The Marlow Volunteer Fire Department is excited to present our annual report to the community. Our hope is that it provides residents in our service area an overview of the department's highlights from the previous year, as well as some insight into the future.

2022

The year 2022 was the busiest year our department has ever had, receiving a record high of 804 calls for assistance. Our volunteers were challenged to put in more time to meet the rising call volume, amongst other demands. As we learn from last year and plan for the future, we are excited about what's ahead.

Our dedicated volunteers completed 2,312 training hours in 2022. Even though our members receive no monetary compensation for their work, they train to and achieve the same accreditations and state certifications as that of career firefighters.

Response Totals

In 2022 we received a record number of calls, coming in at a total of 804 calls for assistance, which was a major increase compared to the 688 calls received in 2021.

Third Station

For some time, our vision has been to build a third station in the area of Sulphur Springs Rd or Black Oak Rd. A community member has graciously donated a piece of property to use in the 800 block of Sulphur Springs Rd. Now we need to raise \$60,000 in order to build a two-bay substation.
