**Permit Conditions**

1. Fires can be conducted between: April-September 8am to 4 pm / October & March 9am to 3 pm / November-February 10am to 2pm.
2. The Hellsgate Fire Department shall be notified prior to the setting of the fire by obtaining a local permit for a specified time frame. HFD may prohibit open burning when atmospheric conditions or local circumstances make such fire hazardous. **HFD has all rights to pull a permit, cancel a permit or forbid burning.**
3. Permittee must attend fire at all times until it is completely extinguished.
4. Permittee must have a copy of this permit on-site during open burning.
5. Permittee must start fire using items that do not cause the production of black smoke.
6. Permittee can only conduct open burning during atmospheric conditions that:
  - a. Prevent dispersion of smoke into populated areas
  - b. Prevent visibility impairments on roads or at airports that result in a safety hazard
  - c. Do not create a public nuisance or adversely affect public safety
  - d. Do not cause an adverse impact to visibility in a Class I area
  - e. Do not cause uncontrollable spreading of the fire
7. Burning cannot be conducted when an air stagnation advisory has been issued by the National Weather Service for the area.
8. Burning cannot be conducted when any stage air pollution episode has been declared.
9. Any public official may order that the burn be extinguished or may prohibit burning during periods of inadequate smoke dispersion, excessive visibility impairment, or extreme fire danger.
10. This permit shall not be construed to relieve the permittee from liability from resulting damages or the obligation to comply with other applicable laws, regulations or ordinances.

ARS 13-1706. It is unlawful for any person, without lawful authority, to intentionally, knowingly, recklessly or with criminal negligence to set or cause to be set on fire any wildland other than the person's own or permit a fire that was set or caused to be set by the person to pass from the person's own grounds to the grounds of another person. A person who violates this section is guilty of a class 1 misdemeanor, class 2 misdemeanor, class 3 felony or class 6 felony.

(FD- Additional Notes or Clauses) No burning will be permitted on the following holidays: Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.

I certify that I have knowledge of the facts herein set forth, that the same are true, accurate and complete to the best of my knowledge and belief. I further state that I will assume responsibility for conducting open burning in accordance with the Arizona Administrative Code, Title 18, Chapter 2 and any open burning permit issued thereof. I acknowledge that all information not identified by me as confidential shall be treated by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality as a public record.
