:21), may the Lord God show you and your family the way you must walk, and the work; that you must do (Ex. 18:20). Let your hearts be stirred up and your spirits made willing (Ex. 35:21). Now may the God of patience and comfort (Rom. 15:5) fill you and your people with the Spirit of God, in wisdom, in understanding, in knowledge, and in all manner of workmanship, being creative (Ex. 31:3-5), and artistic (Ex. 35:31-32), making your work a freewill offering unto the Lord (Ex. 35:29); doing all things without murmuring or disputing (Phil. 2:14), and whatever you and your family do in word or deed, let you do in the name of the *Lord Jesus Christ* (Col. 3:17), being obedient in all things (2 Cor. 2:9). Surely, you are people of integrity (Ps. 25:21) and honor (Prov. 21:21); let not your honor be united to the assembly of the wicked, let not your soul enter their counsel (Gen. 49:6). In *Christ* (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we plead with the Lord that He will work for you and your house, for nothing restrains the Lord (1 Sam. 14:6). In *Christ* (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that the Lord will build your house, least you labor in vain (Ps. 127:1). By awesome deeds in righteousness You will answer us, O God of our salvation, You, who are the confidence of all the ends of the earth, and of the far-off seas; Who established the mountains by His strength, being clothed with power;

You who still the noise of the seas, the noise of their waves, and the tumult of the peoples! They also who dwell in the farthest parts are afraid of Your signs; You make the outgoings of the morning and evening rejoice. You visit the earth and water it, you greatly enrich it; the river of God is full of water; You provide their grain, for so You have prepared it. You water its ridges abundantly, you settle its furrows; You make it soft with showers, You bless its growth. You crown the year with Your goodness, and Your paths drip with abundance. They drop on the pastures of the wilderness, and the little hills rejoice on every side. The pastures are clothed with flocks; the valleys also are covered with grain; they shout for joy, they also sing (Ps. 65:5-13).

In the name of **Jesus Christ** (John 16:23), the Lord our banner (Ex. 17:15), our victory (1 Cor. 15:57), our miracle (Acts 19:11), in *Christ* (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that you and your family will keep your lives in order (Col. 2:5); and in six days you shall labor and do all your work (Ex. 20:9), but the seventh day you shall rest (Ex. 23:12) and do no servile work then (Lev. 23:8). Let you and your family not worry what you shall eat, what you shall drink, what you shall wear, for your heavenly Father knows all your needs. (Matt. 6:31-32). Let you and your people seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you and your house (Matt. 6:33). My God shall supply all your needs according to His riches and glory, by Christ Jesus (Phil. 4:19). El Shadda, the All-Sufficient One (Gen. 17:1) has made you to have dominion over the works of His hands; He has put all things under your feet (Ps. 8:6). Now may He who supplies seed to the sower, and bread for food, supply and multiply the seed you have sown and increase the fruits of your righteousness (2 Cor. 9:10). Let your work be of faith, your labor of love, and patience of hope in our **Lord Jesus Christ** in the sight of our God and Father, knowing your election by God (1 Thess.1:3-4). You and your family shall be secure in the covenant relationship that you have with God the Most-High (Gen. 14:18), and choose the election according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, in sanctification of the Spirit, for obedience and sprinkling of the blood of **Jesus Christ** (1 Pet. 1:2). Let you and your people come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem (Heb. 12:22), being registered in heaven (Heb. 12:23), having the spirits of a just man made perfect through <u>Jesus</u> the mediator of the new covenant, and through the blood of sprinkling (Heb 12:24). Praise is awaiting You, O God, in Zion; and to You the vow shall be performed (Ps. 65:1)!

As a servant of the Lord (Matt. 23:11), abiding in the Son and the Father (John 2:24), and one with Them (John 17:22), in truth (John 17:19) and in faith (Acts 26:18) we sanctify (1 John 17:17,19, Heb. 13:12) you and your entire bloodline (Gen. 17:7, Prov. 11:21), your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) and all of your

people (Ps. 148:14); by the blood of the Lamb of God (Rev. 7:14, 12:11); we sanctify your time (Is. 9:7, Is. 59:21) so that you will always be in the will of God (Col. 1:9) through the communion of the Holy Spirit (2 Cor. 13:14); and we sanctify your space (Jos. 7:13, 2 Chr. 29:5) by the overpowering presence of God (Judges 18:6, Ps. 17:1-2), who has made His home in you (John 14:23). Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely; and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be preserved blameless at the coming of our *Lord Jesus Christ* (1 Thess. 5:23). In the name of *Jesus Christ*, we fear the name of the Lord from the west, and His glory from the rising of the sun (Is. 59:19) and His love being perfected in us (1 John 4:12), we proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord, and the day of vengeance of our God (Is. 61:2)! In Him who is true (1 John 5:20), as one (John 17:21) we execute the written judgment—This honor has all His saints. God said it. We believe it. It is settled forever. In *Jesus'* name (John 16:23) so be it (Mark 11:23)! You, O Lord, shall endure forever, and the remembrance of your name to all generations (Ps. 102:12)! For Yours, O Lord, is the glory and the power and the kingdom forever (Matt. 6:13)! Amen!
