Armor of God



There is none holy like the Lord, for there is none besides Him, nor is there any rock like our God (1 Sam. 2:2). Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven (Matt. 6:9). In the name of **Jesus Christ**, who is the

brightness of God's glory and the express image of His person (Heb. 1:3), we lift up you and your entire house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) to the Father (Math. 6:9), all of your family (Acts 13:26), all of your blood from the beginning of time until the end of time (Prov. 11:21), all those by adoption (Gal. 4:5), and all those by marriage (Judge 12:9, 2 Chr. 18:1), all your natural seed (2 Sam. 7:12) and all of your spiritual seed (1 Tim. 1:2). In the mighty and awesome name of **Jesus Christ**, He had by Himself purged our sins (Heb. 1:3), we go up into the gaps to stand in battle on the day of the Lord, to build a wall (Ezek. 13:5) for you, your posterity (Prov. 11:21) and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21). The words that **Christ**, through us, speaks (Math. 10:19) to you and your family (Acts 13:26) are spirit, and they are life (John 6:63). Thanks be to God, who gives you the victory through our **Lord Jesus Christ** (1 Cor. 15:57)!

Jesus Christ came that all men may be saved (1 Tim. 2:4). It is not the will of our Father who is in heaven (Matt. 18:14), the living God, who is the Savior of all men (1 Tim. 4:10), that even one shall perish (Matt. 18:14). Therefore, choose life so that you and your descendants may receive abundant life, for God is not a respecter of persons, for there is no partiality with God (Rom. 2:11, Acts 10:34). For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth (1 Tim. 2:3-4). The Lord is not slack concerning His promise but is longsuffering toward you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21), not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance (2 Pet. 3:9). As a fellow worker in *Christ* (Rom. 16:3)) we pray (James 5:16), that you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) may lead a quiet and peaceful life, in all godliness and reverence (1 Tim. 2:1-2). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we stand in the gap before our Mighty God (Ezek. 22:30) and we speak to You, the Great, the Mighty God, whose name is the Lord of hosts (Jer. 32:18). According to Your mercy, O Lord, remember your children for the glory of your Name (Ps. 79:9), for Your Name's sake (Ps. 79:9)! In *Christ* (John 15:4), and by His authority, we sanctify today, this time (Neh. 13:22) and this space (1 Chr. 29:17) and we declare Today (Heb. 4:7), the day of the Lord (Is. 28:5). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we speak and declare (Jer. 1:7) the earth is the Lord's, and all its fullness, the world and those who dwell

therein (Ps. 24:1)! Now, these are Your servants and Your people, Your children (John 1:12), whom You have redeemed by Your great power, and by Your strong hand (Neh. 1:10). Whom you have ransomed from the hand of one stronger than them (Jer. 31:11). Oh Lord, in Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16), please let Your ear be attentive to this prayer, for we desire to fear your name; let you and your bloodline (Gen. 17:7, Prov. 11:21) prosper this day, and the Lord grant you and your bloodline (Gen. 17:7, Prov. 11:21) mercy in the sight of all men (Neh. 1:10-11). In your distress call upon the Lord and cry out to our God; He hears your voice from His temple, and your cry comes before Him, even to His ears (Ps. 18:6). Hear our prayer, O Lord, give ear to our supplications! In Your faithfulness answer us, and in Your righteousness (Ps. 143:1)! In the multitude of Your Mercy Hear us, in the truth of Your salvation (Ps. 69:13). According to His Word, the Lord be merciful to you and your bloodline (Gen. 17:7, Prov. 11:21), and with HIs Spirit speak (Rev. 2:7) to you and your bloodline (Gen. 17:7, Prov. 11:21). As a vessel of honor (Rom. 9:21), *Christ* being in us and we in *Christ* (John 15:4), we plead with you and your people (Ps. 148:14), that you will return (Jer. 24:7) to the stronghold (Zech. 9:12) of your God (Ps. 18:2); to God our Savior, who alone is wise, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and forever (Jude 1:25)! Truly, God will restore double to you (Zech. 9:12) and your people (Ps. 148:14). How great are His signs, and how mighty His wonders! His kingdom is an everlasting kingdom, and His dominion is from generation to generation (Dan. 14:3). God bless you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) and keep you (Num. 6:24). For the Lord commanded the blessing Life forevermore (Ps. 133:3). Let you greet one another with a kiss of love. Peace to you all who are in Christ Jesus (1 Pet. 5:14). In Christ (John 15:4) we come into agreement (Math. 18:19) with our Father in heaven (Matt. 6:9), the Spirit of Truth (John 14:17) and the Word of Life (1 John 1:1). It is written (Matt. 4:4), the things that in Christ (John 15:4) we speak (Jer. 1:7) and pray (James 5:16) for you and your family (Acts 13:26), for these words are true and faithful (Rev. 21:5), and they are the true sayings of God (Rev. 19:9). Oh, praise the Lord! Laud Him, all you people! For His merciful kindness is great toward you, and the truth of the Lord endures forever! Praise the Lord (Ps. 117:1-2)!

In the name of <u>Jesus Christ</u> (John 16:23), He who has appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself (Heb. 9:26), in <u>Christ</u> (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) will be <u>strong in the Lord and in the power of His might</u> (Eph. 6:10-20). The Lord is your rock and your fortress and your deliverer; your God, your strength, and your refuge (Ps. 91:2), in whom you shall trust; your shield and the horn of your salvation, your stronghold, your shelter, a strong tower from your enemies (Ps. 61:3),

your support (2 Sam. 22:19), your strong (Ps. 71:7) rock of refuge, a fortress of defense (Ps. 31:2), and your strong habitation (Ps. 71:3). In the fear of the Lord there is strong confidence, and His children will have a place of refuge (Prov. 14:26). You and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) shall dwell in the secret place of the Most-High and abide under the shadow of the Almighty (Ps. 91:1). Because you have made the Lord, who is your refuge, even the Most-High, your habitation, no evil shall befall you, nor shall any plague come near your dwelling; for He shall give His angels charge over you, to keep you in all your ways; to accompany, defend and preserve you (Ps. 91:9-11) and your people (Ps. 148:14) and provide safety day and night (Ps. 4:8). The Lord deliver you and yours from every evil work and preserve you (2 Tim 4:18) and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21). The Lord is your light and your salvation; whom shall you fear? The Lord is the strength of your life; of whom shall you be afraid (Ps. 27:1)? For in the time of trouble He shall hide you in His pavilion; in the secret place of His Tabernacle He shall hide you; He shall set you high upon a rock. And then your head shall be lifted up above your enemies all around you (Ps. 27:5-6). Your Lord has a mighty arm; strong is His hand, and high is His right hand. In *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that according to His Mercy He will remember you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21), and according to His goodness sake (Ps. 25:7), He will build a hedge around you, around your household, and all that you have (Job 1:10). Righteousness and justice are the foundation of His throne; mercy and truth go before His face. Blessed are you and your people (Ps. 148:14) for you shall know the joyful sound! You shall walk in the light of His countenance (Ps. 89:13-15). He will deliver you from your persecutors (Ps. 142:6) and out of temptations (2 Pet. 2:9), with a strong hand, and with an outstretched arm, for His mercy endures forever (Ps. 136:12). Your Redeemer is strong; the Lord of hosts is His name (Jer. 50.34). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that He will surround you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) with favor, as with a shield (Ps. 5:12). He will give you favor in the sight of your enemies, so that they will give up their treasures to you (Ex. 3:21-22); and by His Favor He will make your mountain stand strong (Ps. 30:7). He will thoroughly plead your case, that He may give rest to your territory, all of your land (Jer. 50:34). According to His name (Ps. 48:10), according to the exceeding greatness of His power (Ps. 79:11, Eph. 1:19, 2 Tim. 1:8) may God our Rock (Ps. 42:9) plead your cause, with those who strive with you and your family (Acts 13:26); fight against those who fight against you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21). Take hold of the shield and buckler and stand up for your help. Also draw out the spear and stop those who pursue you. Say to your soul, "I am your salvation." Let those be put to

shame and brought to dishonor who seek after your life; let those be turned back and brought to confusion who plot your hurt. Let them be like chaff before the wind and let the angel of the Lord chase them. Let their way be dark and slippery, and let the angel of the Lord pursue them (Ps. 35:1-6). The Lord is good, a stronghold in the day of trouble; and He knows those who trust in Him (Nah. 1:7). So let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) be strong in the Lord, and abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit (Rom. 15:23), for the kingdom of God is not in word but in power (1 Cor. 4:20). For His dominion is an everlasting dominion, and His kingdom is from generation to generation (Dan. 4:34). God, He has delivered you from the power of darkness and translated you into the kingdom of the Son of His love, in whom you have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins (Col. 1:13-14). You are kept by the power of God through faith for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time (1 Pet. 1:5). Therefore, in *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16), you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) will offer sacrifices of joy in His tabernacle; you and your people (Ps. 148:14) will sing, yes, you will sing praises to the Lord (Ps. 26:6). Now to Him who is able to keep you from stumbling, and to present you faultless and blameless (Ps. 18:23) before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy, to God our Savior, who alone is wise, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and forever (Jude 1:24-25)! You, O Lord, are worthy to receive glory and honor and power; for You created all things, and by Your will they exist and were created (Rev. 4:11)!

In the name of <u>Jesus Christ</u> (John 16:23), for in Him dwells all the fullness of the Godhead bodily; and you are complete in Him, who is the head of all principality and power (Col. 2:9-10). Abiding in the Son and the Father (John 2:24), we pray (James 5:16) that you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) will be <u>strong in the Lord and in the power of His might</u> (Eph. 6:10-20). You have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellence of the power may be of God and not of you. Although you were sown in corruption, dishonor, weakness, and a natural body; you are raised in incorruption, glory, power, and a spiritual body (1 Cor. 15:42-44). His divine power has given to you all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called you by glory and virtue (2 Pet. 1:3). And His name, through faith in His name, has made you and your people (Ps. 148:14) strong (Acts 3:16). His grace is sufficient for you, for His strength is made perfect in weakness, the power of <u>Christ</u> rest upon you (2 Cor. 12:9). Therefore, let the weak say, 'I am strong' (Joel 3:19). Yes, the faith which comes through Him has given you this perfect soundness (Acts. 3:16). For God has not given you a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound

mind (2 Tim. 1:7). For though He was crucified in weakness, yet He lives by the power of God. You also are weak in Him, but you shall live with Him by the power of God (2 Cor. 13:4), the exceedingly great power, His mighty power (Eph. 1:19); for the weakness of God is stronger than men (1 Cor. 1:25). Neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate you from the love of God which is in *Christ Jesus our Lord* (Rom. 8:38-39). And God both raised up the Lord and will also raise you up by His power (1 Cor. 6:14). Let all the earth fear the Lord; let all the inhabitants of the world stand in awe of Him! For He spoke, and it was done; He commanded, and it stood fast (Ps. 33:8-9)!

In the name of **Jesus Christ** (John 16:23), in whom is the eternal power and Godhead (Rom. 1:20), be strong and of good courage (Josh. 1:9), be very courageous (Josh. 1:9), do not fear nor be afraid, nor be dismayed (Josh. 1:9), but be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might (Eph. 6:10-20). Be strong for your people (Ps. 148:14) and for your God (2 Sam. 11:as); for the Lord our God, He is the One who goes with you. He will not leave you nor forsake you (Deut. 31:6); He will deliver you from your strong enemy, from those who are too strong for you and hate you (2 Sam. 10:12). The Lord will cause your enemies who rise against you to be defeated before your face; they shall come out against you one way and flee before you seven ways (Deut. 28:7), no one will be able to stand against you (Josh. 23:9). You shall call upon the Lord, He will answer you (Ps. 91:15); because you have set your love upon Him, He will deliver you (Ps. 91:14); He will set you on high, because you have known His name (Ps. 91:14). He will be with you in trouble: He will deliver you and honor you. With long life He will satisfy you and show you His salvation (Ps. 91:15). It is written: "Death is swallowed up in victory" (1 Cor. 15:54). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that our Lord Jesus Christ (Acts 2:36) will set you as a seal upon His heart, as a seal upon his arm; for love is as strong as death (Song. 8:6). Thanks be to God, who gives you the victory through our **Lord Jesus** Christ (1 Cor. 15:57)! You are born of God and whatever is born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world, your faith (1 John 5:4). You have victory over the beast, over his image and over his mark and over the number of his name (Rev. 15:2), through faith in *Christ* (John 15:4), your Strength (Ps. 59:9). You shall not be afraid of the terror by night, nor of the arrow that flies by day, nor of the pestilence that walks in darkness, nor of the destruction that lays waste at noonday. A thousand may fall at your side, and ten thousand at your right hand; but it shall not come near you or your

bloodline (Gen. 17:7, Prov. 11:21). Only with your eyes shall you look and see the reward of the wicked. Because you have made the Lord, who is your refuge, even the Most-High, your habitation (Ps. 91:5-9). Be strong, do not fear! Behold, your God will come with vengeance, with the recompense of God; He will come and save you (Is. 35:4) and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21). For God, Himself, is to be feared; and who may stand in His presence when once He is angry (Ps. 76:7). Indeed, His hand has laid the foundation for the earth, and His right hand has stretched out the heavens; when He calls to them, they stand up together (Is. 48:13). His counsel shall stand, and He will do all His pleasure in your life (Is. 46:10) also, in your bloodline (Gen. 17:7, Prov. 11:21).

In the mighty name of **Jesus Christ** (John 16:23), for God, Himself, said to my Lord, "Sit at My right hand, till I make Your Enemies Your footstool (Matt. 22:44), in *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) will be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. (Eph. 6:10-20). Now, thanks be to God who always leads you in triumph in *Christ*, and through you diffuses the fragrance of His knowledge in every place (2 Cor. 2:14). For in Him dwells all the fullness of the Godhead bodily; in *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (John 15:4), in the name of **Jesus Christ** (John 16:23), who gives life to all things (1 Tim. 6:13), that you and your family (Acts 13:26) will be complete in Him, who is the head of all principality and power (Col. 2:9-10). Having disarmed principalities and powers, He, **Jesus Christ**, made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them in it (Col. 2:15). For the gospel did not come to you in word only, but also in power, and in the Holy Spirit and in much assurance (1 Thess. 1:5). Therefore, in *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (John 15:4), do not be ashamed of the gospel (Rom. 1:16), nor be ashamed of the testimony of our Lord (2 Tim. 1:8). For God created all things through Jesus Christ, and through Jesus Christ you have boldness and access with confidence through faith in Him to God (Eph. 3:9-12), and He is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that you ask or think (Eph. 3:20). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that He will make you know Him who is from the beginning (1 John 2:14) and the power of His resurrection (Phil. 3:10), and strengthen you with all might, according to His glorious power (Col. 1:11), that you grow stronger and stronger (Judges 4:24, Job 17:9), by the Mighty God of Jacob (from there is the Shepherd, the Stone of Israel) (Gen. 49:24). Let the word of God abide in you, and you will overcome the wicked one (1 John 2:14). May you grow strong in spirit, filled with wisdom; and the grace of God be upon you (Luke 2:40) and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21). May it be God's good pleasure (Eph. 1:9) to keep you strong in body (Josh. 14:11). May the Lord keep you alive (Josh. 14:10); that you may prosper in

all things and be in health, just as your soul prospers (3 John 1:2), for the chastisement for your peace was upon Him, and by His stripes you are healed (ls. 53:5). May He grant you according to your heart's desire and fulfill all your purpose (Ps. 20:4). Just as Joshua was kept by the Lord to fulfill His purpose. Although Joshua was eighty-five years old he declared: "As yet I am as strong this day as I was on the day that Moses sent me; just as my strength was then, so now is my strength for war, both for going out and for coming in" (Josh. 14:11). Let your life be a demonstration of the Spirit and of power; your faith (1 Cor. 2:5) and your words (1 Cor. 4:19) being in the power of God (1 Cor. 2:5); being wise and strong in Christ (1 Cor. 4:10), holding fast to the way of righteousness (Job 17:19), carrying out great exploits (Dan. 11:32), according to the gift of the grace of God given to you by the effective working of His power (Eph. 3:7). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you and your people (Ps. 148:14) will stand steadfast in your hearts, having power over your own will (1 Cor. 7:37), that *Christ* may accomplish mighty signs and wonders through you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21), by the power of the Spirit of God (Rom. 15:18-19): doing good, healing all who are oppressed by the devil (Acts 10:38); that *Christ* will give you the power and authority over all demons and to cure diseases (Luke 9:1), to cast out unclean spirits, and to heal all kinds of sickness and all kinds of disease (Matt. 10:1); and great power to witness (Acts 4:33), being full of faith and power, to do great wonders and signs among the people (Acts 6:8). In Christ (John 15:4), no one takes your life from you, but you have the power to lay it down yourself (John 10:18), for no one has power at all against you, unless it has been given them from above (John 19:11). You who stand in the house of the Lord, in the courts of the house of your God, praise the Lord, for the Lord is good; sing praises to His name, for it is pleasant (Ps. 135:2-3)!

In the name of <u>Jesus Christ</u> (John 16:23), who is the great power of God (Acts 8:10), in <u>Christ</u> (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) will be <u>strong in the Lord and in the power of His might</u> (Eph. 6:10-20). We give thanks, O Lord God Almighty, the One who is and who was and who is to come, because You have taken Your great power and reigned (Rev. 11:17). Now salvation, and strength, and the kingdom of our God, and the power of his <u>Christ</u> have come, for the accuser of our brethren, who accused you and your people (Ps. 148:14) before our God day and night, has been cast down (Rev. 12:10). Alleluia! Salvation and glory and honor and power to the Lord our God (Rev. 19:1)! Blessing and honor and power and might, be to our God, to Him who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb (Rev. 5:13), forever and ever (Rev. 8:12). You, O Lord,

remain forever; Your throne from generation to generation (Lam. 5:19). **Jesus Christ**, declared to be the Son of God with power, according to the Spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead (Rom. 1:4), the King of kings and Lord of lords, who alone has immortality, dwelling in unapproachable light, whom no man has seen or can see, too Him be honor and everlasting power (1 Tim. 6:15). He, we will see sitting on the right hand of Power, and coming on the clouds of heaven with great power and glory (Matt. 26:64). For by Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers. All things are created through Him and for Him. And he is before all things, and in Him all things consist (Col. 1:16-17). Jesus Christ, the Son of God, heir of all things, through whom also God made the worlds; who being the brightness of His glory and the express image of his person, and upholding all things by the word of His power, when he had by Himself purged ours sins. sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high (Heb. 1:2-4), far above all principality and power and might and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this age but also in that which is to come (Eph. 1:20-21), angels and authorities and powers having been made subject to him (1 Pet. 3:22), having become so much better than the angels, as He has by inheritance obtained a more excellent name than they (Heb. 1:4). Heaven is His throne, and the earth is His footstool (Acts 7:49). In the likeness of Melchizedek, there arises another priest, **Jesus Christ**, who has come, not according to the law of a fleshly commandment, but according to the power of an endless life (Heb. 7:15-16). We give thanks to His holy name, and we triumph in His praise (1 Chr. 16:35)! Who is this King of glory? The Lord strong and mighty, the lord mighty in battle, that's who! Lift up your heads, O you Gates! And lift them up, you everlasting doors! And the King of glory shall come in! Who is this King of glory? The Lord of hosts, He is the King of glory (Ps. 24:8-10)!

As God's fellow worker (1 cor. 3:9) we pray (James 5:16) in the name of <u>Jesus Christ</u> (John 16:23), the root of Jesse, who stands as a banner to the people; for the Gentiles shall seek Him, and His resting place shall be glorious (Is. 11:10). Therefore, take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and <u>having done all, stand</u> (Eph. 6:10-20) against the wiles of the devil (Eph. 6:10-20). Let you and all your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) submit to God; resist the devil and he will flee from you (James 4:7). In <u>Christ</u> (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that God will make you stand (Rom. 14:4), according to His word (Ps. 119). He will uphold you with His righteous right hand (Is. 4:10). Stand fast therefore in the liberty by which *Christ* has made you free, and do not be entangled again with a yoke of

bondage (Gal. 5:1). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you and all of your people (Ps. 148:14) will stand fast: in the Lord (Phil. 4:1), in the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1), in the Word, in faith (Rom. 11:20, 1 Cor. 16:23), and in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel (Phil. 1:27). May you be brave, be strong (1 Cor. 16:23), standing fast. Always laboring fervently for each other in prayers, that you may stand perfect and complete in all the will of God (Col. 4:12). May you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) stand up for each other against the workers of iniquity (Ps. 94:16). Let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) rise up and stand upright, remembering the name of the Lord your God (Ps. 20:7-8), standing in the true grace of God (1 Pet. 5:12). God grant that whenever you stand praying, if you have anything against anyone, that you forgive him, that your Father in heaven may also forgive you your trespasses (Mark 11:25). For if a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand (Mark 3:25). Therefore, having obtained help from God, to this day let you and your family (Acts 13:26) stand, witnessing both to the small and great (Acts 26;6), having access by faith into this grace in which you stand, and rejoicing in hope of the glory of God (Rom. 5:2). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that the Lord's counsel will stand in your heart (Prov. 19:21), and you will excel in your work (Prov. 22:29); you shall stand at the right hand of the poor (Ps. 109:31), and by a generous spirit you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) shall stand (ls. 32:8). Let you and your people (Ps. 148:14) stand as judges and judge it according to God's judgments (Ezek. 44:24), for we shall all stand before the judgment seat of *Christ* (Rom. 14:10). And now you stand and are judged for the hope of the promise made by God (Acts 26.6). Let you and your family (Acts 13:26) stand in the ways and see, and ask for the old paths, where the good way is, and walk in it; then you will find rest for your souls (Jer. 6:16). Stand still and consider the wondrous works of God (Job 37:14). Your covenant with death will be annulled, and your agreement with Sheol will not stand (Is. 28:18). God, the Mighty One (Is. 10:34), will take hold of the shield and buckler, and stand up for you (Ps. 35:2) and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21). So shall we fear the name of the Lord from the west, and His glory from the rising of the sun; when the enemy comes in, like a flood the Spirit of the Lord will lift up a standard against him (Is. 59:19); with an overflowing flood he will make an utter end of its place, and darkness will pursue your enemies (Nah. 1:8), for your enemies are His enemies (Mark 12:36). It is written: "I will make you a great nation; I will bless you and make your name great; and you shall be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and I will curse him who curses you; and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed." says the Lord God Almighty (Gen. 12:2-3)! His covenant shall stand firm with you (Ps. 89:28) and your

family (Acts 13:26). For surely, as He has thought, so it shall come to pass, and as He has purposed, so it shall stand (Is. 14:24). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you and your people (Ps. 148:14) will return to God, He will bring you back. You shall stand before Him; if you take out the precious from the vile, you shall be as His mouth (Jer. 15:19). God grant (1 Sam. 1:17) that you will not lack a man to stand before God forever (Jer. 35:19). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you will have clean hands and a pure heart, and not lift up your soul to an idol, nor swear deceitfully, so that you may ascend into the hill of the Lord, and stand in His holy place (Ps. 24:3-4). Behold, the *Lord Jesus* stands at the door and knocks. Abiding in God and abiding in His love (1 John 4:16), we pray (James 5:16) that you and your family (Acts 13:26) will hear His voice and open the door of your heart, so that He will come in to you and dine with you and you with Him and be with you (Rev. 3:20). Bless the Lord, all you servants of the Lord, who by night stand in the house of the Lord! Lift up your hands in the sanctuary and bless the Lord! The Lord who made heaven and earth bless you from Zion (Ps. 134:1-3)!

Jesus Christ (John 16:23), He who is called Faithful and True (Rev. 3:14), in righteousness He judges and makes war (Rev. 19:11). In His name (John 16:23), as a chosen vessel of Jesus Christ to bear His name (Acts 9;15), we pray (James 5:16) for you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21). For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places (Eph. 6:10-20). Therefore, in *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16), you and your people (Ps. 148:14) will put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil (Eph. 6:11). Let you be a strong man, fully armed, who guards his own house (Luke 22:21), being baptized into Christ and putting on *Christ* (Gal. 3:27), the armor of light (Rom. 13:12). It is written: "For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of *Christ* (2 Cor. 10:4-5)". As a fellow worker for the Truth (3 John 1:8), in *Christ* (John 15:4) we ask our Mighty God, the God of truth and without injustice (Deut. 32:4), to pull down and demolish every stronghold that enables the enemy in you (2 Cor. 10:4) and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21), including all strongholds that promote the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eye and the pride of life (1 John 2:16). As a co-worker of God (1 Cor. 3:9), in Christ (John 15:4) we ask the Lord Jehovah (Gen. 2:4 ASV) your everlasting strength, (ls. 26:4) to cast down every argument, speculation, imagination,

intellectual arrogance, theories and reasoning, proud and lofty opinions, rebellious thoughts, and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God (2 Cor. 10:5 various ver.) that dwells within you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21), and to take your every thought, dream (Eccl. 5:7), desire (Ps. 78:29), ambition (Philp, 2:3), and every word you speak (Math. 12:37, Is. 6:5) captive and put it under the obedience of *Christ Jesus* our Lord (2 Cor. 10:4-5). God abiding in us, and His love being perfected in us (1 John 4:12), in *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that according to His loving kindness; according to the multitude of His tender mercies (Ps. 51:1), that the Father of mercies (2 Cor. 1:3) will fill all empty space (Math. 12:44) in you and your people (Ps. 148:14) with His Holy Spirit (Matt. 3:11), the Spirit of Truth (John 14:17) and an overflowing of love shall be poured out on you (Rom. 5:5) filling every crack and crevice (Is. 28:17), overflowing the hiding places, flooding the refuge of lies and sweeping them away (Is. 28:17). Let us sing of the ways of the Lord, for Great is the glory of the Lord! Though the Lord is on high, yet He regards the lowly (Ps. 138:5-6). So, let His name be magnified forever! Let you and your family (Acts 13:26) declare: `The Lord of hosts (Ps. 24:8) is the God over our house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21)! And let your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) be established before Him forever (2 Sam. 7:26)!

Abiding in the Son and the Father (John 2:24), let you and your family (Acts 13:26) take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to **stand** (Eph. 6:13). **Jesus Christ**, Himself, who sits at the right hand of God Almighty, gives us authority over all the power of the enemy (Luke 10:19). It is written: "Behold, I give you the authority to trample on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall by any means hurt you" says our Lord and Savior (Luke 10:19)! In Him who is true (1 John 5:20), **Jesus Christ** (John 16:23), in His mighty name (Is. 9:6), we take authority over all the power of the enemy over you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) and command that nothing shall grow from it ever again, it shall wither away just as the fig tree withered away when **Jesus** cursed it in Matt. 21:19. The Lord will perfect that which concerns you. For His mercy endures forever (Ps. 138:8)!

In <u>Christ</u> (John 15:4-5), abiding in Him, and born of Him (1 John 2:29), let you and your family (Acts 13:26) take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to <u>stand</u> (Eph. 6:13). It is written: "I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven" (Math 16:19). Therefore, as God's vessel of mercy (Rom. 9:23), <u>Christ</u> abiding in us and we in Him (John 15:5), in His name, <u>Jesus</u>

Christ (John 16:23), we speak (Jer. 1:7) to all spirits that are not of God and command you to silence (1 Pet. 2:15). We relieve you of your assignments and command you to take your rightful place (Luke 10:19) in the footstool of **Jesus Christ**, for that is your destiny (Math. 22:44). As an ambassador of *Christ* (2 Cor. 5:20), a vessel of God's honor (2 Tim. 2:21), *Christ* in us (1 John 5:20) speaks (Math. 10:19) to you Satan (Math. 4:10) and all unclean (Luke 7:21) or evil spirits (Luke 7:21) that have been assigned to, or sent against you and your bloodline (Gen. 17:7, Prov. 11:21) and by the authority given to us by Jesus Christ (Luke 10:19), Himself, He who is the head of all principalities and powers (Col. 2:10) and He who abides in us (1 John 5:20), we bind (Math. 16:19) you Satan (Math. 4:10) and all evil (Luke 7:21) or unclean spirits (Luke 7:21). In the mighty name of Jesus Christ (John 16:23) we break his power over you and your bloodline (Gen. 17:7, Prov. 11:21) and your people (Ps. 148:14) and loose them from his hold (Math. 16:19). In the name of our Lord and Savior (2 Pet. 1:11), Jesus Christ (John 16:23), as God's vessel of ministry (Heb. 9:21), we command you Satan (Math. 4:10), and all evil and unclean spirits (Luke 8:29) to stop your maneuvers and schemes (2 Cor. 2:11), tricks and snares (2 Tim. 2:25), strategies and devises (2 Cor. 2:11) to kill, steal, and destroy (John 10:10). We declare you and your bloodline (Gen. 17:7, Prov. 11:21), your entire house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) and all your people (Ps. 148:14) are covered by the blood of the Lamb (Rev. 7:14), Jesus Christ. In the name of Jesus Christ (John 16:23), and by His precious blood (1 Pet. 1:19), abiding in *Christ* (John 15:4) we bind and break off of you (Math. 16:19) and your family (Acts 13:26) all principalities, powers, rulers of darkness of this age, and spiritual wickedness in high places (Eph. 6:12), all occult activity: witchcraft (Duet. 18:10), curses (Duet. 23:4-5), hexes, sorcery (Duet. 18:10), divination (Lev. 19:26) and all soul power (Prov. 15:28) that does not glorify our Lord Jesus Christ (Rom. 15:17). We bind the kings of darkness with chains and the nobles of darkness with fetters of iron and we execute the written judgment against them, for this honor has all His saints (Ps. 149:9). It is written: "The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly." Says Jesus Christ (John 10:10), our Redeemer (Gal. 4:5, Job 19:25). Therefore, Christ abiding in us (John 15:4-5, 6:56) commands life and life more abundantly for you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21). It is written: "It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh profits nothing". The words that *Christ*, through us, speaks to you and your family (Acts 13:26) are spirit, and they are life (John 6:63). *Christ*, Him being in us and we being in *Christ* (John 15:4), in the mighty name of *Jesus* Christ (John 16:23), we speak words of life and blessing into you (John 6:63) and your family (Acts 13:26). Jesus Christ through us commands obedience from the flesh (Rom. 1:5, 6:16, 1 Pet 1:2),

and we release (Math. 16:19) the blessings of God to overtake you (Duet. 28:2) and your family (Acts 13:26). We release peace (John 14:27), prosperity (3 John 1:2) and joy (John 15:11) into your lives. As an ambassador of *Christ* (2 Cor. 5:20), we declare this day is holy to our Lord (Neh. 8:9). The joy of the Lord is our strength (Neh. 8:10). Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. For Yours, O Lord, is the kingdom, the power, and the glory forever (Matt. 6:9-10)! Let us praise the Lord our God with all our heart; sing praises to Him (Ps. 138:1), who keeps His covenant and mercy with those who love Him (Dan. 9:4)! Let us worship toward His holy temple and praise His name for His lovingkindness and His truth; for He has magnified His word above all His name (Ps. 138:1-2)!

As a chosen vessel of **Jesus Christ**, to bear His name (Acts 9:15), let you and your family (Acts 13:26) take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand (Eph. 6:13). According to His good pleasure (Eph. 1:5) may the Mighty One, God the Lord (Ps. 50:1) make you bold with strength in your soul (Ps. 138:3). May our God, He is our Rock, His work is perfect (Deut. 32:4), grant (1 Sam. 1:17) you the boldness (Prov. 28:9) to bind the strong man (Satan), enter his house and plunder his goods (Math. 12:29). The Lord our God, Him who holds your right hand to subdue nations before you and loose the armor of kings, to open before you and your people (Ps. 148:14) the double doors, so that the gates will not be shut: He will go before you and make the crooked places straight; He will break in pieces the gates of bronze and cut the bars of iron. He will give you the treasures of darkness and hidden riches of secret places, that you may know that He, the Lord, who calls you by your name, He is the God of your house (ls. 45:1-3). May you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) be strong in the Lord (Eph. 6:10), fully armed in *Christ* (Num. 32:27). Let you put on *Christ* (Gal. 3:27), and guard your own house, that your goods be in peace (Luke 11:21-22), for there is none stronger than God (1 Cor. 1:25). Let His hand, the Lord God of Hosts, be upon you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21). May he make you strong for Himself, revive you, restore you, increase you greatly and make you stronger than your enemies (Ps. 105:24); and cause His face to shine on you (Ps. 80:7-19). Beloved (Deut. 33:12), in *Christ* (John 15:4) we beg of you and your people (Ps. 148:14) as sojourners and pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts which war against the soul (1 Pet. 2:11). Let you fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life (1 Tim. 6:12), press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus (Phil. 3:14), and gain the prize of an imperishable crown (1 cor. 9:25). You can do all things through *Christ* who strengthens you

(Phil. 4:13). You are of God and have overcome, because He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world (John 4:4). The dragon is enraged, and he makes war against those who keep the commandments of God and have the testimony of *Jesus Christ* (Rev. 12:17). Nevertheless, the Ancient of Days came, and a judgment was made in favor of the saints of the Most-High, and the time has come for the saints to possess the kingdom (Dan. 7:22). The beast, and those who give their power to Him, will make war with the Lamb, but the Lamb has overcome them, for He is Lord of lords and King of kings; and those who are with Him are called, chosen, and faithful (Rev. 17:14). Therefore, if you summit to God and stand, then the devil will flee from you (James 4:7). The Lord of hosts (Ps. 24:8), the Mighty One of Israel (Is. 1:24), He has declared to His people the power of His works, in giving you and your people (Ps. 148:14) the heritage of the nations. The works of His hands are verity and justice; all His precepts are sure. They stand fast forever and ever and are done in truth and uprightness. He has sent redemption to you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21); He has commanded His covenant forever: Holy and awesome is His name (Ps. 111:6-9)!

Let you and your family (Acts 13:26) stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth (Eph. 6:14). In the name of **Jesus** (John 16:23), who is the way, the truth, and the life (John 14:6), abiding in *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) to the Father (Math. 6:9), and He will give you and your people (Ps. 148:14) another Helper, even the Spirit of Truth, to guide you into all truth (John 16:13), to establish you in truth (2 Pet. 1:12), putting truth in the inward parts (Ps. 51:6), sanctifying you by truth (John 17:19, Eph. 5:9), and in the hidden part to make you know wisdom, to give you an understanding, that you may know Him who is true, and be in Him who is true (1 John 5:20). Let you and your people (Ps. 148:14) not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God (Rom. 12:2). And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free (John 8:32). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that your mind may not be corrupted from the simplicity that is in **Christ** (2 Cor. 11:3), but you will hear and know the grace of God in truth (Col. 1:6), walk before God in truth with all your heart and with all your soul (1 Kin. 2:4), rejoicing in the truth (1 Cor. 13:6), worshiping the Father in Spirit and truth (John 4:23), fearing the Lord and serving Him in sincerity (Josh 24:14) and truth (1 Sam. 12:24, 2 Cor. 5:8), being a servant to the circumcision of the truth of God (Rom 15:8), and handling the word of God by the manifestation of the truth (2 Cor. 4:2), for the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness, righteousness, and truth (Eph. 5:9). May God perhaps grant you and your people (Ps. 148:14) repentance, so that you may know the truth, and that you may come to your

senses and escape the snare of the devil (2 Tim. 2:25-26). According to His good pleasure (Eph. 1:5), in *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) the Lord will open your eyes and turn you from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan to God, that you may receive forgiveness of sins and an inheritance among those who are sanctified by faith in *Christ* (Acts 26:18). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you will incline your ear and hear the words of the wise, and apply your heart to His knowledge (Prov. 22:17), that you will endure sound doctrine (2 Tim. 4:3), and abide in the doctrine of *Christ* (2 John 1:9), having an understanding heart that you may discern between good and evil (1 Kin. 2:3), rightly dividing the word of truth (2 Tim. 2:15), knowing the spirit of truth and the spirit of error (1 John 4:6), choosing the way of truth (Ps. 119:30), being men of truth (Ex. 18:21), dealing truthfully in all that you do or say (Prov. 12:22), walking in truth (3 John 4:3), and speaking the truth in your heart (Ps. 15:2), having the law of truth in your mouth (Mal. 2:6), speaking the truth in love (Eph. 4:15), that you may grow up in all things into Him who is the head, Christ Jesus (Eph. 4:15). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory (Eph. 1:17), may give to you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him, the eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that you may know what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints, and what is the exceeding greatness of His power toward you who believe, according to the working of His mighty power (Eph. 1:17-19). That you might know the wisdom that is from above, which is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality and without hypocrisy (James 3:17). The Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon you, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord (ls. 11:2). Therefore, do not be unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is (Eph. 5:17). For this reason we also do not cease to pray (James 5:16) for you, and to ask that you may be filled with the knowledge of His will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding; that you may have a walk worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing Him, being fruitful in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God; strengthened with all might, according to His glorious power, for all patience and longsuffering with joy; giving thanks to the Father who has qualified you to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in the light (Col. 1:9-12). The Lord lives, in truth, in judgment, and in righteousness; you shall bless yourselves in Him, and in him you shall glory (Jer. 4:2), for His truth continually preserves you (Ps. 40:11) and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21)!

In the name of **Jesus Christ** (John 16:23), through whom grace might reign through righteousness to eternal life (Rom. 5:21), let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) stand therefore, having put on the *breastplate of righteousness* (Eph. 6:10-20). For God made Him who knew no sin to be sin for you, so that you might become the righteousness of God through Jesus Christ (2 Cor. 5:21), your savior (Luke 1:47), your redeemer (Luke 1:47), your life and your resurrection (John 5;29). In His righteousness you are exalted! He is the glory of your strength, and in His favor your horn is exalted (Ps. 89:16-17)! God, who delights in exercising loving-kindness, judgment, and righteousness in the earth (Jer. 9:24), is upright; He is your rock, and there is no unrighteousness in Him (Ps. 92:15)! He will never leave you, nor forsake you (Heb. 13:5). The Lord, your God, will never forget you, you have been inscribed on the palms of His hands (Is. 9:16). He will dwell in you and walk beside you (2 cor. 6:16), even to the end of the world, He will be with you (Math. 28:20). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that the Lord will impute righteousness to you (Rom. 4:11) and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21), it will overtake you (Is. 59:9) and your people (Ps. 148:14) and He, who is Judge of all the earth (Gen. 18:25), will not rest until your righteousness goes forth as brightness (Is. 62:1), and you wear the crown of righteousness, which the Lord will give to you on the **Day** of Christ (2 Tim. 4:8). The Lord has called you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) in righteousness, and will hold your hand (ls. 42:6-9). Surely, in the Lord you have righteousness and strength! Surely, in the Lord you and all your descendants shall be justified and shall glory (Is. 45:24-25)! In *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that God in His mercy (Eph. 2:4) will put a hunger and thirst in you for righteousness. For blessed is he who hungers and thirst for righteousness, for he shall be filled (Math. 5:6). The Lord is exalted, for He dwells on high, truly, He will fill you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) with justice and righteousness (Is. 33:5). Let you and yours seek first the kingdom of God and all other things will be added to you. For the Kingdom of God is not what you eat or drink, but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit within your heart (Rom. 14:17). In Christ (John 15:4) We pray (James 5:16) that you and your people (Ps. 148:14) will commit your way to the Lord, trust also in Him, and He shall bring it to pass. He shall bring forth your righteousness as the light, and your justice as the noonday (Ps. 37:5-6). May you receive blessing from the Lord, and righteousness from the God of your salvation (Ps. 24:5). The Lord is your Shepherd; you shall not want (Ps. 23:1). He restores your soul; so, you may walk in the way of goodness, and keep to the paths of righteousness (Prov. 2:20), in the midst of the paths of justice (Prov. 8:20). Let you and your family (Acts 13:26) follow

righteousness and mercy and find life, righteousness and honor (Prov. 21:21), for righteousness delivers from death (Prov. 10:2). May it please the Father (Col. 1:19) to lead you and establish you (Prov. 25:5) in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake (Ps. 23:3). According to all His wonderful works (Jer. 21:2), the Lord will open to you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) the gates of righteousness; let you and your people (Ps. 148:14) go through them (Ps. 118:19-21), offering the sacrifices of righteousness, putting your trust in the Lord (Ps. 4:5). May the Lord lead you and your family (Acts 13:26) in righteousness, and make your way straight before your face (Ps. 5:8), and for His righteousness' sake revive you (Ps. 119:40), and bring your soul out of trouble (Ps. 143:11). God, righteous and upright is He (Deut. 32:4), He guards the paths of justice, and preserves the way of His saints. He will make you and your family (Acts 13:26) understand righteousness and justice, equity and every good path (Prov. 2:8-9). For the mercy of the Lord is from everlasting to everlasting on those who fear Him, and His righteousness to children's children (Ps. 103:17). The Lord executes righteousness and justice for all who are oppressed (Ps. 103:6). The Lord will raise you and your family (Acts 13:26) up in righteousness, and He will direct all your ways (ls. 45:13); your work will be peace, and the effect of your righteousness, quietness and assurance forever (ls. 32:17). Your peace will be like a river, and your righteousness like the waves of the sea (ls. 48:18). In righteousness you shall be established; you shall be far from oppression, for you shall not fear; and from terror, for it shall not come near you (ls. 54:14). Then your light shall break forth like the morning, your healing shall spring forth speedily, and your righteousness shall go before you: the glory of the Lord shall be your rear guard (ls. 58:8). No weapon formed against you shall prosper and every tongue that rises up against you in judgment, you shall condemn, for you are servants of God and your righteousness is from Him. You and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) shall be called trees of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, that He may be glorified (ls. 61:3). Do not hide His righteousness within your heart (Ps. 40:10). Let your mouth tell of His righteousness and His salvation (Ps. 71:15), declare His faithfulness, loving-kindness and truth (Ps. 40:10), and let your tongue speak of His Word (Ps. 119:172), singing aloud of His righteousness (Ps. 51:14), and singing praise to the name of the Lord (Ps. 7:17) all the day long (Ps. 35:28).

In the name of <u>Jesus Christ</u> (John 16:23), abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the One, <u>Jesus Christ</u> (Rom. 5:17), in His mighty name let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) stand therefore, having put on the **breastplate of righteousness** (Eph. 6:10-20). In **Christ** (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you

and your family (Acts 13:26) will put off, concerning your former conduct, the old man which grows corrupt according to the deceitful lusts, and be renewed in the spirit of your mind, and that you put on the new man which was created according to God, in righteousness and true holiness (Eph. 4:22:24). Let you and your family (Acts 13:26) flee also youthful lusts; instead pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, gentleness (1 Tim. 6:11), and peace with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart, sanctifying the Lord God in your hearts (1 Pet. 3:15-16). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you will be quick to confess your sins, for He is faithful and just to forgive you your sins and to cleanse you from all unrighteousness (2 John 1:9, 2 Tim. 2:22). Now the righteousness of God apart from the law is revealed, which is through faith in **Jesus Christ**, and you, being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in *Christ Jesus*, God has passed over the sins that were previously committed by you, to demonstrate at the present time His righteousness, that He might be just and the justifier of you and your family (Acts 13:26) who have faith in **Jesus** (Rom. 3:22-26). **Christ**, Himself, bore your sins in His own body on the tree, that you, having died to sins, might live for righteousness (1 Pet. 2:24), presenting yourselves to God as being alive from the dead, submitted to the righteousness of God (Rom. 10:3), instruments of righteousness (Rom 6:13), obedient to righteousness (Rom. 6:16), and becoming slaves of righteousness (Rom. 6:18) for holiness sake (Rom. 6:19). Having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust, in *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you and your people (Ps. 148:14) will awake to righteousness (1 Cor. 15:34), obtaining the precious faith by the righteousness of our God and Savior Jesus Christ (2 Pet. 1:1), for with the heart one believes to righteousness (Rom. 10:10); becoming an heir of righteousness which is according to faith (Heb. 11:7), believing the gospel of *Christ*, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes; and believing on Him who justifies the ungodly; your faith is accounted for righteousness (Rom. 4:5). For in the gospel the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, "The just shall live by faith." (Rom 1:17). Now may He who supplies seed to the sower, and bread for food, supply and multiply the seed you have sown and increase the fruits of your righteousness (2 cor. 9:10). In Christ (John 15:4) We pray (James 5:16) that you and your people (Ps. 148:14) will sow for yourselves righteousness (Prov. 11:18); reap in mercy; break up your fallow ground, for it is time to seek the Lord, and follow after righteousness (Is. 51:1), till He comes and rains righteousness on you (Hosea 10:12). Let justice run down like water, and righteousness like a mighty stream (Amos 5:24). Rain down You heavens, from above, and let the skies pour

down righteousness; let the earth open, let them bring forth salvation, and let righteousness spring up together (Is. 45:8). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we beg of you, seek righteousness, seek humility (Zep. 2:3), and may God purify you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21), purge you as gold and silver (Mal 3:3), bring you forth to the light (Mic. 7:9), that you may offer to the Lord an offering in righteousness (Mal. 3:3). God grant that you, being delivered from the hand of your enemies, might serve Him without fear, in holiness and righteousness before Him all the days of your life, walking before Him in truth, in righteousness, and in uprightness of heart (1 Kin. 3:6), seeking His glory and no unrighteousness be in you (John 7:18). For as the earth brings forth its bud, as the garden causes the things that are sown in it to spring forth, so the Lord God will cause righteousness and praise to spring forth before all the nations (Is. 61:11).

In the name of **Jesus Christ** (John 16:23), the Prince of Life (Acts 3:15), let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) stand therefore, having put on the breastplate of righteousness (Eph. 6:10-20). But of Him you are in *Christ Jesus* (John 15:4), who became for you wisdom from God and righteousness and sanctification and redemption (1 Cor. 1:30); so receive the abundance of grace and the gift of righteousness, which is through faith in *Christ*, the righteousness which is from God by faith (Phil. 3:9), and righteousness will reign in your life through the One, **Jesus Christ** (Rom. 5:17), fulfilling all righteousness (Matt. 3:15). Put on righteousness, and it will clothe you; your justice will be like a robe and a turban (Job 29:14). You shall shine like the brightness of the firmament and turn many to righteousness like the stars forever and ever (Dan. 12:3). For God Almighty has known you, in order that you may command your children and your household after you, that they keep the way of the Lord, to do righteousness and justice (Gen. 18:19). Let you and yours disperse abroad, give to the poor (Ps. 112:9), be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath (James 1:19), keep justice, do righteousness at all times (Ps. 106:30), fear the Lord (Ps. 112:3), and by your spirit within you seek God early and learn righteousness (Is. 26:9), so that your work is honorable and glorious, and your righteousness endures forever (Ps. 111:3); your horn will be exalted with honor (Ps. 112:9); wealth and riches will be in your house (Ps. 112:3); riches and honor will be with you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 sam. 6:21), enduring riches and righteousness (Prov. 8:18). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you will hold fast to your righteousness, you will not let it go; your heart shall not reproach you as long as you live (Job 27:6). Blessed be the Lord your God, who delights in you (1 Kin. 10:9), repaying you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) for your righteousness and your faithfulness (1 Sam. 26:23).

God, He will reward you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) according to your righteousness; according to the cleanness of your hands, He will recompense you (2 Sam. 22:21) and your people (Ps. 148:14). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) you will see His face in righteousness; you shall be satisfied when you awake in His likeness (Ps. 17:15), being accepted by Him (Acts 10:35) who is Faithful and True (Rev. 19:11), abiding in Him, and born of Him (1 John 2:29). The Lord of hosts (Ps. 24:8) shall be exalted in judgment, and God who is holy shall be hallowed in righteousness (Is. 5:16), for His salvation will be forever, and His righteousness will not be abolished (Is. 51:6).

In the name of Jesus Christ (John 16:23), He Himself is your peace (Eph. 2:14), let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) stand therefore, having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace (Eph. 6:15). In Christ (John 15:4) We pray (James 5:16) you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) will love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength, (Mark 12:30-31), with all your might, (Duet. 6:5), and with all your body (Rom. 12:12). Let you and your family (Acts 13:26) love your neighbor as yourself (Mark 12:30-31) and love one another; as *Christ* has loved you, walking in love, as *Christ* also has loved you and given himself for you, an offering and a sacrifice to God, as a sweet smelling aroma (Eph. 5:2). As you have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, rooted and built up in Him and established in faith, abounding in it with thanksgiving (Col. 2:67). Therefore, in *Christ* (John 15:4), we beseech you to have a walk worthy of the calling with which you were called, with all lowliness, gentleness, with longsuffering, bearing with one another in love, endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace (Eph. 4:1-3); forgiving men their trespasses (Matt. 6:14), walking in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit (Acts 9:31), walking in the newness of life (Rom. 6:4), sowing the fruits of righteousness in peace (2 Pet. 3:18), to do justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God (Mic. 6:8), who guards the paths of justice, and preserves the way of His saints (Prov. 2:8). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you and your family (Acts 13:26) will be ready and prepared, by faith working through love (Gal. 5:6), to love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you (Matt. 4:44-45), forgiving everyone who is indebted to you (Luke 111:4), those who sin against you (Luke 17:2), and if you have anything against another, forgiving him also (Matt. 6:14). Let you and your people (Ps. 148:14) pursue the things which make for peace and the things by which one may edify another (Rom. 14:19), being at peace among yourselves (1 Thess. 5:13), living peaceably with all men (Rom. 14:17), letting the peace of God rule in your hearts (Col. 3:15), pursuing peace with all men, pursuing holiness (Heb. 12:14), righteousness, faith, love, peace with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart (1 Tim. 2:22); and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through *Christ Jesus* (Phil. 4:7). Now may the Lord of peace Himself give you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) peace always in every way. The Lord be with you all (2 Thess. 3:16). Let us meditate on the glorious splendor of Your majesty, O Lord, and on Your wondrous works. Let us speak of the might of Your awesome acts, and we will declare Your greatness. We shall utter the memory of Your great goodness and shall sing of Your righteousness (Ps. 145:5-7). Praise the Lord God Almighty (Rev. 4:8)!

In the name of **Jesus Christ** (John 16:23), Him who called you by glory and virtue (2) Pet. 2:3), let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) stand therefore, having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace (Eph. 6:15). In Christ (John 15:4) We pray (James 5:16) that you and your family (Acts 13:26) will be prepared to preach the word! Be ready in season and out of season (2 Tim. 4:2), preaching peace through Jesus Christ (Acts 10:36), preaching peace to those who are afar off and to those who are near (Eph, 2:17). Let you convince, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and teaching (2 Tim. 4:2). "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the gospel of peace, who bring glad tiding of good things" (Rom. 10:15)! God who has reconciled you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) to Himself through Jesus Christ, has given you and your family (Acts 13:26) a ministry of reconciliation, and has committed to you the word of reconciliation. Therefore, be ambassadors for Christ (2 Cor. 5:20), imploring others on Christ's behalf to be reconciled to God (2 Cor. 5:18-20), through the blood of His cross (Col. 1:20). According to His promise (2 Pet. 3:13) God, a very present help in trouble (Ps. 46:1), grant (1 Sam. 1:17) that you and your people (Ps. 148:14) will become complete; be of good comfort, be of one mind, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you (2 Cor. 13:11). But in all things, may you and your family (Acts 13:26) commend yourselves as ministers of God: in much patience, in tribulations, in needs, in distresses, in stripes, in imprisonments, in tumults, in labors, in sleeplessness, in fasting: by purity, by knowledge, by longsuffering, by kindness, by the Holy Spirit, by sincere love, by the word of truth, by the power of God, by the armor of righteousness on the right hand and on the left, by honor and dishonor, by evil report and good report; as deceivers, and yet true; as unknown, and yet well-known; as dying, and behold you live; as chastened, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making

many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing all things (2 Cor. 6:4-10). And this we pray (James 5:16), that your love may abound still more and more in knowledge and all discernment, that you may approve the things that are excellent, that you may be sincere and without offense till the day of *Christ*, being filled with the fruits of righteousness which are by **Jesus Christ**, to the glory and praise of God (Phil. 1:9-11). You have been crucified with *Christ*; it is no longer you who live, but *Christ* lives in you; and the life which you now live in the flesh you live by faith in the Son of God, who loved you and gave Himself for you (Gal. 2:20). As you abound in everything in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in all diligence, in love, in grace (2 Cor. 8:7) and in mercy, may you be a vessel of mercy (Rom. 9:23). Also, may you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) pursue love, and desire spiritual gifts (1 Cor. 14:1), be zealous for spiritual gifts (1 Cor. 14:12), for God distributes to each one individually as He wills (1 Cor. 12:11). The manifestation of the Spirit is given to each one for the profit of all (1 Cor. 12:7). Therefore, in *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you will seek to excel for the edification of the church (1 Cor. 14:12), serving in the power of the Spirit (Rom. 7:6), a life-giving spirit (1 Cor. 15:45). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we make request on your behalf that God would grant (1 sam. 1:17) you to be sufficient as ministers of the new covenant, not of the letter but of the Spirit (2 Cor. 3:6), for the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life (2 Cor. 3:6). As an ambassador of **Jesus Christ** (2 Cor. 5:20), abiding in Him, we make request for you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 sam. 6:21) and we call on the God of Israel saying, "Oh, that He would bless you and your family (Acts 13:26) indeed, and enlarge your territory, that His hand would be with you and your people (Ps. 148:14), and that He would keep you from evil, that you may not cause pain!" (1 Chr. 4:10). Therefore, let you and your family (Acts 13:26) cast off the works of darkness, and put on the armor of light (Rom. 13:12). Let all that you do, be done with love (1 cor. 16:14). Let us praise the name of the Lord, for His name alone is exalted; His glory is above the earth and heaven. And He has exalted the horn of His people, the praise of all His saints! Praise the Lord (Ps. 148:13-14)!

In the name of <u>Jesus Christ</u> (John 16:23), the true Light (John 1:9), let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) stand therefore, having <u>shod your feet with the preparation of</u> <u>the gospel of peace</u> (Eph. 6:15). As the Lord has called each one, so let him walk (1 Cor. 7:17). The God of truth (Ps. 31:5, Deut. 32:4, Is. 65:16) will instruct you (Ps. 32:8), and teach you and your people (Ps. 148:14) the good way in which you should walk (1 Kin. 8:36), guiding you with His eye (Ps. 32:8), putting His Spirit in you causing you to walk in His statutes, and keep His judgments (Ezek. 36:27), so that you will walk in His way, to keep His commandments (1 Kin.

3:14), keeping to the paths of righteousness (Prov. 2:20), walking uprightly (Ps. 15:20), in truth (2 John 1:4), in the light of the Lord (ls. 2:5), in His countenance (Ps. 89:15), as children of light (Eph. 5:8), sons of the light and sons of the day (1 Thess. 5:5), and walking in the light as *Christ* is in the light (1 John 1:7), before the Lord in the land of the living (Ps. 116:9). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we implore you to walk worthy of God who calls you into His own kingdom and glory (1 Thess. 2:12); to follow **Jesus Christ**, having the light of life (John 8:12), abiding in faith, hope and love (1 Cor. 13:13), being rooted and grounded in love (Eph. 3:17), knowing the love of Christ which passes knowledge; that you may be filled with all the fullness of God (Eph. 3:19). Now hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out in your hearts by the Holy Spirit who was given to you (Rom. 5:5), and there is no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus (Rom. 8:1). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that through love you will serve one another, seeking to edify others (1 Cor. 8:1), suffering long, being patient, kind, thinking no evil, rejoicing in the truth, bearing all things, believing all things, hoping all things, enduring all things (1 Cor. 13:4-7), casting out all fear (1 John 4:18), covering a multitude of sins with your love (1 Pet. 4:8); not envying others, or parading yourself, or being puffed up, or behaving rudely, or seeking your own way, or allowing yourself to be provoked, or rejoicing in iniquity (1 Cor. 13:4-7), but most important, never failing (1 Cor. 13:8); not being overcome by evil, but overcoming evil with good and with love (Rom. 12:21), for love never fails (1 Cor. 13:4-8). Peace and mercy be upon you (Gal. 6:16). You are the salt of the earth (Matt. 5:13), and the light of the world (Matt. 5:14). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you will be meek (Math. 5:5), poor in spirit (Math. 5:3), merciful (Math. 5:7), pure in heart (Math. 5:8), peacemakers (Math. 5:9), manifesting the fruits of the Spirit, which are love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Against such there is no law (Gal. 5:22-23). God is not the author of confusion but of peace (1 Cor. 14:33), and the God of peace will crush Satan under your feet shortly (Rom. 16:20). God, who called you to peace (1 Cor. 7:15), shall make you complete in every good work to do His will, working in you what is well pleasing in His sight through **Jesus Christ**, to whom be glory forever and ever (Heb. 13:21)! For you and your family (Acts 13:26) are His workmanship, created in *Christ Jesus* for good works, which God prepared beforehand that you should walk in them (Eph. 2:10). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you and your family (Acts 13:26) will not love in word or in tongue, but in deed and in truth (1 John 3:18). According to the good pleasure of His will (Eph. 1:5) may God bestow on you and your people (Ps. 148:14) an obedient heart (Eph. 6:5) so that you will do good, seek peace and pursue it (1 Pet. 3:11).

Therefore, as you have opportunity, let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) do good to all (Gal. 6:10), be rich in good works, ready to give, willing to share (1 Tim. 6:18), give in good measure (Luke 6:38), with liberality (Rom. 12:8) giving what you have (1 John 1:7), cheerfully (2 Cor. 9:7), not procrastinating, but giving today what you have to give (Acts 3:6) with all generosity (Prov. 11:25), giving not out of compulsion (Phil. 1:14), or grudgingly or of necessity (2 Cor. 9:7), but voluntarily (Philem. 1:14), doing all things in love (1 Cor. 16:14) and in the name of **Jesus Christ** of Nazareth (Acts 3:6). May you and your people (Ps. 148:14) walk in the way of goodness (Prov. 2:20), feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, taking in the stranger, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and going to those who are in prison (Matt. 25:35-36). Glory, honor, and peace to everyone who works what is good (Rom. 2:10)! You are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light (1 Pet. 2:9). This is the message that we have heard from Him and declare to you, that God is light and in Him is no darkness at all (1 John 1:5). Righteousness and justice are the foundation of His throne; mercy and truth go before His face (Ps. 89:4)! A fire goes before Him and burns up His enemies' round about (Ps. 94:3)!

In the name of **Jesus Christ** (John 16:23), the author and finisher of your faith (Heb. 12:2), let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) stand therefore, having taken up the shield of faith with which you will be able to guench all the fiery darts of the wicked one (Eph. 6:16). Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit (Rom. 15:13). We also pray (James 5:16) always for you that our God would count you worthy, and fulfill all the good pleasure of His goodness and the work of faith with power, that the name of our *Lord Jesus Christ* may be glorified in you, and you in Him, according to the grace of our God and the **Lord** Jesus Christ (2 Thess. 1:11-12). And now, brethren, in Christ (John 15:4) we commend you and your family (Acts 13:26) to God and to the word of His grace, which is able to build you up and give you an inheritance among all those who are sanctified (Acts 20:32). For it is God who commanded light to shine out of darkness who has shone in your hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of **Jesus Christ** (2 Cor. 4:6). This hope you have as an anchor of the soul, both sure and steadfast, and which enters the Presence behind the veil, where the forerunner has entered for you, even **Jesus**, having become High Priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek (Heb. 6:19-20). For this reason we bow our knees to the Father of our *Lord Jesus Christ*, from whom the whole

family in heaven and earth is named, that He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory (Rom. 9:23), to be strengthened with might through His Spirit in the inner man, that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith (Eph. 3:16-17); that you are rooted and built up in Him and established in the faith (Col. 2:7), justified by faith (Rom. 5:1) and that you continue in the faith, grounded and steadfast, and are not moved away from the hope of the gospel (Col. 1:23), so that you might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith (Gal. 3:7). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that God will give you and your family (Acts 13:26) each one a measure of faith (Rom. 12:3). May Jesus Christ help your unbelief (Mark 9:24). According to the eternal purpose (Eph. 3:1) may God, your help and your shield (Ps. 33:20), increase your faith (Luke 17:5), increase learning and understanding (Prov. 1:15) and your ability to hear (Jer. 7:2), see (Jer. 2:31), receive (Jer. 8:9), and know (Jer. 32:8) the word of the Lord (Is. 28:13, Is. 39:5, Is. 66:5), precept upon precept, precept upon precept, line upon line, line upon line, here a little. there a little (ls. 28:13), until you have faith as of a mustard seed (Matt. 17:20). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) take after Samson, Jephthah, David, Samuel and the prophets: who through faith subdued kingdoms, worked righteousness, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched the violence of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong, became valiant in battle, turned to flight the armies of the aliens. Through faith women received their dead raised to life again. Others were tortured, had trial of mocking, scourging, chains, imprisonment, were stoned, were sawn in two, were tempted, were slain with the sword, were destitute, afflicted, tormented of whom the world was not worthy (Heb. 11:32-38). But still, they were grounded and steadfast in faith (Acts 2:42, Col. 1:23). In Christ (John 15:4) We pray (James 5:16) you and your people (Ps. 148:14) will also receive apostleship for obedience to the faith (Rom 1:5), building yourselves up on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Spirit, keeping yourselves in the love of God, looking for the mercy of our <u>Lord Jesus Christ</u> unto eternal life (Jude 1:20-21). And in all circumstances being surrounded by a shield of faith (Eph. 6:16), dwelling in the supernatural peace of Christ (John 14:27), for the chastisement for your peace was upon Him, and by His stripes vou are healed (Is. 53:5). The Lord has made known His salvation: His righteousness He has openly shown in the sight of the nations (Ps. 98:2). You, O Lord, have established equity; You have executed justice and righteousness. (Ps. 99:4)

In the name of <u>Jesus Christ</u> (John 16:23), the faithful witness, the firstborn from the dead, He who loved you and washed you from your sins in His own blood (Rev. 1:5), let you

and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) stand therefore, having taken up the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one (Eph. 6:16). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you will hear what the Spirit says (Rev. 3:22) and you will overcome, as **Jesus** also overcame (Rev. 3:21). Be of good cheer, for **Jesus** overcame this world (John 16:33), and so can you, for you can do all things through *Christ* who strengthens you (Phil. 4:13). God grant, according to the riches of His grace (Eph. 1:7), that the speech and the preaching that you hear is not with persuasive words of human wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power that your faith should not be in the wisdom of men but in the power of God (1 Cor. 2:5). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that your delight is in the fear of the Lord, and you shall not judge by the sight of your eyes, nor decide by the hearing of your ears (Is. 11;3), but instead you will live by faith (Rom 1:17), walk by faith (2 Cor. 5:7), hear the voice of *Christ* and follow Him (John 10:27), being an example to the believers in word, in conduct, in love, in spirit, in faith and in purity (1 Tim. 4:12). In *Christ* (John 15:4) We pray (James 5:16) that you and your people (Ps. 148:14) will not waver at the promise of God through unbelief (Rom. 4:20), for there has not failed one word of all His good promise (1 Kin. 8:56), but let you and your family (Acts 13:26) be strengthened in faith, giving glory to God, and being fully convinced that what He has promised He is also able to perform (Rom. 4:21), standing fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel (Phil. 1:27). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we implore you to trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths (Prov. 3:5-6). Whatever is not from faith is sin (Rom. 14:23), therefore, in *Christ* (John 15:4) we beseech our God and implore our Father in heaven not to let sin have dominion over you (Ps. 19:13) and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21). The Lord will perfect that which concerns you; His mercy endures forever; He will not forsake the works of His hands (Ps. 138:8), you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21). God, faithful and true (Ps. 89:1, Jer. 10:10), will be with you continually; He will hold you by your right hand. He will guide you with His counsel, and afterward receive you to glory (Ps. 73:23-24). He will make you to know the ways of life, He will make you full of joy in His presence (Acts 2:28). He will show you and your people (Ps. 148:14) the path of life; in His presence is fullness of joy; at His right hand are pleasures forevermore (Ps. 16:11). According to your faith let it be to you (Matt. 9:29). The Lord preserves the faithful (Ps. 31:23). His righteousness is like the great mountains, His judgments are a great deep; He preserves man and beast. How precious is His

loving-kindness! Therefore, the children of men put their trust under the shadow of His wings. (Ps. 36:6-7).

In the name of **Jesus** (John 16:23), the **Christ**, the Son of the living God (John 6:69), in His name let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 sam, 6:21) stand therefore, having taken up the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one (Eph. 6:16). May the God of your hope open your eyes, that you may see wondrous things from His word (Ps. 119:18), and give you an ear, that you can hear what the Spirit says (Rev. 2:7), for faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God (Rom. 10:17). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that God will open to you a door for the word, to speak the mystery of *Christ* (col. 4:3). Do not be afraid, only believe (Mark 5:36)! For this reason, we thank God without ceasing, that you and your family (Acts 13:26) receive the word of God, welcome it not as the word of men, but as it is in truth, the word of God, which also works in you effectively (1 Thess. 2:13). As ambassadors of *Christ* (Emp. 6:20), we implore (2 Cor. 5:20) you to receive Jesus Christ, live and believe in Him (John 11:26), and in His name (John 1:12); hear (John 12:47) and receive His words (John 17:8), and believe the scripture (John 2:22), know the truth (John 8:32), believing in God who sent Him (John 5:24, John 17:8). May you and your people (Ps. 148:14) see the Son and believe (John 6:40): He is the *Christ*, the Son of God (John 20:30-31), He is the resurrection and the Life (John 11:25), and He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life (John 6:35). May you come to Him, receiving and drinking of the water that He shall give that you will never thirst. But the water that He shall give you will become in you a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life (John 4:14). Tasting the good word of God and the powers of the age to come (Heb. 6:5), eating the bread of life, for Jesus is the bread of life (Matt. 26:26). It is written: "I am the living bread which came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread that I shall give is My flesh, which I shall give for the life of the world" (John 6:51). Truly, in *Christ* (John 15:4), you shall never hunger, and you shall never thirst (John 6:35). And you shall have life in His name (John 20:30-31), receive remission of sins (Acts 10:43), and not be condemned (John 3:18) or come into judgment (John 5:24), nor abide in darkness (John 12:46); but become sons of light (John 12:36), children of God (John 1:12) passing from death into life (John 5:24), having everlasting life (John 3:18). You shall not perish (John 3:15), for you shall never die (John 11:26), though you may die, you shall live (John 11:25), and see the glory of God (John 11:40); you shall enter the rest of God (Heb. 4:3), and **Jesus** will raise you up at the last day (John 6:40). In **Christ** (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you and your whole household (John 4:53) will continue in the faith (Acts 14:22),

having a spirit of faith (2 Cor. 4:13), and that nothing will come and take away the word out of your hearts (Luke 8:12). But that you will trust in *Christ* (John 15:4), after hearing the word of trust, the gospel of your salvation, in whom having believed, you were sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise (Eph. 1:13), knowing God's faithfulness (Deut. 7:9), through Jesus believing in God, who raised Him from the dead and gave Him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God (Eph. 2:4-5). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you and your family (Acts 13:26) will love the Lord Jesus Christ and keep His word; and His Father will love you, and **Jesus**, the Son, and God the Father, will come to you and make their home with you (John 14:23). Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed (John 20:29), for there will be a fulfillment of those things which were told them from the Lord (Luke 1:45); those who believe in *Christ* (John 15:4) through the Word will be one, as God is in Christ, and Christ in God, you also will be one in Them (John 17:21). Yes, may you receive the glory that only **Jesus Christ** can give you, that you may be one just as **Jesus** and God are one (John 17:22). The Father Himself loves you, because you have loved **Jesus**, and have believed that He came from God (John 16:27). Without faith it is impossible to please God. He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him (Heb. 11:6). Because you believe in **Jesus**, the works that He did, you will do also; and greater works than these you will do (John 14:12). And these signs will follow you who believe: in *Jesus*' name you will cast out demons; you will speak with new tongues; you will take up serpents; and if you drink anything deadly, it will by no means hurt you; you will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover (Mark 16:17-18). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that God will help you to believe, without doubting in your heart (Mark 11:23), and whatever things you ask when you pray, you will receive them, and you will have them (Mark 11:24), and whatever things you say will come to pass, you will have whatever you say (Mark 11:23), for all things are possible for him who believes (Mark 9:23). As you have believed, so let it be done for you (Matt. 8:13). Let your delight be in the fear of the Lord, and you shall not judge by the sight of your eyes, nor decide by the hearing of your ears; but with righteousness you shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth. God, through you, shall strike the earth with the rod of His mouth, and with the breath of His Lips He shall slay the wicked! Righteousness shall be the belt of your loins, and faithfulness the belt of your waist (ls. 11:3-5)! The heavens declare His righteousness, and all the peoples see His glory (Ps. 97:6)! According to Your name, O God, so is Your praise to the ends of the earth; Your right hand is full of righteousness (Ps. 48:10)!

In the name of **Jesus Christ** (John 16:23), nor is there salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which you must be saved (Rom. 10:9), in His name let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) stand therefore, having taken up the **helmet of salvation** (Eph. 6:17). Stand still and see the salvation of the Lord (Ex. 14:13). for today salvation has come to your house (Luke 19:9), for the son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost (Luke 19:10). Today, if you will hear His voice, do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion (Heb. 3:7-8), but repent and believe in the gospel (Mark 1:15), and let every one of you be baptized with water unto repentance (Matt. 3:11) in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:38). For everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved (Acts 2:21). God from the beginning chose you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 sam. 6:21) for salvation through sanctification by the Spirit and belief in the truth (2 Thess. 2:13). Therefore, let you and your family (Acts 13:26) confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, and you will be saved (Rom. 10:9), for with the mouth confession is made to salvation (Rom. 10:10). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you and your family (Acts 13:26) will take up the water of life freely (Rev. 22:17), and draw water from the wells of salvation with joy (ls. 12:3), your soul being joyful in the Lord; for He has clothed you with the garments of salvation (Is. 61:10) and covered you with the robe of righteousness (Is. 61:10). In *Christ* (John 15:4) We pray (James 5:16) that you and your people (Ps. 148:14) will confess **Jesus Christ** before man, and He, the Son of Man, will confess you before the angels of God (Luke 12:8), and send His ministering spirits forth to minister to you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) who will inherit salvation (Heb. 1:14). In Christ (John 15:4) we implore (2 Cor. 5:20) God the Lord, the strength of your salvation (Ps. 140:7), to remember you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) with the favor He has toward His people; and visit you and your people (Ps. 148:14) with His salvation, that you may see the benefit of His chosen ones, that you may rejoice in the gladness of His nation, that you may glory with His inheritance (Ps. 106:4-5), that you may obtain the salvation which is in *Christ Jesus* with eternal glory (2 Tim. 2:10). For now, in *Christ Jesus* you who once were far off have been made near by the blood of *Christ* (Eph. 2:13). The Lord grant (2 Tim. 1:16) that you and your family (Acts 13:26) will hear the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, trust in **Jesus** *Christ*, believe and be sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise, who is the guarantee of your inheritance (Eph. 1:13-14). According to His mercy, may God save you and your family (Acts 13:26), through the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit, whom He

pours out on you abundantly through <u>Jesus Christ</u> your Savior, that you and your family (Acts 13:26), having been justified by His grace should become heirs according to the hope of eternal life (Titus 3:4-7). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that the Lord, the tower of your salvation, will not rest until your salvation is as a lamp that burns (ls. 62:1), and He will not blot out your name from the Book of Life (Rev. 3:5). He will not cast you away from His presence; and will not take His Holy Spirit from you, but restore to you the joy of His salvation, and uphold you with His Generous Spirit (Ps. 51:11-12). Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb (Rev. 7:10). Listen to the Lord, you who know righteousness, you people in whose heart is His law: do not fear the reproach of men, nor be afraid of their reviling (Is. 51:7). Behold, our Mighty God has made your face strong against their faces, and your forehead strong against their foreheads. Like adamant stone, harder than flint, He has made your forehead; do not be afraid of them, nor be dismayed at their looks, though they are a rebellious house (Ezek. 3:8-9). For the moth will eat them up like a garment, and the worm will eat them like wool; but His righteousness will be forever, and His salvation from generation to generation (Is. 51:8). In *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that in Him you and your family (Acts 13:26) will trust and not be afraid for YAH, the Lord, is your strength and your song; He also is your salvation (ls. 12:2). He has covered your head in the day of battle (ls. 61:10), so in *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16), you will put on the helmet of salvation. He has given you the shield of His salvation, His right hand holds you up, His gentleness makes you great (Ps. 8:35)! Trust in His mercy, let your heart rejoice in His salvation (Ps. 13:5), for you shall call upon Him, and He will answer, He will be with you in trouble, He will deliver you and honor you, with long life he will satisfy you, and show you His salvation (Ps. 91:15-16). Your righteousness, O God, is very high, You who have done great things; O God, who is like You (Ps. 71:19)?

In the name of <u>Jesus Christ</u> (John 16:23), the last Adam, a quickening spirit (1 Cor.15:45), let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) stand therefore, having taken up the <u>sword of</u> <u>the Spirit</u>. It is written "Unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God" (John 3:34). Therefore, in <u>Christ</u> (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16), that you and all of your family (Acts 13:26) will elect according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, in sanctification of the Spirit for obedience and sprinkling of the blood of <u>Jesus Christ</u> (1 Pet. 1:2). Our heavenly Father will give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him (Luke 11:13). God will pour out His Spirit on all flesh (Acts 2:17), so in <u>Christ</u> (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that God, who knows your heart, will acknowledge you and your people (Ps. 148:14), by giving you the

Holy Spirit (Acts 15:8), that you and your family (Acts 13:26) will receive the Holy Spirit (John 20:22) be full of faith (Acts 6:5), and filled with joy (Acts 13:52); filled to overflowing with the Holy Spirit (Acts 9:17), that out of your heart will flow rivers of living water (John 7:38). For you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you (Acts 1:8); that you might know the things that have been freely given to you by God (1 Cor. 2:12). May it please God to establish you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) in *Christ*, anoint you and your people (Ps. 148:14), seal you and your family (Acts 13:26), give you the Spirit in your hearts as a deposit and a guarantee, help you to live in the Spirit (Gal. 5:25), walk in the Spirit (Gal. 5:16), be led by the Spirit (Gal. 5:18), keep your minds on the things of the Spirit (Rom. 8:5), comparing spiritual things with spiritual (1 Cor. 2:13), sowing in the Spirit, being joined to the Lord and one spirit with Him; and through the Spirit you will reap everlasting life (Gal. 6:8), be transformed into the image of the Lord from glory to glory (2 Cor. 3:18), and purge your conscience from dead works to serve the living God (Heb. 9:14), that you may offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through **Jesus Christ** (1 Pet. 2:5). Then you will no longer be strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God (Eph. 2:19), having been born again, not of corruptible seed but incorruptible, through the word of God which lives and abides forever (1 Pet. 1;23). Your righteousness O Lord, is an everlasting righteousness, and Your law is truth (Ps. 119:142); the righteousness of Your testimonies is everlasting (Ps. 119:144)!

In the name of <u>Jesus Christ</u> (John 16:23), who through the eternal Spirit, offered Himself without spot to God (Heb. 9:14), let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) stand therefore, having taken up the <u>sword of the Spirit</u>, for God has sent forth the Spirit of His Son, He who has the seven Spirits of God and the seven stars (Rev. 3:1), into your hearts (Gal. 4:6). Blessed be the God and Father of our <u>Lord Jesus Christ</u>, who has blessed you with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in <u>Christ</u>, just as He chose you in Him before the foundation of the world, that you should be holy and without blame before Him in love, having predestined you to adoption as sons by <u>Jesus Christ</u> to Himself, according to the good pleasure of His will, to the praise of the glory of His grace, by which He has made you accepted in the Beloved (Eph. 1:3-6). Therefore, having these promises, beloved, let you cleanse yourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God (2 Cor. 7;1). For the law of the Spirit of life in <u>Christ Jesus</u> has made you free form the law of sin and death (Rom. 8:2). In <u>Christ</u> (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that by the Spirit you will put to death the deeds of the body (Rom. 8:13).

For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God (Rom. 8:14). You are the temple of God and the Spirit of God dwells in you. If anyone defiles the temple of God, God will destroy him. For the temple of God is holy, which temple you are (1 Cor. 3:16-17). You are not your own. For you were bought at a price; therefore, glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's (1 Cor. 6:19-20). Eagerly waiting for the adoption, the redemption of your body (Rom. 8:23); for He who raised *Christ* from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit who dwells in you (Rom. 8:11). Mercy and truth have met together; righteousness and peace have kissed each other. Truth shall spring out of the earth, and righteousness shall look down from heaven! Yes, the Lord will give what is good; and your land will yield its increase! Righteousness will go before Him and shall make His footsteps your pathway (Ps. 85:10-13)!

It is written: "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth." (John 1:14). Therefore, in the name Jesus Christ (John 16:23), let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) stand (Eph. 6:14), having taken up the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God (Eph. 6:17). It is written, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God (Matt. 4:4). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that our great God, mighty and awesome, who shows no partiality (Deut. 10:17) will establish His word to you and your family (Acts 13:26), put a hunger (Luke 6:21) and a thirst (Matt. 5:6) in your inward (Ps. 139:13,51:6) parts, an overpowering love for the word of God (Ps. 119:97), that you love it exceedingly (Ps. 119:167), so that your soul breaks out with longing for His judgments at all times (Ps. 119:20), as you take them as your heritage forever (Ps. 119:111). Rejoicing in your heart (Ps. 119:111), that you hear the word of the Lord (Jer. 7:2) and understand it (Matt. 13:23), keeping it in the midst of your heart (Prov. 4:21); and, in *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16), you and your family (Acts 13:26) will incline your heart to perform it (Ps. 119:112), knowing with certainty that His word is very pure (Ps. 119:140). May you and your people (Ps. 148:14) heed the word wisely and trust in the Lord (Prov. 16:20), and make it your delight (Ps. 119:92), for His word is a lamp to your feet and a light to your path (Ps. 119:105). Let the Everlasting God, the Lord, the Creator of the ends of the earth (ls. 40:28), give you and your people (Ps. 148:14) understanding (Ps. 119:34), teach you good judgment and knowledge (Ps. 119:91), make you understand the way of His precepts (Ps. 119:27), direct your ways to keep His statutes (Ps. 110:5), make you walk in the path of His commandments (Ps. 119:35), and let you not wander from His commandments (Ps. 119:10), so that you meditate on His precepts and contemplate His way (Ps. 119:15), inclining your heart

and clinging to His testimonies (Ps. 119:36, Ps. 119:31). For His word has given you life (Ps. 119:50) and is health to your flesh (Prov. 4:22). The statutes of the Lord are right, rejoicing the heart; the commandment of the Lord is pure, enlightening the eyes; the fear of the Lord is clean. enduring forever; the judgments of the Lord are true and righteous altogether. More to be desired are they than gold, Yea, than much fine gold; sweeter also than honey and the honeycomb (Ps. 19:8-10). As for God, His way is perfect; the word of the Lord is proven; he is a shield to all who trust in Him (2 Sam. 22:31). The word of God stands forever (Is. 40:8), the entirety of His word is truth (Ps. 119:160, John 3:33), pure (Prov. 30:5, Ps. 119:140), and eternal, for heaven and earth will pass away, but God's word will by no means pass away (Matt. 24:35). It is living, and powerful (Heb. 4:12); it searches the hearts of man (Rev. 2:23), like a two edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart (Heb. 4:12), and nothing is hidden from His sight (Heb. 4:13), the Mighty One (Ps. 45:3), the Ancient of Days (Dan. 7:9), the Holy one of Israel (Is. 5:24). Let the word of Christ dwell in you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) richly in all wisdom (Col. 3:16), and in Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls (James 1:21). But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves (James 1:22). For the gospel did not come to you in word only, but also in power, and in the Holy Spirit and in much assurance (1 Thess. 1:5); therefore, hold fast the word of life (Phil. 2:16). For the word of the Lord is right, and all His work is done in truth. He loves righteousness and justice; the earth is full of the goodness of the Lord (Ps. 33:5).

In the name of <u>Jesus Christ</u> (John 16:23), appointed High Priest by the word of the oath of God (Heb. 7:28), let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) stand therefore, having taken up the sword of the Spirit, which is the <u>Word of God</u> (Eph. 6:17). May the Lord our God be with you (1 Kin. 8:57) and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21), that He may incline your hearts to Himself, to walk in all His ways, and to keep His commandments and His statues and His judgments (1 Kin. 8:58), that He may maintain the cause of His servants and the cause of your people (Ps. 148:14), as each day may require (1 Kin. 8:59). In <u>Christ</u> (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that God, the confidence of all the ends of the earth (Ps. 65:5), will direct your steps in His word, and let no iniquity have dominion over you (Ps. 119:133) and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) (Ps. 119:133). Let the God of peace (Rom. 15:33, Rom. 16:20) put the word very near you, in your mouth and in your heart, that you may do it; for whoever keeps His word, truly the love of God is perfected in him (1 John 2:5). In **Christ** (John 15:4) we pray (James

5:16) that the Lord God will give you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) the tongue of the learned, awaken your ear to hear as the learned (Is. 50:4), and the Spirit of the Lord will speak to you and your family (Acts 13:26) and put His word on your tongue (2 Sam. 23:2). Let you and your people (Ps. 148:14) hold fast the pattern of sound words which you hear, in faith and love which are in *Christ Jesus*. That good thing which was committed to you, may you keep by the Holy Spirit who dwells in you (2 Tim. 1:13-14). May it please the Lord to make you sufficient as ministers of the new covenant, not of the letter but of the Spirit; for the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life (2 Cor. 3:6). According to His own purpose and grace which was given to you in *Christ Jesus* before time began (2 Tim 1:9), in *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that God will raise you and your family (Acts 13:26) up for Himself as faithful priests who shall do according to what is in His heart and in His mind (1 Sam. 2:35), that He might show His power in you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21), and that His name might be declared in all the earth (Rom. 9:17). He will build you a sure house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21), and you shall walk before Him anointed forever (1 Sam. 2:35). May the Lord make you bold with strength in your souls (Ps. 138:3), and grant to you and yours that with all boldness you may speak His word (Acts 4:29), speaking boldly in the Lord, who bears witness to the word of His grace, granting signs and wonders to be done by your hands (Acts 14:3). Let you speak by the Spirit of the Father who speaks in you (Matt. 10:20); for it is not you who speak but the Holy Spirit (Mark 13:11); and the Holy Spirit will teach you what you ought to say (Luke 12:12). He will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all things (John 14:26), and the word you speak will be spirit and life (John 6:63). No one will be able to resist the wisdom and the Spirit by which you speak (Acts 6:10); and you will indeed bear fruit and produce a hundredfold (Matt. 13:23). Now may the Lord Jesus Christ Himself, and our God and Father (Phil. 4:20), who has loved you and given you everlasting consolation and good hope by grace, comfort your hearts and establish you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) in every good word and work (2 Thess. 1:16-17). Now in **Christ** (John 15:4) we commend you to God and to the word of His grace, which is able to build you up and give you an inheritance among all those who are sanctified (Acts 20:32). May it please God to sanctify you by His word (John 17:17). The Lord gives voice before His army, for His camp is very great; for strong is the One who executes His word (Joel 2:11). For the day of the Lord is great and very terrible; who can endure it (Joel 2:11)? By the word of the Lord the heavens were made, and all the host of them by the breath of His mouth! He gathers the waters of the

sea together as a heap; He lays up the deep in storehouse! Let the heavens declare His righteousness (Ps. 50:6)! Sing to Him a new song; play skillfully with a shout of joy (Ps. 33:3)!

In the name of **Jesus Christ** (John 16:23), He who lives to make intercession for you (Heb. 7:25), let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) stand therefore (Eph. 6:14), having taken up the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God (Eph. 6:17), praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints (Eph. 6:18). Let you be a minister of **Jesus Christ**, having the ministry of righteousness (2 Cor. 3:9), preaching righteousness (2 Pet. 2:5), ministering the gospel of God, sanctified by the Holy Spirit (Rom. 15:16), not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord; rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing steadfastly in prayer (Rom. 12:11-12). In Christ (John 15:4) We pray (James 5:16) that you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) will purify your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit in sincere love of the brethren, loving one another fervently with a pure heart (1 Pet: 22), making supplication for all the saints (Acts 1:14), giving yourselves continually to prayer and to the ministry of the word (Acts 6:3-4). Therefore, in *Christ* (John 15:4) we exhort first of all that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks be made for all men, all who are in authority, that you may lead a quiet and peaceful life in all godliness and reverence (1 Tim. 2:1-2). Grace and peace be multiplied to you and your family (Acts 13:26) in the knowledge of God and **Jesus** our Lord (2 Pet. 1:2), that you may be partakers of the divine nature (2 Pet. 1:4), giving yourselves continually to prayer and to the ministry of the word (Acts 6:4), being diligent to be found by Him in peace, without spot and blameless (2 Pet. 3:14). In Christ (John 15:4) we remind you to be subject to rulers and authorities, to obey, to be ready for every good work, to speak evil of no one, to be peaceable, gentle, showing all humility to all men (Titus 3:2). Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely; and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be preserved blameless at the coming of our *Lord Jesus* Christ (1 Thess. 5:23). Now in Christ (John 15:4) we beg you, through the Lord Jesus Christ, and through the love of the Spirit, that you strive together in your prayers to God (Rom. 15:30), that you take heed to yourselves and to all the saints (Acts 20:28), that you watch and pray, lest you enter into temptation (Matt. 26:41). For God has not given you a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind (2 Tim. 1:7). The Spirit also helps in your weaknesses (Rom. 8:26), for the Spirit searches all things, yes, the deep things of God (1 Cor. 2:10). Now He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit is, because He makes intercession for the saints according to the will of God (Rom. 8:27). In *Christ* (John 15:4)

we pray (James 5:16) that your heart will be circumcised in the Spirit (Rom. 2:29), that you and your people (Ps. 148:14) will possess in the hidden person of your heart, the incorruptible ornament of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is very precious to the sight of God (1 Pet. 3:4). Let the heavens declare His righteousness, for God Himself is Judge (Ps. 50:6). Your throne, O God, is forever and ever; a scepter of righteousness is the scepter of Your kingdom (Ps. 45:6)!

He, **Jesus**, shall stand and feed His flock in the strength of the Lord, in the majesty of the name of the Lord His God; and they shall abide, for now He shall be great to the ends of the earth (Mic. 5:4). Abiding in *Christ* (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16), in the name of Jesus Christ (John 16:23), that you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) stand, having taken up the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God (Eph. 6:17), praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints (Eph. 6:18). May you and your people (Ps. 148:14) go up into the gaps to build a wall for your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) to stand in battle on the day of the Lord (Ezek. 13:5). According to His glorious power (Col 1:11) may God grant (1 Sam. 1:17) that you and your family (Acts 13:26) are faithful and make a wall, and stand in the gap before our Mighty God (Ezek. 22:30) on behalf of all the saints (Eph. 6:18). May you, beloved, building yourselves up on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Spirit (Jude 1:20), pray evening and morning and at noon and cry aloud, and He shall hear your voice (Ps. 55:17). For the Lord God watches over you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21), His lamp shines on your head, by His light you walk through darkness, the friendly counsel of God is over your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21), the Almighty is with you (Job 29:2-6). Unless the Lord builds the house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21), they labor in vain who build it; unless the Lord guards the city, the watchman stays awake in vain (Ps. 127:1). In *Christ* (John 15:4) We pray (James 5:16) that you and your people (Ps. 148:14) wait for the Lord, your souls wait, and in His word you hope (Ps. 130:5). Let you and your people (Ps. 148:14) hear instruction and be wise. Blessed is the man who listens to the wisdom of God, watching daily at its gates, waiting at the posts of its doors. For whoever finds wisdom finds life and obtains favor from the Lord (Prov. 3:34-35). May you meditate on Him in the night watches. Because He has been your help (Ps. 63:6), therefore in the shadow of His wings you and your family (Acts 13:26) will rejoice (Ps. 63:7). May your souls follow close behind Him; His right hand upholds you (Ps. 63:8) and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21). Let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) stand continually on the watchtower in the daytime; and sit at the post every night (Is. 21:8). Let you watch

therefore and pray always that you may be counted worthy to escape all these things that will come to pass, and to stand before the Son of Man (Luke 21:36). Watch, stand fast in faith, be brave, be strong (1 Cor. 16:13). Let you watch out for yourselves carefully (Mark 13:9), watch over the way of your household, and do not eat the bread of idleness (Prov. 31:27), but watch and pray, lest you enter into temptation (Matt. 26:41). According to the Spirit of holiness (Rom 1:4) may the God of truth (Deut. 32:4) set a guard over your mouth; keep watch over the doors of your lips and keep your heart from any evil things (Ps. 141:3). Arise, cry out in the night, at the beginning of the watches; pour out your heart like water before the face of the Lord. Lift your hands toward Him for the life of your young children (Lam 2:19)! Behold, *Jesus* is coming as a thief. Blessed is he who watches, and keeps his garments, lest he walk naked and they see his shame (Rev. 16:15). So in Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) you and your people (Ps. 148:14) will be watchful, and strengthen the things which remain, not defile your garments; and you shall walk with Jesus in white, for you are worthy. According to His abundant mercy (1 Pet 1:3) may God grant that you and all your people (Ps. 148:14) will overcome and shall be clothed in white garments, and **Jesus** will not blot your name from the book of Life; but confess your name before His Father and before His angels (Rev. 3:2-6). For he who overcomes, and keeps His works until the end, to him He will give power over the nation. (Rev. 2:26). Let you not sleep, as others do, but let you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) watch and be sober. (1 Thess. 5:6). For the wicked watches the righteous, and seeks to slay him (Ps, 37:32). May you and your family (Acts 13:26) watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour in which the Son of Man is coming (Matt. 25:13). But the end of all things is at hand; therefore, be serious and watchful in your prayers (1 Pet. 4:7). Also keeping watch over the house of the Lord (2 Kin. 11:7), and the flock by night (Luke 2:8). For all the people shall keep the watch of the Lord (2 Chr. 23:6), watchman opposite watchman (1 Chr. 26:16), one at his watch station and another in front of his own house (Neh. 7:3), diligently watching (1 Kin. 20:33) for the mercy of the Lord (Ps. 103:17). His mercy is from everlasting to everlasting (Ps. 103:17) and is on those who fear Him from generation to generation (Luke 1:50). You, son of man, God has made you a watchman for the house of our God (Ezek. 3:17). The eyes of the Lord are in every place, keeping watch on the evil and the good. For the terrible one is brought to nothing, the scornful one is consumed, and all who watch for iniquity are cut off (Is. 29:20). In Christ (John 15:4) we pray (James 5:16) that you and your people (Ps. 148:14) will be watchful in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry (Heb. 13:17), open your mouth

boldly to make known the mystery of the gospel (Eph. 6:19), standing against those who speak perverse things, to draw away the disciples after themselves (Acts 20:30). May you and your people (Ps. 148:14) be watchmen, who shall never hold their peace day or night. You who make mention of the Lord, do not keep silent, and give Him no rest till He establishes and till He makes you and your house (Gen 14:14, 2 Sam. 6:21) a praise in the earth (Is. 62:6-7). Watch therefore, for you do not know when the master of the house is coming in the evening, at midnight, at the crowing of the rooster, or in the morning lest, coming suddenly, he finds you sleeping. Blessed are those servants whom the master, when he comes, will find watching (Mark 13:35-37). For to everyone who has, more will be given, and he will have abundance; but from him who does not have, even what he has will be taken away (Matt. 25:29). It is written: "And what I say to you, I say to all: Watch!" (Mark 13:35-37). Behold, the Lord God shall come with a strong hand, and His arm shall rule for Him; behold, His reward is with Him, and His work before Him (ls. 40:10-11). He will feed His flock like a shepherd; He will gather the lambs with His arm, and carry them in His bosom, and gently lead those who are with young (ls. 40:10-11). You, O Lord, love righteousness and justice; the earth is full of all Your goodness (Ps. 33:5)!

Having fruit to holiness (Rom. 6:22), abiding in the Son and the Father (John 2:24), and one with Them (John 17:22), in truth (John 17:19) and in faith (Acts 26:18) we sanctify (1 John 17:17,19, Heb. 13:12) you and your entire bloodline (Gen. 17:7, Prov. 11:21), your house (Gen. 14:14, 2 sam. 6:21) and all of your people (Ps. 148:14); by the blood of the Lamb of God (Rev. 7:14, 12:11); we sanctify your time (Is. 9:7, Is. 59:21) so that you will always be in the will of God (Col. 1:9) through the communion of the Holy Spirit (2 Cor. 13:14); and we sanctify your space (Jos. 7:13, 2 Chr. 29:5) by the overpowering presence of God (Judges 18:6, Ps. 17:1-2), who has made His home in you (John 14:23). Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely; and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be preserved blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ (1 Thess. 5:23). In the name of **Jesus Christ**, who upholds all things by the word of His power (Heb. 1:3), we proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord, and the day of vengeance of our God (Is. 61:2)! In Him who is true (1 John 5:20), as one (John 17:21) we execute the written judgment-- This honor has all His saints. God said it. We believe it. It is settled forever. In Jesus' name (John 16:23) so be it (Mark 11:23)! You, O Lord, shall endure forever, and the remembrance of your name to all generations (Ps. 102:12)! For Yours, O Lord, is the glory and the power and the kingdom forever (Matt. 6:13)! Amen!
