Field Crops, Garden and Honey

General Rules

- Registration will be from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m., Sunday, July 13, 2025.
- All exhibitors are limited to one entry in each class, but may exhibit in all classes.
- Decisions of the judges are final.
- Danish System will NOT be used in judging this division. The prize money for each class follows that class.

1st, 2nd and 3rd (Blue, Red and White Ribbons) placing will be awarded ONLY if it is merited. If the entry(s) is (are) deemed not worthy of 1st, 2nd or 3rd place by the judge, the judge will award the entry the prize it deserves.

Exhibitors must be present to claim their prize money and entries. Awards and ribbons will not be mailed.

Discharge is on Sunday, July 20, 2025 from 12:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. First pick up your entries, then pick up your cash awards.

Entries left unclaimed become the property of the Kenton County Fair Board.

Exhibitors Responsibilities

- Select the class prior to registration. Improperly classified entries will not be judged.
- Supply the appropriate containers for the flower, plants and arrangements, and honey and sweeteners categories.
- Provide name and address prior to entering crops.
- Ensure that all entries have been grown or produced in Kenton County by the exhibitor.
- Entrance into a category stipulates you have read and will abide by these rules.
- Questions are to be directed to the appropriate fair official prior to entrance into a class.

Vegetable, Fruit, Herb and Field Crops

- Will be judged based on USDA Standards, except in the unique or unusual category.
- All Entries must be true to form.
- All corn (field and sweet) and hay entries are to be fastened or bound together.

Cut Flowers and Roses

- Judging is at the judges discretion.
- Specimens must be washed
- All flower stems, except lilies, should include foliage
- Foliage will be considered in the judging.
- Single specimen flowers (large and small) shall be displayed an unadorned jar or beverage bottle of suitable size that must be uncolored clear glass or non-flexible plastic with a stable base to avoid tipping (no water bottles).
- Exhibitors are to provide containers with labels removed (to make display more attractive.)

Container Gardens

- Judging is at the judges' discretion.
- Arrangements should be displayed in appropriate or suitable container that does not distract from
 - the overall appearance.
- Container will be supplied by exhibitor.
- Arrangements should contain at least 51% of the items specified
- Accessories should be less than 49% of the total items in the container.

Showstopper People's Choice Award

Show us your skills by creating an arrangement of only fresh cut flowers and foliage from your yard!

You can use annuals, perennials, and woody plants for this showstopper in the horticulture exhibit of the 2025 Kenton County Fair. Entries will remain on display on the shelves in Floral Hall and will be limited by size so they will fit in the space available. The vase can be up to 10" wide and 10" tall.

This arrangement can be up to 24" tall, 18" wide, and 12" deep including vase. These entries will be judged by fair attendees Monday-Wednesday from 4p.m. to 8p.m. at the Ask a Master Gardner booth located in the Floral Hall. The winner will be chosen on Thursday at 12p.m. Winners will receive 2 evergreen swags or wreaths or 2 seats at our Evergreen Wreath Class in December if held.
