St Charles – Ron Hain’s two year campaign for Kane County Sheriff has been focused on creating clear solutions to the myriad public safety concerns Kane County faces. At the top of the list: the reduction of the county’s rampant recidivism. Along with the infusion of Hain’s skills to jobs program into the jail, he also plans to offer collaboration and space sharing with Kane County Animal Control.

With the Kane County Coroner’s Office seeking the Animal Control building for their needed expansion space, Hain will offer open space at the Sheriff’s Office to Animal Control. This concept will not only save taxpayers millions of dollars for a capital project to build a new facility, but perhaps more importantly, it will truly create a correctional environment for those sentenced to the county jail. By following similar models used across the country, Hain would allow non-violent sentenced inmates to care for the stray or abandoned dogs and cats in Animal Control. This opportunity will reduce inmate anxiety, infuse personal responsibility, and support Hain’s vision of a task-based environment for county jail inmates.

“We cannot keep locking up people, letting them sit, and releasing them without support or direction, only to watch them re-offend,” said Hain. Hain announced this conceptual program at a recent meeting with the Fox River Valley Initiative, a community group focused primarily on mental health support in Kane County.

“Collaboration and support across all county divisions is required for true efficiency and accountability to the people we serve,” Hain said.
