

Arthur Darr Obituary - North Charleston, SC dignitymemorial.com

Arthur E. Darr, long time member of the Low Country Coin Club of Charleston/North Charleston, South Carolina passed away at his home June 20, 2025.

Arthur had been a member of the Low Country Club for years. Not only was he the oldest club member he was the longest active member of the club, having been a member since the 1990's. He became a lifetime member of the Low Country Coin Club in December 2010. None of the current members of the club remember when Arthur first joined, he has just always been there.

Arthur was a long-time member of the South Carolina Numismatic Association. In 2017 he was made an Honorary Life Member, the 8th recipient of that award in the 50 years of SCNA.

As numismatist, he had a particular interest in error and variety coins, finding beauty and fascination in the small anomalies that made each coin unique. He seldom missed a

club meeting or a club show until his health finally made him retire from that a few years ago.

If one can have a passion for more than one thing, Arthur loved children – the Young Numismatists. Again, nobody remembers when he started the club YN's, he had just always done the YN table at the club's twice a year shows. At many of the shows there was no one else at the table for the entire show – just Arthur and the kids.

Not only did he man the YN table at the local club shows, but he often traveled to other clubs' shows in South Carolina to introduce young people to coin collecting. Spending his own money on his travel expenses and purchasing coins, coin folders and other supplies to give to the youth at every show.

It was the US Navy that brought Authur Darr to Charleston. He retired from the U.S. Navy as a Chief Petty Officer (E-7), serving aboard the USS Enterprise as an Aviation Maintenance Administrationman. After his military service, he continued his second career, where he retired from Robert Bosch LLC in North Charleston, SC.

He was married to Doris A. Wert Darr for 74 years. They had 3 sons and a daughter. Arthur was 95 years old.

Born in Dillsburg, Pennsylvania, Arthur was the son of the late William and Almeda (Heisey) Darr.

He is survived by his beloved wife of 74 years, Doris A. Wert Darr. Their marriage, which began on June 3, 1951, was a beautiful testament to lifelong love and commitment. Arthur also leaves behind his son, Alan Darr (Karen), his daughter, Mischelle Coggins (Ronald); two sisters, Beverly Garlin and Alberta Mann; seven grandchildren; and one eagerly awaited greatgrandchild. He will also be fondly remembered by many nieces and nephews.

Arthur was preceded in death by his parents; his brothers, Kenneth, Leroy, and Duane Darr; his sister, Patricia Friedline; and his sons, Gary Darr and Ronald Darr.
